Air Pollution and its control has emerged as an issue of major concern not only in crores now. Therefore, for the general public but

also to the regulatory agencies. Automobile exhaust emissions contribute significant pollutants to the atmosphere. The pollutants are Carbon Monoxide, Carbon Dioxide. Oxides of Sulphur, Nitrogen, unburnt Hydrocarbons and particulate matter in the form of smoke. It has been presumed that about 2/3rd of total Air Pollution in J&K is from vehicles and rest from industries and burning of Biomass and Municipal Solid Waste.
