Sunil demands action against perpetrators of assault on Balwan Singh

UDHAMPUR: Sunil Verma, District President of JKNC Udhampur, has called for immediate and stern action against those responsible for the brutal assault on Balwan Singh, a resident of Village Babbey, Tehsil Majalta, District Udhampur. In a statement issued here today, the senior NC leader said that Balwan Singh, son of Sh. Chunu, suffered severe injuries, including fractures, following an attack by Bishan Singh and Gandharab Singh, both serving as Patwaris in the Revenue Department at Tehsil Majalta, along with Taro Devi and Ashok Kumar. The incident took place on the night of May 31, 2024,

when the accused, armed with iron rods, wooden sticks, and stones, trespassed into Balwan Singh's property and assaulted him. Despite his cries for help and the intervention of his nieces, the attackers continued their assault, leaving him unconscious, he added. "The following day, Balwan Singh was admitted to Primary Health Centre Majalta and later referred to Government Medical College Udhampur and then to GMC Jammu due to the severity of his injuries. Despite being registered as MLC No. 3157 and having a clear medical record of his injuries, no FIR has been registered by the Majalta Police," he said.
