2 drug peddlers booked under PIT NDPS Act

KULGAM: Acting tough against drug peddlers and to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police in Kulgam booked a drug peddler under PIT NDPS Act after obtaining orders from the competent authority.



The drug Peddler namely Imran Ahmad Ganie son of Mohammad Ramzan Ganie resident of Nassu Badragund, Qazigund has been detained under PIT NDPS Act after obtaining the orders issued by the competent authority and has been lodged in District Jail Kot Balwal, Jammu.

Acting tough against drug peddlers and to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Jammu and Kashmir Police under Operation SANJEEVANI in Bishnah Jammu booked the most wanted and notorious drug peddler under PIT NDPS Act and lodged him in District Jail Udhampur.

The most wanted and notorious drug smuggler namely Liyakat Ali, son of Hussan Mir, resident of Sikanderpur Kothey Tehsil Bishnah District Jammu has been booked under PIT NDPS Act after obtaining formal detention orders from the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu.

The booked drug smuggler has been detained and subsequently lodged in District Jail at Udhampur.

Most importantly the above mentioned drug peddler was operating from the Chaita hotspot of Bishna police station, and by lodging him in Udhampur jail the main supply chain of drug peddling has been disrupted.

It is pertinent to mention that below mentioned cases were registered against the above mentioned drug peddler and was involved in promoting drug abuse trade by supplying drugs to local youth of the area. Despite his involvement in multiple FIRs, he did not mend his activities and was again involved in promoting drug abuse trade by supplying drugs to local youth.

The above said notorious drug peddler/criminal has remained successful every time in securing the bails from the Hon'ble Court and in order to refrain the subject from indulging in criminal activities, a dossier (PIT NDPS Act) was recommended against him, upon which, the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu had issued a PIT NDPS Act warrant against him.

The arrest was made by a team of P/S Bishnah headed by SHO P/S Bishnah under the close supervision of SDPO R.S.Pura, SP Headquarters Jammu & overall supervision of the SSP Jammu.

2 drug peddlers arrested; Contraband substance recovered

Theft case worked out; accused arrested; stolen items worth 1 lakh recovered

SAMBA: Police has worked out a theft case which was registered at Police Station Ghagwal, arrested thief and recovered stolen items worth rupees 01 lakh approximately from his possession.

A written complaint was lodged at Police Post Rajpura (PS Ghagwal) by one Mukesh Kumar S/o KrishanLal R/o Rajpura district Samba, regarding theft of electric water pumps from his agriculture field at village Malani by some unknown person. Acting on the complaint, a case FIR No. 94/2024 U/S 379 IPC got registered at Police Station Ghagwal and investigation was started. Different teams were constituted led by SHO PS Ghagwal and IC PP Rajpura. During the course of investigation, police zeroed several suspects. Meanwhile, a person namely Des Raj S/o Titru Ram R/o Dalsar tehsil Rammagar district Udhampur A/P Sherpur, Tehsil Hiranagar district Kathua was apprehended in the instant case after hectic efforts and was put to sustained questioning. On his disclosure, police has recovered 08 electric water pumps costing INR 1 lakh (approximately) which the accused had stolen from different places in Ghagwal area.

Demolition drive clears illegal structures along Delhi-Katra Expressway in Reasi

Two inter-state peddlers arrested, 5 Kgs of Ganja recovered

JAMMU: Jammu police tightening its noose against Drug Peddlers under operation Sanjeevani Police party of PP Pounichak on 25-06-2024 established a special Naka in Seora area for checking of vehicles. During checking two pedestrian who were coming from Nandini towards seora when they saw Naka party, they immediately diverted their directions and tried to escape but Police Party apprehended them on spot. During questioning they disclosed their names as Karan Kumar Kurrey, son of Gend Ram, resident of Jhangir Champa Chhattisgarh A/P Nandan and Gulab Rai Patel, son of Lakhani Lal Patel, resident of Spiti Chattisgarh. On their suspicious activities of concealing the carry bags their search was conducted. During search of the carry bag of Karan Kumar Kurrey S/O Gend Ram R/O Jhangir Champa Chhattisgarh A/P Nand 3.5 kg of Ganja like substance was recovered while during the search of carry bag of Gulab Rai Patel S/O Lakhani Lal Patel R/O Spiti Chattisgarh 1.5 Kg of Ganja like substance was recovered.

In this regard a case FIR No.178/2024 U/s 8/20/21/NDPS Act got registered at P/S Domana and both the accused are arrested.
