 $\mathbf{DELHI}:$ Prime Minister Narendra Modi was on Tuesday poised to form the government for a third consecutive term. The Bharatiya Janata Party won 240 seats and fall short of the 272 majority mark and need the support of allies in party-led National


Democratic Alliance(NDA) for government formation, from the 303 and 282 seats it had won in 2019 and 2014 respectively to have a majority on its own. In Lok Sabha polls 2024, the NDA has secured 293 seats while INDI Alliance got 233 and 17 seats went to others

is stated to be stable, the offi-


Over 400 Agniveer recruits join army in Ladakh

Singh besides Jugal Kishore Sharma have won the Udhampur and Jammu Lok Sabha seats for the third time, defeating Congress candidate Choudhary Lal Singh and Raman Bhalla respectively

After maintaining a narrow lead in the early rounds of counting, Jitendra Singh emerged victorious, equalling the feat of veteran Congress leader Karan Singh, who held the seat in 1971, 1977, and 1980.

Singh, who previously won the seat in 2014 and 2019, secured 571076 votes, defeating Choudhary Lal

Setback for Ex-CMs Omar, Mehbooba

SRINAGAR: The defeat in Lok Sabha polls has come as a setback for the political careers of former chief ministers Omar Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti in view of their vows not to contest the upcoming assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir till it

remains a Union Territory. While Abdullah was defeated by former MLA and terror-funding accused Sheikh Abdul Rashid by a margin of nearly two lakh votes in Baramulla Lok Sabha seat, Mufti was trounced by Gujjar leader and National Conference (NC) candidate Mian Altaf Ahmad by nearly three lakh votes in Anatnag-

Rajouri seat. With the assembly elections

September 30 this year, the defeats have raised a question mark on the participation of Abdullah and Mufti in these elections.

Both the leaders have, at several occasions, ruled out participating in assembly elections till Jammu and Kashmir remained a Union

"I have made it abundantly clear that in the current situation that J-K finds itself in, am not contesting the assembly elections," the 54year-old Abdullah told PTI in an interview in April this year, adding that he had been saying this since 2020 and

his position had not changed. The PDP president has been a little more hardline in her approach on this issue.

NEW DELHI: Preparing to take office for a record third consecutive term, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday pledged to work with all states, regardless of the party in power, to build a developed India.

In his first speech after the results of the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, Modi laid out his vision for the third term saying it would be a tenure of big decisions and key emphasis would be on uprooting corruption.

The fight against corruption is becoming tougher by the day. Corruption is being shamelessly glorified for political interest. In our third



term, NDA will focus a lot on rooting out corruption of all kinds," Modi said.

Modi's speech did not refer to its reduced numbers in Parliament but focussed on the "clean sweep" victories in assembly elections as well as Lok Sabha wins in Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Delhi, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

Modi also said that the Congress has been wiped out in several states and pointed

out that the combined number of seats won by the opposition alliance was less than that of the BJP alone.

"After 1962, for the first time a government has won the mandate for a third consecutive term." Modi said.
