including NDRF & MRT representatives. At the onset of the meeting the participating officers briefed the chair about the security arrangements to be adopted for the smooth and peaceful conduct of Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra-2024. The officers present in the meeting shared their insights, past experiences and recommendations, highlighting the importance of robust communication channels, co-ordination among various forces, and real-time monitoring systems. Deliberations focused on fortifying the existing security infrastructure, improving surveillance tactics, and bolstering personnel deployment along the pilgrimage route.

The meeting addressed cut-off timing vis-a-vis concerns regarding local and tourist movement during the Yatra to ensure minimal disruption & inconvenience. It was emphasized that Yatri or tourist vehicles would be taken to safe places/ yatra camps enroute if plying beyond designated cut-off timings at various points along the route. Concerned stakeholders were accordingly briefed on the protocol that prohibits Yatra and tourist vehicle movement beyond the specified timings. During the meeting, ADGP L&O and IGP Kashmir provided insights into the necessary Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) that must be adhered to throughout the

Yatra. They also emphasized the importance of preparedness and proactive measures in mitigating risks and ensuring the safety and security of the yatri/devotees. They underscored the significance of collaboration among stakeholders and the implementation of robust contingency plans to effectively address any unforeseen challenges. Furthermore, the ADGP L&O directed the officers to enhance/reinforce security measures and mitigate potential risks by deploying Anti-Sabotage teams along the Amarnath Yatra route to identify and neutralize any potential threat threats. ADGP L&O Shri Vijay Kumar also advised the officers to enhance surveillance and threat detection capabilities through the utilization of advanced drone technology and real-time aerial monitoring over both pilgrimage routes-Pahalgam axis as well as Baital axis. As the pilgrimage approaches, ADGP assured the public that every possible measure would be taken to provide a secure and hassle-free experience for the devotees. He also urged the general public to cooperate with the security forces and follow the prescribed guidelines for their own convenience & safety. Overall, the meeting facilitated comprehensive discussions on key logistical and security aspects pivotal for the successful and secure conduct of the Yatra.

# 50 sacks of polythene bags recovered

**SAMBA:** Police has recovered 50 Sacks of banned Polythene bags in the jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal, district Samba which were being illegally transported in a passenger bus.

A Police Party of Police Station Ghagwal headed by SHO PS Ghagwal, while performing routine vehicle checking duty at NHW naka Tapyal, intercepted a passenger bus bearing Regd No. UP81CT-3537 driven by driver Kulwinder Singh S/o Munsha Singh R/o FatehgarhChurian district Gurdaspur (Punjab) which was on way from Jalandhar to Katra.

During checking of the said vehicle, 50 sacks of polythene bags, each weighing about 24Kgs (1200kgs approx.in total), were found laden inside the vehicle without any permission and were concealed tactfully beneath sacks of other goods.

In this regard, the matter was taken up with District Pollution Control Board, Samba for further legal proceedings at their end.

# Notorious inter-district gang of drug peddlers busted; 5 held, contraband seized

**GANDERBAL:** Acting tough against the drugs peddlers, Police in Ganderbal arrested notorious gang of inter-district drug peddlers and recovered huge quantity of contraband substance from their possession.

On the directions of SSP Ganderbal Shri Sandeep Gupta-IPS, a police party led by SHO Police Station Lar under the supervision of Gh Hassan-JKPS Hqrs Ganderbal, established a checkpoint at Yenhamra Lar. During checking, a drug peddler identified as Sheikh Murif son of Late Ghulam Mohammad Sheikh resident of Lar who was coming from Watalbagh towards Lar was arrested alongwith contraband substance.

In this regard, a case FIR No. 23/2024, under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Lar & investigation was started.

Thereafter on his disclosure and evidences surfaced in investigation, police raided at multiple places and recovered 559 bottles of codeine and 14900 tablets of banned psychotropic substance. During investigation, 04 more accused persons belonging to different districts of the valley were arrested. They have been identified as Sabir Nabi Shagoo son of Gh Nabi Shagoo resident of Bemina Srinagar; Dowood Ahmad Rather son of Ghulam Mohd Rather resident of Narbal Budgam, Rameez Rafiq Dar son of Mohd Rafiq Dar resident of Ajas Bandipora and Parvaiz Ahmad Hanga son of Gh Mohd Hanga resident of Karfuli Mohalla, Srinagar. Investigation into the matter is in progress and more recoveries/arrests are expected.

It is pertinent to mention here that, Ganderbal Police has registered 12 NDPS cases and arrested 19 drug peddlers till date in the current year. Contraband substance/psychotropic substance including 22 kgs & 754 grams of bang powder/ bang patri/ crashed cannabis with seed tops, 11grams of heroin like substance, 675 bottles of banned codeine like substance, 14980 psychotropic tablets/capsules, 84 grams of charas like substance and cash ₹ 79500 was seized.

# Cyber Cell Kupwara solves online financial fraud

**KUPWARA:** In a swift response, J&K Police Cyber Cell Kupwara has successfully solved an online financial fraud case by recovering Rs 96,606.

The complainant reported about receiving a fraudulent call for credit card activation, which led to the unauthorized debit of Rs 96,606 upon following the instructions provided during the fraud call.

Immediately upon receiving the complaint, Cyber Cell Kupwara gathered evidence and information from the victim. Utilizing advanced cybercrime investigation techniques, the team managed to solve the case within 24 hours.

# Crackdown on illegal mining, 6 vehicles seized

In a surprise operation which was carried out at different locations in Rural zone of District Jammu. Police Post Manwal detained one dumper bearing registration No. JK21F-8064 loaded with sand without Form A.

Police Station Akhnoor detained two vehicles, one Tractor trolley without Registration No. and one Dumper bearing registration No. JK02CS-9810, both loaded with sand without any legal permission.

Police Station Nagrota detained two Vehicles, one Tipper bearing registration No. JK02AN/7465 and one Dumper bearing registration No. JK20B/9631, both found involved in

illegal mining loaded with sand, without Form-A. Police Post Sandwan detained one tractor trolley without any Reg.No.involvement in illegal mining.

After detaining of these vehicles District Mining Officer was informed for necessary legal actions.

While giving the details SP RuralJammu, conveyed that Jammu Police is committed for protecting the public property and to eradicate the menace illegal mining in the area.

# Three inter-district drug peddlers arrested

During checking three persons were found boarded in a car. On enquiry they disclosed their name as Tajamal Farooq, son of Farooq Ahmed, resident of Kralpora Melhtab Srinagar; Sarwar Iqbal Rather, son of Mohd Iqbal Rather, resident of Dharam Bugh Kralpora Srinagar and Sameer Hussain Dar, son of Lt.Ghulam Mohd Dar, resident of Chattar Gam Budgam.

On checking Heroine like contraband substances were recovered from all the possession of all three Persons. The drug peddlers alongwith contraband substance and Car was taken into custody. The arrest, seizure and recovery made by a police party headed by SHO Inspector Satvir Singh. In this regard Case FIR No.52/2024 U/S 8/21/22/29 NDPS has been registered at Police Station Gangyal and investigation taken up.



# Six gamblers arrested, Rs 17670 stake money seized
