Urdu requirement in Naib Tehsildar Exam sparks outrage: ABVP holds protest

JAMMU: Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) Jammu Kashmir on Tuesday organized a statewide protest at all district headquarters in Jammu and Kashmir against the recent notification making Urdu a compulsory qualifying subject for the post of Naib Tehsildar. The compulsory Urdu requirement is deemed discriminatory, outdated, and contradictory to the promise of equal opportunity. ABVP Jammu Kashmir believes that merit, not language, should determine who serves the people. ABVP Jammu Kashmir demanded the removal of Urdu as a mandatory qualifying subject for the post of Naib Tehsildar and urged the administration to ensure that the recruitment process is fair and inclusive. The protest was held at Jammu Mahanagar, Udhampur, Rajouri, Jammu University, with ABVP Karyakartas, aspirants, students, and concerned citizens participating. Sannak Shrivats, State Secretary ABVP Jammu Kashmir said, "If the government fails to revoke the Urdu qualifying exam requirement, ABVP Jammu Kashmir will intensify its protests across the UT."

Notorious drug peddler booked under PITNDPS Act

SAMBHA: Taking stringent action against notorious drug peddlers/smugglers involved in illicit narcotics trade, Samba Police has booked a notorious drug peddler under Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PITNDPS) Act for his continues involvement in spreading drug menace in the area and lodged him in the Central Jail Kot Bhalwal, Jammu. The notorious drug peddler detained under PITNDPS Act has been identified as Sham Din alias Shama, son of Mureed Ali resident of Gujjar Basti Sarore Adda tehsil Bari Brahmana district Samba. In view of repeated indulgence of notorious drug peddler Sham Din @Shama in illicit drug trafficking in the area, District Police Office Samba prepared and submitted dossier & other connected documents to the office of Divisional Commissioner Jammu. Accordingly, notorious drug peddler Sham Din @Shama has been lodged in Central Jail Kot Bhalwal Jammu after obtaining formal detention order from Divisional Commissioner Jammu. Different cases have been registered against the said drug peddler at Police Station Bari Brahmana for his role in promoting the drug trade by supplying narcotics to people especially youth of the area.



Massive anti-encroachment drive in Hiranagar; 50 kanal land retrieved, 22 structures demolished

KATHUA: The District Administration Kathua on Tuesday carried out a massive anti encroachment drive at Chapaki Kalan in Hiranagar Sub Division. Tasked with safeguarding government land, a multi agency team reclaimed over 50 kanal of illegally occupied land and demolished 22 unauthorized structures on the spot, marking a massive operation ever undertaken by the district administration. The drive was executed under the direct supervision of senior officers of Civil and Police administration, including SDM Hiranagar Phulail Singh, Tehsildar Anoop Kumar, SDPO Chadwal Dheeraj Singh (Katoch), Dy. Their coordinated efforts ensured the operation concluded smoothly, without incident, sending a clear signal of zero tolerance against encroachment. Acting decisively and efficiently, we aim to deter illegal occupation and set a clear precedence against future enforcements."



2 inter-state drug peddlers arrested with 350 grams Afem

JAMMU: Continuing its crackdown on drug trafficking, today Jammu Police apprehended two drug peddlers and seized 350 grams of Opium (Afeem) like substance from their possession. A random Police Naka was established at Kabir Colony, Talab Tillo, Jammu. Two individuals coming from foot from Talab Tillo towards Kabir Colony were stopped for checking. Upon noticing the police party, they exhibited suspicious behavior, prompting the police to suspect them. When they attempted to escape, Alert police party apprehended them and searched their bags which they were carrying. During search 226.70 Grams of Opium (Afeem) was recovered from the possession of Sudhir Singh S/O Ompal Singh R/o Vill. Bhatpura Chandu Teh. Powyan Distt. Shahjahanpur, Uttar Pradesh and 123.50 Grams of opium (Afeem) was recovered from the possession of Surya Partap Singh S/O Satinder Singh R/o Vill. Bhatpura Chandu, Teh. Powyan, Distt. Shahjahanpur, Uttar Pradesh. In this connection, FIR no 75/2025 U/S 8/18/29 NDPS Act was instantly registered at PS Nowabad and further investigation is underway to trace the source and network behind the illegal drug trade. More arrests and recoveries cannot be ruled out. Police Party led by Inspector Deepak Pathania SHO PS Nowabad and assisted by PSI Paramjeet I/C PP Talab Tillo made the arrests/recoveries under the supervision of Ms. Farha Nishat DySP Hqrs, Sh. Vivek Shekhar SP City North Jammu & Sh. Joginder Singh SSP Jammu.



Jammu Police attach moveable property worth lakhs of notorious bovine smuggler

JAMMU: In a major crackdown under the provisions of the newly enacted criminal laws, Jammu Police have attached a vehicle identified as proceeds of crime in connection with a bovine smuggling case. The vehicle, a Mahindra Bolero pick-up bearing registration number JK14H/8740, is owned by Gafoor Ali, son of Mohd Musa, resident of Dhamma, Majalta, Udhampur. At the time of the incident, it was being driven by his brother Liaqat Ali, also a resident of Dhamma, Majalta. The case is registered under FIR No.9/2025 at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli, under Section 223 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and Section 11 of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (PCA) Act. During the course of the investigation, the vehicle was found to have been repeatedly used in the commission of bovine smuggling offenses. Both the owner and the driver are habitual offenders and have been involved in several such cases. It was also established that the vehicle was purchased using proceeds of crime. Following due legal procedures and after obtaining the necessary orders from the Hon'ble Court, the vehicle was attached under Section 107 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS). The entire exercise was carried out by the SHO Jhajjar Kotli under the close supervision of SDPO Nagrota, SP Rural Jammu, and SSP Jammu. It is pertinent to mention that this marks the second property attached under Section 107 BNSS in the Rural Zone. The Jammu Police have reiterated their firm commitment to cracking down on bovine smuggling and other criminal activities, utilizing the strengthened legal provisions under the new criminal codes to ensure swift and effective justice.



Proclamation notice issued for absconders

JAMMU: In compliance with an order from the Court of Principal Sessions Judge Jammu, a proclamation has been issued for the appearance of three absconding accused in the case FIR No. 23/2009 under Sections 3/EAO Act of Police Station Dessa. The absconding accused are Mohd Shafi, S/o Wafia Nike; Shams Din**, S/o Lt. Jamal Din adn Farooq Ahmed**, S/o Abdul Gani. All three individuals are residents of Manjmi Bhagwah, Doda. A general warrant of arrest was previously issued for the accused, but it has been returned after attempts to locate them were unsuccessful. The Court has concluded that the accused are deliberately concealing themselves to avoid legal action. As per the proclamation, the accused are required to appear before the Hon'ble Court of Principal Sessions Judge Jammu within 30 days from the date of this publication. Failure to appear will result in further legal consequences. This notice aims to ensure that justice is served and urges the accused to surrender before the court within the prescribed period.

Police arrests man impersonating senior police officer on WhatsApp

SRINAGAR: The Counter Intelligence wing of the Jammu and Kashmir Police on Tuesday said it has arrested a person for impersonating and masquerading as a senior police official allegedly to threaten people. The Counter Intelligence Kashmir (CIK) received credible input suggesting that an individual Barkat Ali Parry alias BK, a resident of Gundhassi Bhat in Sheltang, Srinagar was indulging in impersonation, using the photograph of CIK SSP on his WhatsApp as his display picture and threatening people, a CIK official said. He said following the digital footprints, the CIK apprehended the suspect at Jahangir Chowk in Srinagar on Monday. On casual inspection of his mobile device, the suspect was found using the display picture of CIK SSP on his WhatsApp account. During preliminary verification, it was found that the suspect had downloaded the

photograph of CIK SSP from the internet and had put it as his WhatsApp display picture with the intent to falsely portray himself as a police officer, the official said. The verification further revealed that the suspect had been involved in online gambling on various platforms for the past year and had made some advance payments on one of the platforms, he said. When quizzed, it came to the fore that the suspect had misused the profile picture of CIK SSP and threatened the organisers of an online gaming platform seeking refund of his advance payment, the official added. Further verification and analysis of his digital device is in progress to ascertain whether the suspect has any involvement in other anti-social and anti-national activities, the official said.

Wanted criminal receives gunshot injury attempting to snatch cop's pistol

JAMMU: A wanted criminal received a gunshot injury after he tried to snatch a weapon from a policeman while leading a police party to his hideout to effect recovery of illegal weapons including a pistol here, official said on Tuesday. Bagh Hussain, a resident of Balol Nallah near Kikri Morh, was recently arrested from Haryana in connection with a case related to attack on a police party in Bari Brahmana area in April that left several policemen, including a station house officer, injured, the official said. "During interrogation, the accused disclosed having concealed the weapon of offence - a loaded pistol and an axe - in Banachak village of Bishnah (Jammu). A police team rushed to the location to recover the weapons (on Monday)," he said. "However, in a shocking turn of events, not mending his ways, the accused attempted to snatch the service weapon of Constable Arun Sharma, leading to a violent scuffle and causing injuries to him. In line of duty, self-defence and retaliatory action, the police party was forced to open fire on the accused, who sustained injuries during the incident," the official added. He said Hussain was immediately shifted to Sub-District Hospital Bishnah for medical treatment and is under police custody. "He is a notorious criminal with a long history of violent and heinous crimes, with 27 FIRs registered against him across multiple police stations in Jammu, Samba and even Himachal Pradesh, out of which eight FIRs were registered for assault on police parties including the recent incident of attack on SHO Bari Brahmana," the official said. He said his criminal record includes charges under murder; attempt to murder; dacoity, illegal arms possession, kidnapping, rioting, criminal conspiracy and obstruction of government duties. "Terminating his arrest as a "major breakthrough", Senior Superintendent of Police, Jammu Joginder Singh said further investigation is underway to unearth the full extent of his criminal network in the area. He appreciated the courage, professionalism, sense of duty and the swift response of the police team to recover the arms and ammunition and shift the accused to hospital.

Eight caught in illegal mining, flee after obstructing government work, FIR registered

RS PURA: Eight individuals have been booked by the R.S. Pura Police for illegal soil mining following a complaint from the office of the Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM), R.S. Pura. The incident occurred during an inspection conducted by SDM R.S. Pura, Anuradha Thakur, along with the Naib Tehsildar of Badyal Brahmana and the Patwari of Chak Agra in the village of Chak Agra, Tehsil R.S. Pura. During the inspection, the team discovered illegal soil extraction from agricultural lands, with the accused actively involved in the unlawful activity. Upon questioning, the accused individuals obstructed the government officials in their line of duty and fled the scene at high speed, posing a risk of accidents and causing a disruption to public order. Authorities found two JCB machines and three tractors (lacking number plates) being used in the illegal mining operations. Acting on the matter swiftly, R.S. Pura Police registered FIR No. 111/2025 under sections 132, 281, and 125 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). An investigation into the matter is currently underway. The illegal mining issue has been a longstanding concern in the region, with locals previously voicing dissatisfaction over the lack of effective action by authorities. The recent crackdown, however, has been met with praise from the community, who expressed gratitude to SDM Anuradha Thakur for taking decisive steps to address the issue. SDM Anuradha Thakur commented, "We received complaints about illegal soil mining activities in the Chak Agra area. Prompt action was taken by the administration to address the issue. Illegal soil mining is a serious offense, and we will continue to take strict action against those involved through focused drives in the days ahead."

SIA searches two houses in narco-terror case in Poonch

POONCH/JAMMU: The State Investigation Agency (SIA) on Tuesday conducted raids at two houses in border district of Poonch as part of its ongoing investigation in a case related to narco-terrorism, officials said. SIA sleuths searched the houses of Mohd Jameel alias "Akash" and Amir Sohail at village Gagrian and seized several digital devices and documents, they said. The case was registered by SIA Jammu in 2022 following recovery of a huge quantity of narcotics smuggled from across the border and the funds generated by selling the contraband were used to fund terror activities in the Union Territory, the officials said.
