"Kuldeep Handoo shall be entitled to an honorarium of Rs. $5{,}000/$ - per day for each sitting of the Panel. The member shall be eligible for local conveyance allowance in accordance with the extant rules of the Government of India. Outstation members will be entitled to traveling allowance as admissible under Government of India rules, as amended from time to time. The sitting of the
