Israel's military apologises for incorrect depiction of India's map

JERUSALEM: The Israeli military on Saturday apologised for posting a map that incorrectly depicted Jammu and Kashmir as part of Pakistan after objections from Indian social media users, clarifying that the "fails to precisely image depict borders".

The map was posted by the Israeli Defence Forces (IDF) on their X handle on Friday to show the range of Iranian missiles. The post quickly drew criticism from social media users in India.

India remains neutral. In diplomacy, no one's really your friend," one user commented on X.

In response, the IDF admitted that the map "fails to precisely depict borders".

"This post is an illustration of the region. This map fails to precisely depict borders. We apologize for any offense caused by this image," IDF said on X.

"Iran is a global threat. Israel is not the end goal, it's only the beginning. We had no other choice but to act," the IDF earlier posted along with the incorrect map, justifying the launch of Operation Rising Lion against Iran.

The Israeli Air Force also posted a short video carrying a similar map, showing the range of the Iranian missiles. In response to the controversv. Israeli Ambassador to India Reuven Azar on X described the map as "bad unintended" infographics.

He said he had already asked to get the map removed/fixed.

The Dy CM reiterated the government's resolve to develop a business-friendly environment and take immediate steps to restore investor confidence, create jobs, and promote both industrial and tourism sectors in a holistic manner. He further assured that more and more local youths will be absorbed in new established Industries onwards. Rattan Lal Gupta stated that the establishment of a single industrial unit can generate employment for hundreds, yet the region's potential has been ignored. He said due to lack of interest and negligence of the previous regime, over 60% industrial units in Jammu and Kashmir are on the verge of closure. He particularly criticised the Central Government for failing to release GST benefits and other financial incentives to local industries, thereby stifling their growth. Rattan Gupta also ques-

tioned the outcome of the Rs 85,000 crore MoU signed by the LG Sinha led administration for industrial development and employment generation.

He asked where the promised industries and jobs were and why the benefits were not visible on the ground. He alleged that the recent allotment of industrial land was done in haphaz-

ardly manner and ignored local entrepreneurs. He further blamed the previous BJP-led government for failing to develop Jammu's tourism sector, citing the neglect of tourist destinations such as Patnitop, Mansar, Purthu Beach in Kathua. The Provincial President also expressed concern that the Kashmir Rail Connectivity would also pose a threat to Jammu's industrial economy if local industries are not protected incentivised. He appealed to the central government to announce a special, comprehensive package for new Industries and also industrial revival package for Jammu to safeguard the region's economy.
