Kashmir is currently experiencing a heatwave as the temperatures have soared to ecord high in the last two decades.

Srinagar witnessed the hottest June day in two decades on Friday as the mercury rose to the maximum of 35.5 degrees Celsius, which was 6.3 degrees above the normal.

On the intervening night of Friday and Saturday, the city recorded 23.2 degrees Celsius --" the highest night temperature since 1990 when it recorded 23.6.

The all-time highest night temperature in June stands at 24.6 degrees recorded on June 29, 1978.

At 16.8 degrees, Pahalgam recorded the third highest night temperature ever in June, and at 20.4 degrees, Kokernag also recorded the third highest night temperature ever in the month. Similarly, at 21.1 degrees, Kupwara recorded the fifth highest night temperature ever in June.

"Yoga is a great personal discipline. At the same time, it is a system that takes us from Me to We. Let this Yoga Day mark the beginning of Yoga for humanity, where nner peace becomes global policy," he said.

When India proposed in the United Nations that June 21 be celebrated as International Yoga Day, in a short time, 175 countries accepted it, he said.

After 11 years, Yoga has now become part of the lives of crores of people around the vorld, he further said.

"Whether the Sydney Opera House or the Everest mountain, or the span of the ocean, the message is that Yoga is for everyone," said Modi.

Referring to Indian culture, the PM said it teaches us the value of "Sarve Bhavantu Sukhinah"-the welfare of all is one's sacred duty - and this journey from 'Me' to 'We' forms the foundation of service, dedication, and coexistence. The Prime Minister stated that it is this very thinking that fosters social harmony.

Emphasising that yoga should not remain merely a personal practice, Modi said it should evolve into a medium for global partnerships.

He called upon every nation and society to integrate yoga into their lifestyle and public policy and envision a collective effort to advance a peaceful, balanced, and sustainable world.

"Yoga should guide the world from conflict to cooperation, and from stress to solutions," he said.

Further, Modi noted that through the National Ayush Mission, the message of yoga and wellness is being actively advanced across the country.

According to the PM, the scale of events taking place in every corner of India reflects voga's growing influence.

Underlining the efforts of the Yoga Certification Board, which has trained more than 6.5 lakh volunteers and recognised around 130 institutions, the PM noted the incluon of a 10-day yoga module in medical colleges as part of building a holistic wellne

In Colombo, the Sri Lankan Foreign Ministry also advised its citizens in Iran to contact the Indian Embassy in Tehran if they wish to leave the country.

"The government of Sri Lanka has made arrangements with the government of India to assist Sri Lankans who wish to leave Iran by accommodating them in the flights," the ministry said in an official release.

According to the Foreign Ministry, there are less than 100 Sri Lankan nationals in Iran, while some 20,000 are employed in Israel.

In Kathmandu, Nepal's Foreign Minister Arzu Rana Deuba's secretariat said she requested the Indian government to rescue 16 Nepalese nationals who were stranded in Iran.

Foreign Minister Deuba requested the Indian government, through Indian Ambassador to Nepal Naveen Srivastava, to include the Nepali nationals during the evacuation of Indians from Iran.

Deuba took to X to thank External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar for India's swift assistance.

"Thank you @DrSJaishankar for India's swift assistance in helping to evacuate Nepali nationals from Iran. India's support in Nepal's evacuation efforts is a reflection of the strength of Nepal-India ties," Deuba wrote.

Of the 16 Nepali nationals, five are currently in Iranian prisons due to immigrationrelated offences, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs said, adding, efforts are underway to secure their release and repatriation as part of the evacuation process

India on Wednesday announced the launch of "Operation Sindhu" to evacuate its nationals from Iran after its conflict with Israel, which has entered its second week, showed no sign of letting up.

On Saturday, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said that over 500 Indian nationals have returned home from Iran under Operation Sindhu so far.

#### Drug licences of 9 pharma dealers suspended STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Authorities here on Saturday suspended drug sale licences of nine deal ers in a special drive carried out to curb misuse of pharmaceuticals with habit form ing ingredients, an official said.

The drive was conducted by the J-K Drugs and Food Control Organisation to identify and take punitive action against "unscrupulous elements dealing with such drugs in a clandestine manner," an official spokesperson said.

During the drive, it emerged that some wholesale dealers were procuring certain pharma preparations containing Pregabalin as an active ingredient, which is prone to addiction, he said.

The ingredient was being sourced directly from the suppliers based outside Jammu and Kashmir illegally, he said.

More scrutiny revealed that the firms procured and distributed these medicinal preparations without maintaining the sales records as mandated under the Drugs Cosmetics Act, 1940, the spokesperson said. S

Stocks of pharmaceutical preparations, which are prone to addiction, worth over Rs 13.58 lakh were also seized, he said.

J-K State Drugs Controller Lotika Khajuria warned against indulging in procur ing lesser-known brands of drugs formulations consisting of habit forming ingredients directly from the suppliers, or manufacturers located outside J-K.

"In case any violation is reported, the defaulters shall be dealt strictly

But when after payment of initial bribe amount of Rs 50,000, official said, the complainant again approached Tehsildar for permissions, he demanded remaining bribe amount of Rs 50,000 before giving him permissions and asked him to pay rest of the palance amount before he issue permissions.

After verification of facts which disclose commission of a cognizable offence punishable under Section 7 of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 (As amended in 2018) against Ghulam Rasool Bhat, Case FIR No.04/2025 under section 7 of the PC Act 1988 (as amended in 2018) was registered at PS ACB Baramulla and investigation was set into motion, the official said.

After registration of case, official added, trap team of ACB caught the accused Tehsildar and his tout Rafi Ahmad Lone, son of Abdul Khaliq Lone, resident of Pathora Kralagund, Kupwara red handed at private residence of accused in Handwara while demanding and accepting bribe from complainant after which both were taken into custody.

During search in addition to bribe money of Rs 50,000, cash of Rs 79,000 was also recovered and same was also seized by ACB, official said adding that the searches are being conducted at residential and official premises of the accused Tehsildar, the accused persons were presented before Additional Special Judge Anti Corruption Court, Baramulla which remanded them to police custody for 7 days.

It is pertinent to mention here that in the year 2021, ACB registered case against the said Tehsildar for illegal land mutations. Besides this some more verifications are going on against him in ACB, official said adding that further investigations are going on and role of other officers/officials is being ascertained.

## Will move SC if there is inordinate delay in restoration of statehood to J&K: Farooq

ANANTNAG: National Conference president Farooq Abdullah on Saturday said that his party would move the Supreme Court if there is an inordinate delay in the restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir.

"After the elections, people wanted their issues to be resolved immediately, but statehood (not being restored) is stopping us. They have many demands like they want him (National Conference MLA Altaf Kaloo) to become a minister, but how is this possible till statehood is restored," he told reporters after a meeting of the party workers in Kokernag area of south Kashmir district here.

"We are waiting, but if they (Centre) take a long time then we will have no option but to go to the Supreme Court," said Abdullah. "I am hopeful that when statehood is restored, we will get all the powers," he added. Commenting on the Israel-Iran conflict, the National Conference president said he prays to God to give sense to both countries to stop the war. "I pray that God gives both Israel as well as Iran some sense and give (Donald) Trump some sense also so that he talks about peace and not war. The issues can only be resolved peacefully and nothing will be achieved without peace," he said. Addressing his party workers earlier, Abdullah while referring to the April 22 Pahalgam attack said the attackers managed to reach Baisaran and carry out the attack despite the presence of so many security forces and technologies like drones. "They (Centre) said we ended militancy here, then where did they (Pahalgam attackers) come from? We have so many forces, so many drones etc. Where did those four (attackers) come from?" asked Abdullah.

#### CS for framing strategic plan to ease traffic congestion in Srinagar, Jammu cities

SRINAGAR: A pivotal meeting of the Multi-Disciplinary Committee on Traffic Management Systems for Jammu & Srinagar was convened on Saturday under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo.

The committee undertook a comprehensive review of the existing traffic challenges and proposed advanced strategies to enhance urban mobility, streamline logistics and improve road safety in both cities.

The members of the Committee who attended the meeting included Principal Secretary, Home; Commissioner Secretary, H&UDD; Commissioner Secretary Tourism; Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir/Jammu; DIG Traffic Jammu/Kashmir; SSP Traffic (City), Srinagar/Jammu; Commissioner, JMC/SMC along with other concerned officers.

The Chief Secretary directed for a proper implementation plan with a defined role for every stakeholder involved. He highlighted the importance of such a plan for making the travel experience less cumbersome for both travellers and commuters.

The Chief Secretary asked the Divisional Commissioners to work out such modal ties in their respective areas, and subsequently, these are going to be consolidated to frame a well-thought-out strategy for both Jammu and Srinagar. He also advised for looking into creating a web portal defining the actionable points pertaining to different departments so that the role played and progress could be easily tracked in subsequent meetings.

The key discussions held in the meeting revolved around the need for development of detailed traffic management plans for Srinagar and Jammu by the Traffic Department. The focus was laid on utilizing the scientific studies and data analysis to identify alternate routes after incorporating feedback from local authorities, cit izens and stakeholders.

A commitment was made to operationalize an efficient traffic management sys tem, including the installation, management and maintenance of traffic signals at key junctions, rotaries and T-points.

Strategies for de-congestion will be implemented in high-footfall and vehicular traffic areas, especially in tourist and pilgrimage zones together by the Traffic and Tourism Departments, Actions to regulate the commercial activities impacting traf fic flow will be identified, with the Transport Commissioner, JMC/SMC and poten tially LCMA, being involved in this process.

Moreover, the key locations requiring road expansion or upgrading to accommo date the growing traffic volumes will be identified, focusing on increasing the carry ing capacity of critical roads. The committee also underscored the need for speedy completion of ongoing developmental projects to alleviate traffic congestion at key locations

In addition, the strategies for addressing encroachments, particularly by street hawkers and their relocation and rehabilitation without disrupting the traffic flow will be recommended by the Tourism and municipal bodies in consultation with each ther. The Committee also discussed the requirement of multi-modal solutions like Mass Rapid Transit system, city bus system, Inland Water Transport (IWT), Ring Roads, enhanced parking and creation of Unified Transport Authority as other reliable solutions to ease traffic woes in our cities here.
