The interaction between him and Gandhi, the face of India's freedom movement, was a historic event that gave a new direction to the stir for independence, rendering it concrete objectives, he said.

The prime minister said it serves as a powerful source of energy for social harmony and for the collective goals of a developed India

Modi recalled his long association with Sivagiri Math, which was founded by Narayana Guru, and its saints' affection for him.

He noted that when its members and followers were stranded in Kedarnath following a natural disaster in 2013, when he was the chief minister of Gujarat, the Math reached out to him, not the central government, for help as they considered him their own.

He said the guru espoused the mantra of "One caste, one religion, one God for mankind", affirming that it has inspired many of his government's global initiatives like "One World, One Health", "One Sun, One Earth, One Grid" and "Yoga for One Earth, One Health", which was this year's theme for the International Yoga Day on June 21.

Hungary, and Poland, was earlier scheduled for lift-off rom NASA's Kennedy Space Centre in Florida on June 25 onboard SpaceX's Falcon 9 rocket at 12:01 pm IST on Wednesday.

"NASA, Axiom Space, and SpaceX are targeting 2:31 a.m. EDT (12:01 IST), Wednesday, June 25, for launch of the fourth private astronaut mission to the International Space Station, Axiom Mission 4," a NASA statement said.

The Axiom-4 commercial mission is led by Commander Peggy Whitson, with Shukla as mission pilot and Hungarian astronaut Tibor Kapu and Poland's Slawosz Uznanski-Wisniewski as mission specialists.

The mission was originally scheduled for lift-off on May 29 but was then put off to June 8, then June 10 and June 11, when engineers detected a liquid oxygen leak in the boosters of the Falcon-9 rocket and NASA also detected leaks in the ageing Russian module of the International Space Station.

The launch was then planned for June 19 and then on June 22 which was put off to allow NASA evaluate operations of the ISS after repairs in the Russian module.

The mission will lift off from Launch Complex 39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Centre in Florida.

The crew will travel to the orbiting laboratory on a new SpaceX Dragon spacecraft after launching on the company's Falcon 9 rocket. The targeted docking time is approximately 7 am (4:30 pm IST) Thursday, June 26, NASA said.

- The ombudsman in the district will be appointed by the UT Government on the recommendation of the Selection Committee of the UT, no written test of examination shall be conducted while an interview and internal marking system will be evolved by the selection committee of UT to rank person in order of preference. Prior to appointment, the panel prepared by the UT selection committee will be published on the official website of the department. It is clarified that the work of the ombudsman is in the nature of pro bond public service and no posts are created in the UT for the purpose.
- The Ombudsperson shall be appointed for a tenure of two years extendable not more than twice by one year each based on a performance appraisal process or till the incumbent attains the age of 68 years, whichever is earlier. There shall be no re-appointment.

Remuneration:

Subject to any subsequent notification by the Unior Territory of J&K, the Ombudsperson shall be allowed compensation, in form of fee of ₹ 2250/- (Rupees Two thou sand, two hundred and fifty only) per sitting with maximum upper limit of ₹45000/- (Rupees Forty Five thousand only) per month.

<u>Removal</u>

On unsatisfactory performance, the Ombudspersor may be removed by the UT Government on the recommendations of the Selection Committee of the UT.
