15th Asian Junior Women's Championship in Vietnam (2010), President's Cup in Kazakhstan (2011), Asian Senior Men's Championship in Tehran (2015), and AVC Cup for Men in Thailand (2022).
 Domestically, Magotra was the Organising Secretary for four National Championships hosted in J&K: Sub-Junior (2008), Juniors (1990 and 2022), and Senior (1995). He also served as Competition Director for the volleyball event at the Khelo India School Games (KISG) in Delhi (2018).
 Honoured with the prestigious Sher-e-Kashmir Gold Medal in 1987, Magotra continues to elevate the profile of J&K in Indian volleyball. His recent appointment has not only brought honour to the Union Territory but also renewed hope and inspiration for young athletes across the region.
