

Joint Naka laid by Dist Police, MVD Rajouri on NH; 29 challans issued, 17 vehicles seized

RAJOURI: Acting on the directions of Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Abhishek Sharma, a joint Naka was laid on Wednesday by the District Police and Motor Vehicles Department (MVD) Rajouri on the National Highway to intensify enforcement of traffic regulations and ensure road safety.

The special drive was carried out under the supervision of ARTO Rajouri, Rajesh Gupta; Motor Vehicle Inspector, Rahul Singh and DySP Headquarters, Satish Kumar. During the Naka, a total of 29 challans were issued for various violations, including plying of vehicles without valid Route Permits, non-functioning of Speed

Limiting Devices (SLD) and lack of valid fitness certificates.

In a significant move to curb illegal and unsafe transportation, 17 vehicles were seized and handed over to PS Rajouri. A fine amounting to Rs. 1,11,600 is to be realized from the violators.

The enforcement team strictly warned all vehicle operators to adhere to traffic rules and regulations. The officials emphasized that such joint enforcement drives will continue in the future to promote safer road behavior and reduce the risk of accidents.

The district administration urges the public, especially commercial vehicle operators, to ensure their vehicles are properly documented, mechanically fit and in full compliance with all legal provisions.

SSP Doda reviewed the security and traffic management plans for the yatras. He stressed the importance of

coordinated efforts between the police, civil administration and local stakeholders to maintain law and order. Deployment of adequate security personnel and traffic regulation measures were also discussed in detail.

DC Doda and SSP Doda emphasized inter-departmental coordination and sought active participation from local religious and civil society representatives to ensure a peaceful and successful yatra season in the district.

Amarnath Yatra; NDRF conducts mock drill in Udhampur

JAMMU: The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) conducted a mock drill to prepare for any emergencies that may arise during the annual Amarnath Yatra, which begins on July 3 in Jammu and Kashmir; officials said on Wednesday.

The 13th Battalion of the NDRF, stationed in Udhampur, carried out mock exercises and specialised training to ensure a safe pilgrimage, officials said, adding that the drills included demonstrations regarding various emergency scenarios, rescue operations, medical assistance, and support for the yatra and its pilgrims.

Seven officers and 56 jawans of the NDRF were involved in the mock drill, Inspector Munshi Ram Sharma of the NDRF said. Udhampur Deputy Commissioner Saloni Rai inspected the lodgement centres and facilities for pilgrims in the district and con-

firmed that all arrangements were made.

"All arrangements have been put in place. The Udhampur district houses 26 lodgement centres with a capacity to accommodate 6,500 pilgrims. We have established centres to house pilgrims in case of any weather-related or other emergencies," she told reporters here. The inspection was made to review arrangements for housing pilgrims, providing food, and ensuring other necessary facilities, she added.

The 38-day-long yatra is scheduled to start on July 3 with two routes: the traditional 48-kilometre Pahalgam route in Anantnag district and the shorter but steeper 14-kilometre Baltal route in Ganderbal district, both leading to the 3,880-metre-high holy cave shrine of Amarnath.

The first batch of pilgrims will leave for Kashmir from the Jammu-based Bhagwati Nagar base camp a day before the start of the yatra.
