Station, Jammu. The Divisional Commissioner and the IGP Jammu took a round inside the Yatri Niwas Bhagwati Nagar and inspected AC Halls, Washrooms, Cloak Rooms, RO water points and langar halls which are ready to host the pilgrims of the annual holy Yatra.

JMC conducts anti-encroachment drive in Old City

JAMMU: In compliance to the directions issued by the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh in PIL No. 27/2017, the Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC), on the instructions of Commissioner, Jammu Municipal Corporation, Dr. Devansh Yadav on Saturday carried out a massive anti-encroachment drive in the old city areas.

The drive was conducted under the supervision of Joint Commissioner (R&E), Subah Mehta and was assisted by the Chief Revenue Officer, Enforcement Officers of JMC and Police personnel.

The areas covered during the drive include Shalimar, City Chowk via Purani Mandi Central Basic Higher Secondary School, Ram Mandir surroundings, Purani Mandi, Raj Tilak Road and Parade to Indira Chowk.,

During the drive, over five

truckloads of material that have been displayed outside business establishments or spread on footpaths for sale were seized.

The business owners, rehri-walas and pherivalas were sensitized on the importance of maintaining clear pedestrian pathways and unobstructed vehicular movement. They were warned against placing goods beyond their shutter lines and were informed that repeated violations will lead to sealing of the establishments, as per the High Court directions.

The shopkeepers were also advised not to place tables, counters or any goods beyond the shutter lines and rehriwalas were instructed to operate only in designated zones, avoiding covering of footpaths and roads.

JMC reiterates its commitment to ensuring encroachment-free public spaces in the interest of public safety and urban order.

2 trucks loaded with firewood seized

KATHUA: In its continuous drive against the illegal smuggling of firewood, two trucks carrying firewood were seized for IT Rules violation. The Truck bearing Registration No. JK21H-5083 with NOC generated from NTPS portal for exempted species and carrying non exempted species seized by a team headed by BO Mastgarh Gandeep Singh and I/C Checkpost Korepunnu Dheeraj Pankaj at Dhaloti Jasrota Range.

Another truck bearing registration No. PB22K9920 carrying Eucalyptus species

and firewood under grab of NOC generated from NTPS portal was seized by team headed by Range Officer APCP Lakhanpur Sanjeev Singh at Lakhanpur.

The cases have been registered at Range Office Anti Polythene Check Post Lakhanpur and Range Jasrota for violation of section 41, 42 of Indian Forest Act. 1927 and provisions of SO 81 of 2020 and DFO Kathua order regarding restriction on night movements and confiscation proceedings have been initiated. Further investigation is being carried out.

The Health department has stocked the medicines and finalised duty roster for doctors and medical person-

nel.

Proper functioning of flood response mechanism and illumination has been ensured of the premises with CCTV coverage and deployment of security personnel and civil staff.

The Div Com asked the Officials of telecom agencies for sufficient availability of prepaid mobile sims for the arriving Yatris. He also

directed the concerned department for ensuring availability of all necessary items in the Super Bazaar set up inside the Yatri Niwas.

Directions were issued to put additional RFID and SRTC counters near the Hangar for facilitating the yatris. The Divisional Commissioner and IGP also

took first hand appraisal of

24x7 Control Room setup inside the Yatri Niwas with representatives of all concerned departments.


Later, the Divisional Commissioner and IGP visited the Railway Station to review the final arrangements there.

They inspected the arrangements at Saraswati Dham which will serve as the token centre for offline regis-


tration of Yatris.

They also took a round of RFID centres at Vaishnavi Dham, Pachayat Bhawan and Railway Station, Jammu.

All the concerned officials and departments were instructed to ensure comprehensive steps and measures are in place to facilitate the pilgrims of Shri Amarnathji Yatra 2025.
