Furthermore, he pledged to take up the matter with the Ministry of Labour and Employment and ESIC authorities to expedite necessary approvals and funding for new projects.

standards of healthcare. Our focus is on timely service, availability of specialists, and a patient-friendly environment," he added.

DHSJ reviews seasonal disease preparedness

JAMMU: A video conference was held on Saturday by the Directorate of Health Services Jammu (DHSJ) to assess the preparedness for water-borne diseases and snake bite management across Jammu Division.

The meeting was chaired by Director Health Services Jammu Dr. Abdul Hamid Zargar and attended by Chief Medical Officers and Medical Superintendents from across the division.

The meeting was initiated by State Surveillance Officer, IDSP Jammu Division, Dr. Harjeet Rai who stressed upon the timely reporting of cases on the IHIP IDSP portal, strengthening

of surveillance activities and enhancement of diagnostic capacity at District Public Health Laboratories (DPHLs). Seasonal disease trends, recent outbreaks and laid out action plans for rapid detection, reporting and response were discussed.

Recent cases of Acute Diarrheal Disease, Typhoid, Hepatitis A & E, and other water-borne infections in Rajouri, Udhampur and urban Jammu were reviewed in detail.

Health officers were directed to coordinate closely with the Jal Shakti Department to ensure the supply of clean drinking water, especially in outbreak-

prone and high-risk areas.

In view of the upcoming Shri Amarnathji Yatra, special instructions were issued for rigorous disease surveillance along the pilgrimage route. Regular water quality testing at Langars and medical camps has been made mandatory and any suspected cases must be reported without delay.

The rising number of snake bite incidents across the division was also discussed. District teams have been asked to intensify public awareness campaigns through ASHAs, ANMs and PRI members, encouraging early referral to health facilities and discouraging reliance on unqualified practitioners. Availability of anti-snake venom and trained staff has been reinforced as a priority at all government hospitals.

The Directorate reaffirmed its commitment to ensuring public safety through proactive health monitoring, coordinated field actions and enhanced readiness of the health system across the Jammu Division.

JAMMU: Shiv Sena (UBT) Jammu and Kashmir unit chief Manish Sahni has expressed hope that a record number of devotees will join the Shri Amarnath Yatra 2025, and has demanded from the Shrine Board to make on-spot registration free and simple along with publicity and to increase counters and quota.

In a program organized today at the party's state central office, about a dozen youths joined the party after being influenced by the party's policies and ideas.

On this occasion, state head Manish Sahni, while talking to journalists, expressed confidence that the 10.9% drop in the figures of Shri Amarnath Yatra 2025 as compared to the previous years figures will be compensated by on spot registration.

VRS Union holds protest, seeks CM's intervention on 12-year-old pending arrears

JAMMU: A protest demonstration and sit-in was organized today near the Press Club, Exhibition Ground, Jammu under the leadership of Dev Raj Bali, President of the VRS Union Jammu. The protest saw participation from numerous retired employees demanding immediate action on their long-pending financial arrears.

During the demonstration, the Union strongly criticized the Transport Higher Authority and the Finance Department, accusing them of collusion and deliberate delay in processing the dues of retired employees from J&K RTC. Protesters alleged that

despite their case being clear and all relevant bills lying ready in the Secretariat, the authorities are unnecessarily harassing the claimants.

"Our arrears have been pending for over 12 years. This inordinate delay has cost lives - 75 VRS/GHS and superannuated employees have died, many of them unable to afford medical treatment due to lack of funds," said Sh. Dev Raj Bali while addressing the media. "Who is responsible for these irreparable losses? Every time we are given false assurances, but no concrete action is taken."

The protesting retirees earnestly appealed to Chief

Minister Omar Abdullah to personally intervene and ensure their legitimate demands are fulfilled without further delay. "We have knocked every door, approached every concerned authority, but no one has come to our rescue," Bali added.

Key Demands of the VRS Union include payment of Cost of Living Allowance (COLA) arrears from June 1999 to 31st December 2005, release of 6th Pay Commission arrears from January 1, 2006 to March 2012, disbursement of DA arrears from April 2012 to March 2021.

The demonstration witnessed participation from several retired employees and members of the Union, including Sat Bhushan Singh, Ramesh Bhan, Balwinder Singh, P.P. Singh, Shiv Kumar, Surinder Kumar, Surinder Singh, and others, who expressed anguish over continued neglect by the administration.

The VRS Union has reiterated that until their rightful dues are cleared, they will continue their peaceful struggle for justice.
