
declares 52 villages falling along ALC as reserved areas STATE TIMES NEWS

LEH: Fifty-two villages along the Actual Line of Control (ALC) have been declared reserved by the administration of the Union Territory of Ladakh to enable residents of these identified areas to avail reservation benefits in recruitment and other sectors, a notification issued on Sunday said.

The Ladakh administration has achieved vet another milestone with the issuance of an official notification declaring specific areas as adjoining the Actual Line of Control under the provisions of the Jammu and Kashmir reservation Act. 2004. as amended by the Ladakh Reservation (Amendment) Regulation, 2025, an official spokesperson said.

As per the notification, this includes 18 revenue villages in Leh district situated along the Line of Control (LoC) and Line of Actual Control (LAC), and 34 revenue villages in Kargil district situated along the LoC.
