Extreme poverty in India down to 5.3 pc in **2022-23: World Bank** STATE TIMES NEWS

NEW DELHI: India's poverty extreme declined sharply to 5.3 per cent over a decade from 27.1 per cent in 2011-12 even as the World Bank revised upwards its threshold poverty line to USD 3 per day.

Given India's inflation rate between 2017 and 2021, a revised extreme poverty line of USD 3 would constitute a 15 per cent higher threshold than USD 2.15 expressed in 2021 prices and result in a 5.3 per cent poverty rate in 2022-23, the World Bank said in a report.

As against 34 crore people below poverty line (USD 3/per day) in 2011-12, the numbers have come down to 7.5 crore in 2022-23 in absolute numbers. The World Bank has

announced a major revision to global poverty estimates, raising the International Poverty Line (IPL) from USD 2.15/day (2017 PPP) to USD 3/day (2021 PPP), $\,$ according to a factsheet issued by the

Train to Kashmir: Helicopters ferried men, machines to build engineering marvels

REASI: As Prime Minister Narendra Modi dedicated a prestigious railway project connecting Kashmir to the rest of the country on Friday, fulfilling Maharaja Pratap Singh's century-old dream, the Indian Railways remembered the pivotal role of the armed forces' helicopters in ferrying men and machines to the remote and cut-off region to script history.

The use of helicopters proved to be a game changer, not only in building more than 215 kilometres of approach roads through mountainous terrain, linking around 70 remote villages, but also in paving the way for human resource deployment and the construction of three engineering marvels -- the world's highest railway bridge, the country's biggest



cable-stayed bridge and the longest transportation tunnel in India.

"The helicopters of the armed forces played a pivotal role in transforming the dream connecting

Kashmir by rail into reality. They ferried men and machines to begin work in unconnected regions that made this train to Kashmir possible," a senior railway officer told PTI.

He said the Reasi-Ramban belt was remote and largely inaccessible and initially. labourers and engineers had to trek on foot to undertake basic project work.

Former Railway Board

Rail Link Project fully operational after nearly 28 years KATRA: The 272-km Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link Project, which was started

in 1997, took almost 28 years to become operational. Its first 55 km long section between Jammu and Udhampur was completed in April 2005.

According to Northern Railways, the whole project was completed and operationalised in multiple phases, with the last one being inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on

After opening the Jammu-Udhampur section, the then UPA government focused on sections n Kashmir and operationalised the 68 km long Anantnag-Mazhom rail link in October 2008. "Then came a 32 km long Mazhom - Baramulla rail link on which train services started in February 2009. So by 2009, locals availed train journey from the last point of the USBRL

oroject, ie, Baramulla to Anantnag," a Northern Railway official said. He added, "Since work was going on simultaneously on other sections, Railways was able to extend the train service from Anantnag to Quazigund towards Jammu side by October end in

The Railways achieved another significant milestone when it further extended the train serv ices from Quazigund to Banihal in June 2013, which involved the construction of an 11.215 km long Pir Panjal tunnel. "Almost a year later, in July 2014, ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9
