



Congress never flagged discrepancies: EC sources on Rahul's charge on Maha poll rigging

NEW DELHI: Sources in the Election Commission (EC) rejected claims on Saturday of rigging in last Maharashtra Assembly polls and said defaming the poll panel after receiving an unfavourable verdict from the voters is absolutely absurd. The EC sources were responding to an article written by Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, alleging "match-fixing" in the Maharashtra polls.

They said any misinformation being spread by anyone brings disrepute to the thousands of representatives appointed by political parties during elections and demotivates lakhs of poll staff who work tirelessly for the gigantic exercise.

They pointed out that unsubstantiated allegations raised against the

Maharashtra are affront to the rule of law. Underscoring

match-fixed elections are a "poison" for any democracy, Gandhi wrote that the side that cheats may win the game, but it damages institutions and destroys public faith.

In a post on X, the Congress leader outlined the alleged electoral irregularities in a stepwise manner -- fake voters added, the voter turnout inflated, bogus voting facilitated and evidence subsequently hidden.

Rejecting the claims, the sources underlined that 6,40,87,588 (over 6.4 crore) voters who reached polling stations between 7 am and 6 pm exercised their franchise in the Maharashtra polls.

About 58 lakh votes, on an average, were polled every hour, they said.

trend, nearly 1.16 crore voters could have voted in the last two hours, the sources added.

"Therefore, the casting of 65 lakh votes by electors in two hours is much below the average hourly voting trend," an EC functionary pointed out.

The sources noted that the voting progressed in the presence of the polling agents formally appointed by the candidates or political parties at every polling booth. The Congress candidates

or their authorised agents had not raised "any substantiated allegation" regarding any kind of abnormal voting at the time of scrutiny before the returning officers and election observers the next day, they pointed out.

On the issue of alleged fudging of electoral data, the sources said voter lists

Maharashtra, were prepared according to the Representation of the People Act, 1950 and the Registration of Electors Rules, 1960.

According to the laws, either just before an election or once every year, a special summary revision of the electoral rolls is conducted and its final copy handed over to all national or state political After the finalisation of

the electoral rolls for the Maharashtra election, as against the 9,77,90,752 (over 9.77 crore) electors, only 89 appeals were filed before the first appellate authority -- the district magistrate concerned -and only one was filed before the second appellate authority -- the state chief electoral officer.

"Therefore, it is amply clear that there was no or any other political party before the conduct of the Maharashtra Assembly election in 2024," the EC functionary said. During the voter-list revision, for more than one lakh polling booths, along with the 97,325 booth-level officers appointed by the electoral registration 1,03,727 (over 1.03 lakh) booth-level agents were also appointed by all political parties. These included the 27,099 booth-level agents appointed by the Congress.

The sources said more than one lakh booth-level officers of Maharashtra are still waiting for such "wild allegations" to be converted into at least one single real appeal before district magistrates in accordance with the election law against discrep-

2 more persons arrested

GUWAHATI: Two more persons have been arrested in Assam in an ongoing crackdown on "anti-national and communal elements". Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said on Saturday.

With these, the number of arrests in such cases in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack has reached 90.

"Update on crackdown against Anti-national and communal elements - 7 Jun -90 arrests till now." Sarma said in a post on X.

One person has been apprehended by Goalpara police for making "offensive social media post on Lord Ram", and another by Kamrup police for "inciting communal discord" through social media.

The state police have been taking action against people for "anti-India" and "pro-Pakistan" activities, including posts on social media, since the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, in which 26 people were killed.

Among those arrested on the anti-national charge was opposition AIUDF MLA Aminul Islam.

June 10 lift-off, dock at ISS after 28-hour flight ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

NEW DELHI: Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla and three others are set to embark on the Axiom Space's fourth human spaceflight from NASA's Kennedy Space Centre in Florida on June 10 and are likely to dock at the International Space Station on June 11 at about 10 PM IST,

after a nearly 28-hour journey. Shukla, the mission pilot of the Axiom-4 (Ax4) commercial mission to the ISS, will be accompanied by mission commander Peggy Whitson and specialists Tibor Kapu from and Slawosz Uznanski-Wisniewski from Poland.

The Axiom-4 mission will mark India's return to space 41 years after Rakesh Sharma's historic spaceflight onboard Russia's Soyuz mis-

sion in 1984. "The crew will travel to the orbiting laboratory on a new SpaceX Dragon spacecraft after launching on the company's Falcon 9 rocket. The targeted docking time is approximately 12:30 p.m.EDT (10:00 p.m. IST), Wednesday, June 11." NASA said in a statement. ISRO Chairman V Narayanan visited Axiom Space last week to review the preparations for the space-

The astronauts have been in quarantine since May 25 to prepare for the trip and have been training ahead of the launch on June 10.

"The #Ax4 crew undergoes extensive emergency training, featuring a range of scenarios such as underwater escape drills," Axiom Space said in a post on X, and shared a video of the training programme.

Indian astronaut Shukla Axiom-4 mission set for

Shukla is set to conduct exclusive food and nutritionrelated experiments developed under a collaboration between the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), with support from NASA.

The experiments aim to pioneer space nutrition and selfsustaining life support systems vital for future long-duration space travel.

ISRO has lined up a set of seven experiments for Shukla,

who will also participate in five joint studies planned by NASA for its human research pro-

It has drawn up plans to focus on India-centric food for carrying out experiments on the ISS including sprouting methi (Fenugreek) and moong (green gram) in microgravity conditions.

Shukla will also expose the seeds to the macrobiotic conditions and bring them back to earth where they will be cultivated into plants not just once but over generations.

Shukla's experience on the Axiom Mission 4 would be very well utilised on the Gaganyaan mission which is planned for 2027. ISRO is spending Rs 550 crore on the Axiom-4 mission.



Centre eases rules for buying scientific equipment, consumables by R&D institutes

NEW DELHI: In a bid to further research, the government has enhanced financial limits for the procurement of scientific instruments and consumables by various scientific institutions, including those pursuing research in the defence sector. According to the amendments to the special provisions in the general financial rules (GFR), vice chancellors and directors of various research and development institutions will now be able to purchase scientific equipment and consumables for research purposes up to Rs 2 lakh without seeking any quotations, as against the earlier limit of Rs 1 lakh. The

financial limit for procuring goods by the Purchase Committee has been enhanced to Rs 25 lakh from the existing Rs 10 lakh.

The financial limits for procuring goods using the limited tender enquiry (LTE) and advertised tender enquiry have been increased to Rs 1 crore from the existing Rs 50 lakh.

Vice Chancellors and directors have been designated as competent authorities to approve the issuance of a global tender enquiry up to Rs 200 crore for the procurement of scientific equipment and consumables required only for research purposes.

"In a landmark step enabling

ease of doing research, the GFR rules have been simplified for procurement of scientific equipment and consumables," Science and Technology Minister Jitendra Singh said in a post on X.

Singh said the easing of GFR will reduce delays, enhance autonomy and flexibility for research institutions and empower them to innovate faster. The amendments to the GFR will apply to the departments of science and technologv, biotechnology, scientific and industrial research, atomic energy, space, earth sciences, health research, including the Indian Council of Medical Research.

The Defence Research and Development Organisation, Indian Council of Agricultural Research and its affiliated institutions and universities, and educational and research institutes conducting postgraduate, doctoral-level courses or research under any ministry/department will also benefit from the amended GFR.
