

# Div Com reviews KCC scheme coverage, progress on SWMPs in Jammu districts

JAMMU: Divisional Commissioner, Sanjeev Verma on Saturday chaired a meeting of Deputy Commissioners and concerned officers to review the progress on issuance of Kisan Credit Cards, allotment of school buildings left vacant after their merger, besides land allotment for Solid Waste Management Plants and other related issues in the districts of Jammu division.

The meeting was attended by Deputy Commissioner Reasi, Indu Kuwal Chib; Director ULB Jammu, Vir Ji Hanglo; Director Agriculture Jammu, Inder Jeet; Joint Director Rural Development Department, Mohammad Anwar Bandy; ADDC Jammu, Ramesh Chander besides senior functionaries of Education, Horticulture and other concerned departments, while other Deputy Commissioners of Jammu division along with concerned officers participated in the meeting through video conference.

The Div Com reviewed the progress on issuance of Kisan Credit Cards to left

out beneficiaries. The Deputy Commissioners and Chief Agriculture Officers apprised the Div Com about the present status of KCC registration in their respective districts. It was informed that the process of renewal of old dormant and issuance of new Kisan Credit Cards is in progress in all the districts of the division.

The Div Com directed the DCs and other concerned officers to ensure 100% coverage of beneficiaries under KCC. He also directed them to cover the left out farmers under the scheme with active involvement of Lead Bank officials. He also directed the Agriculture and Bank officers to hold a meeting with district officers to resolve the issues, if any and ensure 100% coverage of left out beneficiaries.

Meanwhile, the Div Com also reviewed the land issues for establishment of Solid Waste Management Plants in the districts.

The Deputy Commissioners informed about the progress on identification, transfer of land and other issues. It was informed that the in all the districts most of sites have been approved for setting up of SWMPs and the land has also been transferred in favour of concerned departments for the purpose.

It was also informed that in some districts land has been identified, but joint verification/visits for approval is pending.

The Div Com directed the DCs and concerned departments to conduct joint visits at identified sites for approval of the same so that the execution of the work is started.

Besides, he also directed the Director Urban Local Bodies to speed up the progress of works on all the sites where land issues have been resolved and land transferred.

The Div Com also reviewed the progress on allotment of the vacant school buildings to the departments in the division. It was informed that these buildings were left vacant after the merging of various schools and allotted to different departments in the districts.

The Div Com asked the DCs to allot the buildings to the departments, who have projected requirement for the same. He to utilize the buildings for housing Sub Health Centres, Anganwari Centres, Panchayat Ghars, Patwar Khanas, Skill Development Centres, Umeed Groups, BDC office etc, as per the requirement of the area.

Meanwhile, the Div Com also asked the district administrations of Kathua, Samba and Jammu to identify suitable land for establishment of procurement centres (Mandis) at different locations in the districts.

**Govt evacuates 1,86,379 stranded J&K residents**

JAMMU: The Government has evacuated about 1,86,379 Jammu and Kashmir residents, stranded in other parts of the country due to COVID lockdown, via Lakhanpur and through special trains and buses till date amid strict observance of all necessary guidelines and Standard Operating Procedures.

As per the official data received on Saturday in this regard, the Jammu and Kashmir administration has received 73 special trains at Jammu and Udhampur railway stations from different states and UTs, so far, with about 59,661 passengers while about 1,26,718 persons from other states and UTs including 658 from abroad have been evacuated by the government through Lakhanpur till date.

As per the detailed breakup of the figures, about 2048 stranded passengers have entered through Lakhanpur from July 3 to July 4 mornings while 829 passengers have reached today in the 52nd Delhi COVID special train at Jammu. So far, 52 trains have reached Jammu with a total of 43,965 stranded passengers belonging to different districts while 15,696 passengers have reached Udhampur in 21 special trains, so far.

He further asked the Tourism department that ablation center comprising of 48 bathrooms should be completed within a period of 2 months so that people visiting the shrine do not face any hardships on account of its non-completion.

The executing agency assured the Advisor that work on all the pending and ongoing works would be expedited and project completed by the given deadline as directed by the Advisor.

**INSTRUCTIONS & GUIDELINES:-**

- The Concerned students shall visit the BoSE website [www.jkbose.ac.in](http://www.jkbose.ac.in) and create an account. After creating an account, the student shall log in and fill his/her particulars. After filling-in of the online form and deposition of prescribed fee, the form shall be routed to the concerned institution's account for verification and online submission to JKBoSE.
- The concerned Heads of the Affiliated Academic Institutions shall facilitate and guide the students and ensure that every student of their school correctly enters the data particulars online.
- Disabled candidates having disability of 50 (Fifty percent or more) are exempted from paying Registration Return Fee. However, they shall take a printout of the Registration Return Fee submitted online, get it attested by the Head of the Concerned Academic Institution and submit the same in the concerned District/Tehsil Office of the BoSE along with Disability Certificate from the concerned Medical Board.
- Only those on-roll students of Class 9th for the Academic Session 2019-20 are eligible for submission of the Registration Returns who shall attain the age of (14) Fourteen plus on the first day of November, 2021.
- The concerned Heads of the Affiliated Academic Institutions shall verify and ensure that all the particulars filled-in by the candidates are genuine and strictly in accordance with the Admission Records before forwarding these (online) to the JKBoSE.
- The particulars of the candidates verified and certified by the concerned Affiliated Academic Institutions shall be recorded in the JKBoSE database as final and no further correspondence or claim whatsoever shall be accepted at later stage on this score.
- The Academic Institutions to note that there shall be no checklists for this online registration process.
- Only those Academic Institutions who are affiliated with the BoSE and in whose favour the facilities for the current Academic Session 2019-20 have been released by the General Section shall be able to transmit the Registration Returns of their on-roll eligible students.

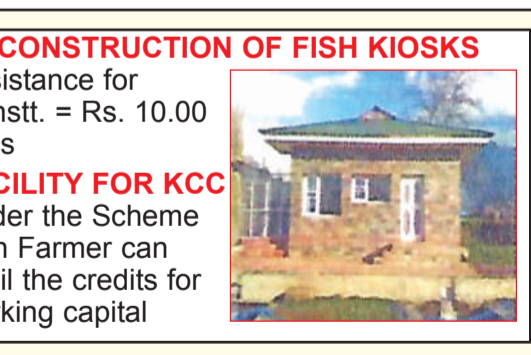

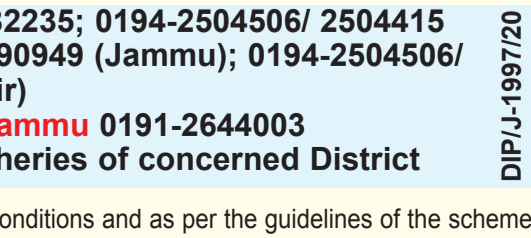
