

Resolve issue regarding impure drinking water supply in Mean Sarkar: Manjit

SAMBHA: Apni Party Provincial President, Jammu, Manjit Singh on Friday expressed serious concern over the poor developmental activities in Mean Sarkar; Barjani in Bari Brahmana, Samba District. In a statement to the press, Apni Party organised a public meeting at Mean Sarkar with the locals in which various developmental issues were discussed and day to day problems being faced by the people in the area. The meeting was chaired by Provincial President, Jammu, Manjit Singh in which a large number of locals participated. Speaking on the occasion, the Former Minister Manjit Singh said that it was unfortunate that

the basic developmental works have not been done in Mean Sarkar. "People have complaints about poor drainage systems, irregular drinking water supply and unscheduled electricity," said Manjit Singh. He said that the ground water which is available through the handpumps is not

fit to be consumed by the people. "People who consume the water even through taps have complaints about health issues. The water should be filtered properly and checked before being supplied to the people," he demanded. He said that it is the duty of the Jal Shakti Dept to provide clean drinking water. "Being close to the industrial

area, the drinking water has allegedly become impure. The Jal Shakti Dept should check the allegations and not supply impure drinking water," he said. He said that the electricity supply has also become a main cause of concern for the people in Mean Sarkar; Barjani of Bari Brahmana. He said that the administration should make sure that the people are provided with development at their doorstep and they should not suffer for want of drinking water; and electricity which are basic necessities. The meeting was attended by senior Schedule Tribe leader Saleem Alam, retired Headmaster Irshad Mohammed, and others.

DC Doda reviews progress of rural electrification works

DODA: Deputy Commissioner Doda (DC), Vikas Sharma on Friday reviewed the progress of power development works taken up in the district for strengthening rural electrification and improving overall power supply scenario. The meeting was attended by the senior officials of JPDCL and its Project Wing, besides representatives of contractor company - Shalaka Infra Tech Pvt Ltd. With regard to the inspection to be done in 40 habitations where the installation of transformers have been completed, the DC directed to get these charged and inspected within a

week, besides asked to submit the exact locations of the three sites where augmentation of transformers has already been done. Regarding procurement of pending 50 transformers, the DC was informed that stage inspection has been done and these would be available by July 25.

Moreover, the DC was informed that stringing of distribution lines is on at 42 locations, pole erection is being done at 36 sites, besides head loading of material is going on at 32 sites. The DC directed the concerned AEE to inspect all the mentioned sites and submit the report regarding latest position.

Further the DC directed to constitute a team comprising of ACR, Ex En Project Wing and Representative of Shalaka Infra Tech to discuss the bottlenecks and to resolve them accordingly in coordination with respective Tehsildars. The DC directed all the concerned to expedite the progress and assured that every possible support shall be provided by the District Administration in completing all these public important projects. The meeting was attended by SE JPDCL, SE Project Wing, CPO Doda, All Ex Ens and AEEs, besides officers/officials of Shalaka Infra Tech were also present.

HC quashes FIR against lecturer registered for alleged dishonouring of National Anthem

SRINAGAR: Justice Sanjeev Kumar of J&K High Court Srinagar wing on Friday quashed FIR against Dr Tawseef Ahmad Bhat, Lecturer in Government Degree College Bani, on contractual basis, against whom the FIR was registered for allegedly dishonouring national anthem in a function held to celebrate surgical strike with observations that Executive Magistrate may not be empowered under Section 156(3) of Code to direct investigation in cognizable offence. Justice Sanjeev Kumar, after hearing both the sides in length, observed that in instant case, it seems that SDM Bani, who was presented an application by the aggrieved students alleging that the petitioner has shown disrespect to the National Anthem and, therefore, liable to be proceeded in accordance with law. Accordingly, he forwarded the application in original to Police Station, Bani, with a direction to register FIR against culprit under rules. The SDM, while forwarding the application, also endorsed thereupon his observations that on enquiry from students, he was told that petitioner had intentionally caused disturbance in assembly while National Anthem was being recited and therefore, dishonoured National Anthem. "From perusal of FIR, it clearly transpires that police registered FIR not only on basis of directions of SDM but also took note of contents of the application. In such circumstances, the forwarding of complaint of students with his observations by the SDM can be construed as bringing the relevant information relating to commission of cognizable offence to the notice of police for performance of its statutory duty of registration of FIR under Section 154 of Code. It is thus not correct to say that impugned FIR has been registered solely on basis of directions issued by SDM Bani, who, being an Executive Magistrate, is not empowered to do so. I am, therefore, of the

view that though an Executive Magistrate may not be empowered under Section 156(3) of the Code to direct investigation in the cognizable offence, yet he can bring to the notice of Police the information relating to commission of cognizable offence and direct it to perform its statutory duty," he observed. Justice Sanjeev Kumar after hearing both the sides observed that from a perusal of impugned FIR, which is based on the written complaint of the students, it clearly transpires that it does not attribute any act to petitioner which may be tantamount to preventing anybody from reciting Indian National Anthem or causing any disturbance to the assembly, which was engaged in such reciting. "Failure of the petitioner to participate in the assembly engaged in singing of Indian National Anthem, intentionally or otherwise, and roaming about in the school premises where assembly was engaged in singing Indian National Anthem, in my opinion, would not amount to either preventing the singing

of Indian National Anthem or causing any disturbance to the assembly engaged in such singing. The conduct of the petitioner, if intentional, may amount to showing disrespect to the National Anthem and a breach of fundamental duty enjoined on citizens of the Country by Article 51A of the Constitution. The petitioner

by losing his contractual job has already paid the price," the Court observed. With these observations, Justice Sanjeev Kumar observed that in these circumstances, allowing investigating machinery to proceed in the matter would be an abuse of process of law and quashed impugned FIR.
