Whereas, Government of Jammu and Kashmir Transport Department vide its Order No. 08-JK (TR) of 2022 dated 07.02.2022 directed:

- That all Commercial vehicles shall be phased out after 20 years in non-attainment cities i.e. Jammu and Srinagar.
- That all commercial vehicles in other areas shall be phased out after 25 years as per current norms of fitness certificates every six months as per orders of Hon'ble High Court after its initial period.
- That all private personal vehicles shall be allowed to ply as per fitness certificates.

Whereas, the passenger Mini-Buses with below mentioned Registration Numbers and Route permits indicated against each as per the Registration Certificates issued by RTO/ARTO Jammu have completed 20 years of age, which areas falls within the limit of Jammu city; and covered by stipulation made at Para (a) of the aforementioned Government Order; and:

Whereas, by virtue of aforesaid Government Order, the vehicles bearing below mentioned Registration Numbers having completed 20 years of age and are liable to be phased out immediate forthwith and earlier Route Permits allotted to these vehicles have been rendered non-operative on the dates of attaining their age of 20 years; and:

Whereas, in view of the aforesaid Order of the Government of Jammu and Kashmir Transport Department all these motor vehicles cannot operate on these Routes in so far as and to the extent, these falls in the jurisdiction of Jammu city; and:

Whereas, the Transport Commissioner, J&K, vide communication no.TC/JK/MV/2022/747-49 dated 15-03-2022, directed that "RTO Jammu and RTO Srinagar shall workout the exact number of passenger vehicles which would be affected by the operation of the aforesaid order and allot the alternative routes in the areas outside the Jammu and Srinagar cities in consultation with owners of such vehicles on which these vehicles would ply"; and:

Whereas, pursuant to the aforesaid order of the Transport Commissioner, J&K an excercise was conducted and found that 59 vehicles (Mini-Buses) with below mentioned registration numbers have completed 20 years of age; and:

Whereas, the matter for allotment of alternate routes in the areas outside the limit of Jammu city was taken up in the meeting of the Regional Transport Authority (RTA), chaired by the Deputy Commissioner, Jammu on 21-06-2022 and during the meeting, it was decided that before allotting the alternate routes, these motor vehicle owners be put to notice and and their choice/preferences for alternate routes outside the Jammu city be sought; and:

Whereas, consequent upon this the motor vehicle owners of the below mentioned vehicles were also informed with the individual written notices dated 24-06-2022 through the registered post for choosing an alternate routes outside the Jammu city and were also asked to convey their choices/preferences of routes outside the limit of Jammu city by or before 30-06-2022; and:

Whereas, despite lapse of 15 days, none of the owners of the below mentioned vehicles have come forward in person or through written request conveying their choice/preference of alternate routes outside the limit of Jammu city.

Through the medium of this notice, the owners of the below mentioned motor vehicles are hereby informed that since the route permits ealier allotted to them have been rendered non-operative and non-permissible on the date of attaining the age of 20 years by their motor vehicles in view of the aforesaid order and therefore, they cannot operate these vehicles on these routes in so far as and to the extent these falls in the jurisdiction of Jammu city and in the event of any vehicle found plying on these routes shall be seized without any further notice:
