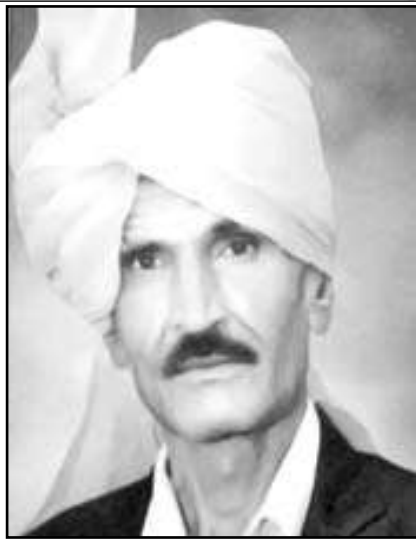

CRIME REPORT

Theft case solved; thief arrested, stolen property worth Rs 2.8 lakh recovered

REASI: Police on Thursday solved a theft case by arresting a thief and recovered stolen property worth Rs 2.8 lakh. As per details, FIR no. 61/2022 under sections 457/380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Reasi after receiving complaint of a theft from owner of a shop at Salal, Reasi namely Rakesh Kumar, resident of Salal. Multiple teams of Police Station Reasi were constituted to work-out the theft case. Police teams scanned CCTV footage of areas and rounded up 30 suspects during investigations. After strenuous efforts, Police team led by PSI Rajat Incharge Police Post Jyotipuram and Insp Sunil Sharma SHO Reasi under the supervision of Iftikhar Ahmed Dysp Headquarters Reasi, police zeroed upon a suspect Anil Singh, son of Balvinder Singh, resident of Village- Mogla, Tehsil Trayath, District Rajouri who during sustained interrogations, confessed about commission of crime along with his two other accomplices. On his disclosure, police recovered a transformer; weighing machine & 1 Mangalsutra (gold) along with ear rings worth Rupees 2.8 lakh.



Trucker nabbed with 4.1 Kg poppy straw

JHAJJAR KOTLI: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Jhajjar Kotli Police arrested a trucker and recovered 4 Kgs 100 gm poppy straw from his possession at a Naka point, set-up as a security measure for ongoing Yatra.

As per the details, a team of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli constituted under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar and led by SHO Police Station Jhajjar Kotli Inspur Vikram Sharma, while on Naka duty intercepted a truck (JK02CS/3387). On search, 04 Kg 100 gm poppy straw was recovered from the vehicle. The driver, identified as Mohd Saleem, son of Mohd Rafiq, resident of BhatidharTehsil Mendhar District Poonch was arrested and FIR No. 165/2022 under sections 8/15/25 of NDPS Act was registered against him in Police Station Jhajjar Kotli.



26 bovines rescued, woman among 8 smugglers rescued

JAMMU: Police on Thursday foiled various bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 16 bovines and arrested eight smugglers including a woman.

As per details, Nagrota Police rescued 5 bovines during checking at a Naka and seized a Truck (JK18A/6971). The accused identified as Mohd Ajaz, son of Shab Din, resident of Gujar Basti Bahu Rakh was arrested and FIR No. 271/2022 under sections 188/34 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act, 50/52/54/56 transportation of animals rules 1978 was registered against him at Police Station Nagrota. The overall arrest and recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Partap Singh under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

In another action, acting on an information regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party from Police Post Mansar; intercepted a Mahindra vehicle (JK14H 8646) for checking. During checking, 2 bovines were found laden in vehicle, which were rescued. The accused namely Mohd Shaber, son of Mohd Saleem, resident of Londane Rattian, Udhampur and Shuma, wife of Kaka Hussain, resident of Darsoo Raan, Udhampur were arrested and FIR No.166/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 PCA of Act was registered against them at Police Station Samba.

Further, on direction of SSP Poonch Rohit Baskotra, teams headed by DySP Surankote Tanveer Jeelani, SHO Surankote Insp Niaz Ahmed, Incharge Police Post Behrgamallah SI Sushant Singh established Nakas at Behramgalla and Buffiaz areas. During checking, police apprehended 2 bovine smugglers and seized 2 vehicles (JK02AP 1957 & JK11B 9204) laden with 10 bovines, which were rescued. FIRs No 181 & 182/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Surankote.

Rajouri Police also foiled a bovine smuggling bid and seized a vehicle besides arresting accused drivers. Police said on Wednesday, a team of Police headed by PSI Jatinder Sharma under the close supervision of SHO Rajouri Fareed Ahmed during routine checking, frisking at Salani bridge intercepted three Mahindra load carriers which were moving towards Poonch. FIR No 348/2022, 349/2022 and

350/2022 U/S 188 IPC, 11 PC Act was registered at Police Station Rajouri and three accused were arrested. Nine animals found loaded in the vehicle.

Missing woman traced, reunited with family

JAMMU: Police on Thursday traced a missing woman and reunited her with family. As per details, a missing report was lodged at Police Post Gujar Nagar regarding missing of a woman from her home, by her husband. In this regard a missing report was registered and investigation started. On this, a team under the supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu led by SHO Peermitha Inspur Kirti Sharma assisted by Incharge Police Post Gujar Nagar PSI Ajaz Ahmed, after putting in strenuous efforts traced out missing woman. Subsequently the family of the missing woman was informed and she was handed over to her family members after completing all legal formalities.

Minor girl child rescued from labour at Kulgam

KULGAM: On specific information, a minor girl child was on Thursday rescued from child labour by officials from ICPS and Labour Department at Kulgam.

The officials from ICPS informed that stern action against the culprit, from whom the minor girl child was rescued, will be initiated as per the Juvenile Justice Act 2015.

They also informed that department also intimated the father of the child telephonically and was asked to attend the office of Child Welfare Committee Kulgam to explain factual position. Now, the case is before Child Welfare Committee for inquiry and child was handed over to her father under proper undertaking as per Juvenile Justice Act, added the officials.

Police team attacked; cop injured, accused arrested

JAMMU: A police patrolling team was attacked in Kanachak area, in which one cop was injured, however police has detained an accused.

As per details, a patrolling team of Kanachak Police Station led by ASI Rakesh with SPO Sahil and Rakesh Singh, saw some people quarrelling in Jhiri area on which they tried to pacify them but cops were attacked by youth namely Sahil Sharma, resident of Pinjore. In attack, SPO Rakesh Singh got injured and was shifted to hospital for treatment. The accused was arrested and a case under relevant section of law was registered against him.

Youth arrested for sending obscene messages to woman

JAMMU: A youth was arrested for sending obscene messages to a woman in Kanachak area on Thursday.

As per details, a woman, resident of Mishriwala lodged a complaint with Kanachak police that a youth namely Sonu Mehra of same area is harassing her by sending obscene messages from last couple of days. She said that the youth is maligning her image by fake rumors also. Acting on complaint, police has detained the youth and registered a case against him.

Stolen Scorpio recovered, 4 detained for questioning

UDHAMPUR: Traffic police on Thursday recovered a stolen Scorpio at Udhampur and handed over four youth to police for questioning.

Giving details, DySP Traffic Himmat Singh said that during Naka checking at Jakheni, traffic cops signaled a Scorpio (HR26ET-5639), without HSRP to stop but instead of stopping, driver tried to flee from spot. Traffic cops chased the vehicle and intercepted it after a short distance. On being asked to produce documents of vehicle, the driver produced only pollution certificate. When it was e-Challaned, the cops found that the vehicle is from West Bengal having registration number WB 08K-7182 registered on name of one Ashish Sardar, while the number of vehicles was registered on name one Pardeep Kumar of Gurgaon. On questioning, it was learnt that vehicle was stolen and accordingly FIR was registered in Sevan District of Bihar. All the occupants of vehicle were detained and handed over to Udhampur police for further action.

Married woman goes missing

6 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police team of Police Station Akhnoor and Police Post Chinore acted stringently on specific inputs and raided suspected locations in their respective areas and seized 6 vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles include 4 tractor-trolleys without Registration numbers seized by Akhnoor police and 2 tractor-trolleys bearing Chassis Nos MBNAK48ACLTN06135 and WZTF30428130544 seized by Chinore Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Akhnoor Inspur Hilal Azhar and Incharge Police Post Chinore PSI Amit Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

Narco smuggler nabbed with heroin

BARI-BRAHMANA: Continuing its drive against menace of drugs, District Police Samba on Thursday arrested a drug peddler and recovered about 6 gm Heroin

(Chitta) like substance from his possession. As per details, a party of Police Station Bari-Brahmana led by SHO Bari Brahmana, Inspur Rakesh Sharma under the supervision of SDPO Bari Brahmana Shivali Kotwal while performing patrolling duty, intercepted a suspect near canal road Dollian, Bari-Brahmana. During frisking, approximately 6 gm Heroin (Chitta) like substance along with electronic weighing scale was recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Sunil Kumar alias Ali, son of Bumesh Chander, resident of Bhatiyari, Tehsil Bishnah was arrested and FIR No 129/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Bari-Brahmana.



Vendor arrested for selling SIM cards on fake identities & verification

DODA: Police on Thursday unearthed a racket of selling SIM cards by vendors on fake identities and fake verification and arrested an accused.

Doda Police said that a SIM card vendor namely Zaffer Hussain alias Jaffer Hussain, son of Noor Mohd Matoo, resident of Hoodwar Tehsil Gandoh used to hoodwink both administration as well as the common masses by issuing SIM cards on fake identities thereby putting innocent people, whose names have been used, into trouble, if SIM is used otherwise to carry forward anti-national activities or other criminal actions. The racket was being run by using the official website namely ceojk.nic.in, in which first they used to visit website, open it, copy and paste a CQR number as well as other details of a voter viz his name, address, parentage and then filling this information in fake electoral card, after that by using app, adobe photoshop, they used to print photo of victim on it thereby generating a new electoral card with address and name remaining same but having a photograph of some other person. The above named SIM card vendor had been running the racket since long along with his associates namely Mohd Tayab, son of Mohd Iqbal, resident of Gandoh.

During initial investigation, it has been found that the vendor has issued almost (39) fake SIMs to different persons and there is an apprehension of increasing this number in coming days as investigation move forward and when more complete information forms of SIMs issued by the vendor is received at the ends of Police. FIR No. 45/2022 under sections 420/467/468/120B of IPC was registered in this context at Police Station Gandoh.

Man arrested with Charas

SRINAGAR: Continuing efforts against drug peddling, Handwara Police on Thursday nabbed a drug peddler and recovered Charas like substance from his possession.

As per details, a party of Police Post Langate while on Naka checking in Langate area, apprehended a suspect. On search, around 120 gm Charas like substance was recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Shahid Ahmad Parray, son of Khalil Mohammad Parray, resident of Tulwari was arrested and FIR No.188/2022 under sections 8/20 NDPS was registered against him in Police Station Handwara.



Drug peddler arrested; 10 Kg grinded cannabis powder recovered

BUDGAM: Continuing its efforts to curb the menace of drugs, Police have arrested a drug peddler in Budgam and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Beerwah at a checkpoint established at Waragam Crossing intercepted a person carrying a bag in suspicious conditions. During search, 5 Kg grinded Cannabis like powder was recovered from his possession. Identified as Altaf Ahmad Bhat, son of Ghulam Mohammad Bhat, resident of Mashun Dassan, the accused was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 78/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Beerwah and investigation initiated.

During further questioning, he disclosed that he has stored more Cannabis material at his place. Accordingly a raid was carried out in presence of a Magistrate at his house and during search, 5 Kg of contraband grinded Cannabis like substance was recovered.
