# Scrapping textile park project 'most regressive' step: Ex-Punjab CM Amarinder

CHANDIGARH: Former Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh on Monday said the scrapping of a proposed textile park project near the Mattewara forest area in Ludhiana is the most regressive and short sighted decision by the AAP government.

Singh's reaction came after the Punjab government decided to scrap the proposed textile park project with Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann saying no industrial unit will be set at the site near the Mattewara forest area.

The decision was taken by CM Mann following a meeting here with the members of Public Action Committee (PAC), an NGO which was spearheading a protest against the setting up of a mega integrated textile region and apparel park, citing environmental concerns given its proximity to Mattewara forest and Sutlej river.

The previous Amarinder Singh-led government had conceived the project in July 2020. The project was mooted under the PM Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Parks (PM MITRA) scheme.

You don't throw away the baby with the bath water, the Punjab Lok Congress leader said in a statement. Questioning the diatribe

launched against the project, he clarified that the textile park was not to come up within the Mattewara forest area as was being said, but outside it.

He claimed that all environmental concerns had been addressed according to the United Nations guidelines and only then the park was approved.

Singh regretted that the Aam Aadmi Party government, after initially deciding to go ahead with the project, had scrapped it, just because some people opposed it without any justification or without any technical and scientific knowledge about the environment.

The former CM said the Ludhiana Textile Park was one of the seven such parks coming up across the country.

The proposed textile park was approved with the specific objective of sustainable industrialization that does not harm the environment according to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 9, he said. He said with such an approach, no industrialization can take place in Punjab, which is already scarce of land.

When Punjab is reeling under such a financial crisis and investments are not coming, such a regressive

## Haryana STF arrests 5 members of Lawrence Bishnoi gang

GURUGRAM: The Special Task Force of Haryana Police has arrested five notorious members of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang from Bahadurgarh.

Six stolen luxury cars were also recovered.

The STF team received specific input regarding the movement of the accused in Bahadurgarh. Acting swiftly, it laid a trap near Bahadurgarh bypass and apprehended them.

Those arrested include Chiraag, who handles the drug trade of Bishnoi gang in South Haryana and is the younger brother of Tinu Bhiwani arrested in the Moosewala murder case, they said.

Others are Manoj Bakkarwala, the famous car thief, Prakash Barmer, resident of Barmer in Rajasthan, Amit of Pinjore and Sanjay, a resident of Zirakpur, Punjab.

Apart from Bishnoi gang, they were also working for Kala Jathedi gang for a long time, they said.

## 12 MPs of Shiv Sena in touch with Eknath Shinde faction, claims Union Minister Danve

JALNA (MAHA): Union minister and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader Raosaheb Danve on Monday claimed 12 MPs of Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena are in touch with Chief Minister Eknath Shinde faction and are ready to cross over.

Speaking to reporters here in Maharashtra, Danve also said Shiv Sena might support National Democratic Alliance (NDA's) Presidential nominee Droupadi Murmu given that she is tribal.

"12 MPs of Shiv Sena are ready to leave the party and are on the verge of joining the Eknath Shinde camp," the Jalna MP said.

The Shiv Sena has 18 MPs in the Lok Sabha. Danve also said the

Shinde faction is the true Shiv Sena as he has the support of two-thirds of total (55) MLAs.

"I am confident that the Supreme Court and the Election Commission will rule in favour of the Shinde faction," he said when asked about which faction will be allotted the Shiv Sene'a bow and arrow poll symbol.

In a relief to Shiv Sena MLAs of the Uddhav Thackeray faction, the Supreme Court on Monday asked newly-elected Maharashtra Assembly Speaker Rahul Narwekar not to proceed with the plea seeking their disqualification which was sought by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde's group on the ground of defying party whip during the trust vote and the election of the speaker.

Queried on whether MLAs and MPs of the Uddhav Thackeray camp will support Murmu in the Presidential election, Danve said he thinks so.

"If Uddhav Thackeray supports the NDA candidate, I will welcome such a decision.

I feel Sena might support Murmu as she hails from a tribal community. A large number of Adivasis live in our country, and this is for the first time that a tribal will become the President of India," he added.

Earlier in the day, 13 Lok Sabha MPs of the Shiv Sena physically attended a key meeting held at Uddhav's private residence 'Matoshree' in Mumbai on the presidential elections and a majority of them suggested supporting Murmu.

### 5 missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Monday traced five missing persons and reunited them with their families.

As per details, two different complaints were lodged at Police Post Phallain Mandal and Police Station Gangyal, by legal heirs of a woman and three other children, stating that they went missing from their respective homes. In this regard, missing report vide DDR No .12 on June 20, 2022 regarding missing woman and missing reports regarding children was registered at Police Post Phallain Mandal and Police Station Gangyal respectively and investigation started. On this special police teams were formed under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma. A team led by SHO Satwari Insnr Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Phallain Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing woman.

Similarly, another team led by SHO Gangyal Insnr Joginder Singh Chib, after putting in hectic efforts, traced all three missing children. Subsequently families of missing persons were informed and they were handed-over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

Meanwhile, another missing boy was traced by Jhullas Police. Details revealed that one Akasar Bi, wife of Mohd Shabir lodged a complaint at Police Post Jhullas, stating that her 13-year old son Shehraz Ahmed went missing since June 27 and accordingly, FIR No 138/2022 under section 363 of IPC was registered at Police Station Poonch. After this, various teams were constituted to carry out search operation in different cities and after hectic efforts, a police team under guidance of SHO Poonch and, supervision of DySP HQ Poonch and Addl SP Poonch & overall supervision of SSP Poonch, successfully traced missing boy from Jammu, who was handed-over to his legal-heirs.

### Gang of thieves busted; 5 arrested, stolen gold items worth Rs 5 lakh recovered
