

Modi's governance reforms are actually social reforms: Dr Jitendra

BENGALURU: Union Minister, Dr Jitendra Singh said here on Tuesday that the governance reforms introduced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during the last eight years are actually social reforms aimed at achieving 'ease of living' for the common man and a "level playing field" for the aspirational youth.

Delivering the valedictory address at the two-day Regional Conference on Governance in Bengaluru organized by DARPG and Karnataka Government, Dr Jitendra Singh said, the hallmark of Modi's governance model is his capacity to take out-of-box decisions, break the taboos of the past and the capacity to convert government's campaign into mass campaign on the basis of his courage, conviction and sincerity. Referring to the theme of the conference, "Bringing Citizens, Entrepreneurs and Government Closer for Good Governance", Dr Jitendra Singh listed a series of such reforms having wider social implications.

The Minister recalled that within three months of taking charge in May, 2014, Prime Minister took the most revolu-

tionary and path-breaking decision of abolition of attestation of certificates by gazetted officers instead promoting self-attestation, thus reposing faith in youth of India.

Similarly, Narendra Modi had suggested the abolition of interviews during Independence Day address from the ramparts of Red Fort on 15th August 2015 and the same was implemented by DoPT from 1st January 2016 that paved the way for level playing field for all the candidates. The Minister said, the number of complaints in CPGGRAMS increased from 2 lakh per year in 2014 to 25 lakh per year at present, which also reflects positively that here is a government which listens to citizens' grievances promptly and addresses them.

PM Excellence Awards focusing on flagship schemes rather than the individual profile of officers was another far-reaching governance reforms promoting healthy competition among 750 districts, the Minister added.

Dr Jitendra Singh informed the delegates that by the end of this year, the National Recruitment Agency (NRA) under DoPT is gearing up to conduct computer-based online Common Eligibility Test (CET) for recruitment to non-Gazetted posts.

He added that to begin with, the test will be conducted in 12 Languages and gradually it will include all the 22 languages mentioned in the 8th Schedule of the Constitution, which will overcome the complaints of language bias coming from some

southern states.

The Minister said, Prime Minister's Mantra of Minimum Government, Maximum Governance means more involvement of citizens, innovation, use of latest techniques and transparency. He said, the ultimate aim of all governance models is to reach out to the last man in the last queue to empower him economically. He said, there is a need to try to adopt best practices from each other and implement them in our respective sectors, regions and states. He mentioned that the Government has made the States coupled with similar problems so that they can share their expertise and experiences related to similar issues and also success stories to learn from each other.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, based on the model of Aspirational Districts, DARPG has introduced the novel concept of District Good Governance Index. He said, Jammu and Kashmir was the first state where the District Index was released in January this year followed by Uttar Pradesh and now the work is on in Madhya Pradesh. He said, the District Good Governance Index is a milestone and it is expected that it will provide a robust

framework for evidence-based assessment of the performance of all the districts in the states. The Minister also informed the gathering that in next phase the index will move to Block and Panchayat level.

Secretary, DARPG, VSrinivas said, the conference is an effort to bring the Government and Citizens closer through various administrative reforms at centre, state and district level. The is being enabled by use of digital technology, pursuing next generation reforms and innovations with policy objective of "Maximum Governance, Minimum Government", entailing Government process Re-Engineering, Universal access to e-services, excellence in digital initiatives at district level and excellence in adopting emerging technologies and use of ICT Management.

During the 2-day event, presentations were made in six sessions: (i) Administrative Reforms; (ii) The Outside in View: Private Sector & Good Governance; (iii) Replication of Best Practices; (iv) Administrative Reforms in States; (v) Benchmarking Governance and (vi) Start-ups and Experiments in Good Governance.

water-tax will have far-reaching consequences for them. "It was abolished back in 2015, terming it as 'symbol of feudalism' by the then Government, but Government is going to reinstate it which would further increase financial burden over farmers manifold.

This will impact agricultural industry very badly, especially farmers. Administration is running Jammu and Kashmir with least concern. Lashing out on BJP government, Sawhney said that needs and issues of people of Jammu and Kashmir have been neglected.

He said that various taxes have been increased and introduced during BJP's rule, like the one Gabbar Singh Tax. "In Jammu alone, people have been slapped with tax after tax with new toll taxes being levied under the administration. BJP's complete tax system is a nightmare to all sections, starting from working class, to businessmen and now even to farmers.

At a time, when farmers need help, Government is introducing such policies only to aggravate the situation further. We completely stand behind the farmers in support and demand immediate rollback of the decision to reimpose water tax," Sawhney maintained.

The Niramaya Health Insurance Scheme covers Health expenses of the eligible persons to the extent of Rs. 1 Lakh, which includes hospitalization charges, OPD charges including tests, treatment etc.

Court awards 2-yr imprisonment to two Pak nationals

JAMMU: Principal Sessions Judge Jammu Sanjay Parihar awarded two years imprisonment to two Pak Nationals for entering illegally into territory of India.

While awarding two-year imprisonment to Pak nationals identified as Basharat Ali, son of Mohd Rafiq, resident of Hailatian, Tehsil & District Sialkot and Husain Farooq, son of Rehmat Ullah, resident of Gohadpur town, Sialkot, (Pakistan), Principal Sessions Judge Jammu Sanjay Parihar after hearing Public Prosecutor Kulbhushan Sharma observed that during confessional statement, accused disclosed that

they were working as traders and are in custody since 21.09.2019, thereby remaining in custody for a period of more than two years. As such, both are sentenced to undergo imprisonment of two years and a fine of Rs.1000. In default of payment of fine, they shall undergo further imprisonment of one month, the Court directed.

Principal Sessions Judge Jammu Sanjay Parihar further observed that in Prof Bhim Singh Vs Union of India, Supreme Court had observed that with regard to foreigners, who have been convicted and completed their sentence, in the event of confirmation of their nationality, should be deported back to their respective country. In that backdrop, having regard to the fact that the accused persons are not involved in any unlawful activity against sovereignty of India and appears to be strayed into Indian territory inadvertently. Therefore, after the expiry of sentence, the jail authorities in coordination with the Home Department UT of J&K shall take steps to coordinate with Central authorities at Delhi for deportation of the accused to their native country through international check post or through some other pivotal point, so as to enable them to meet his own people.

Revenue official nabbed while taking bribe of Rs 1,300

UDHAMPUR: Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) has nabbed one Raj Kumar, a Prism-man in office of Naib Tehsildar, Udhampur for demanding and accepting bribe of Rs 1,300 on Tuesday.

As per an official spokesperson, a complaint was received at Police Station ACB Udhampur wherein complainant alleged that five months ago, he applied in the office of Naib Tehsildar, Udhampur for issuing SC certificate in his name as well as in name of his son but Prism-man namely Raj Kumar, posted as dealing clerk in office of Naib Tehsildar, Udhampur demanded Rs 10,000 from complainant for getting his file cleared. "After negotiation, accused Raj Kumar asked the complainant to pay an amount of Rs. 5000 and in return, he will get his file cleared for issuance of SC certificate. A complainant lodged a written complaint against the accused public servant at Police Station ACB Udhampur after verifying the complaint. FIR No.02/2022 was registered at Police Station ACB Udhampur; after which a trap team was constituted, which caught accused official Raj Kumar, red handed, while demanding and accepting of Rs 1,300 from complainant as bribe," he said, adding that further investigation is going on.
