# Development not possible without peace: LG

# 'Some people trying to provoke SFs, Admn to fuel unrest'

SRINAGAR: Asserting that development was not possible without establishing peace in Jammu and Kashmir, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha Friday said some people were trying to provoke security forces and the administration so that some mistake is made and an unrest is fuelled.

Development can only take place when there is peace. This has to be kept in mind. There is no place in the world which has progressed when there was no peace, Sinha said addressing a function at the launch of District Export Plans at SKICC here.

Union Minister of State, Commerce and Industry, Anupriya Patel was also

Sinha said some people were continuously trying to foment trouble in the valley as they were not happy with the tourism growing here, industries being set up, economic scenario stabilising, and lives of people changing.

"But, we will not allow that situation to arise," the LG said.

# Rubaiya Sayeed identifies Yasin Malik, 3 others as her abductors

JAMMU: Rubaiya Sayeed former Chief Minister Mufti Mohammed Sayeed's daughter, appeared before a special CBI court on Friday in a case related to her 1989 abduction and identified JKLF chief Yasin Malik and three others as the ones who took her captive, officials said.

This is the first time Rubaiya has been asked to appear in the case. She had been freed after five terrorists were released in exchange. Rubaiya, who stays in Tamil Nadu, is listed as a prosecution witness by the CBI, which took over investigations into the case in early 1990.

Rubaiya identified Malik, who was present in the court through video conferencing

"This is the person and his name is Yasin Malik. He was the man who threatened me that he will drag me out of the minibus if I refused to follow their diktat," Rubaiya

Dr Rubaiya Sayeed, after appearing before special CBI court in Jammu on Friday. 

# Over 5,400 pilgrims leave Jammu camp for Amarnath

JAMMU: The 16th batch of over 5,400 Amarnath pilgrims left Jammu city on Friday morning for the twin base camps of Pahalgam and Baltal in Kashmir, officials

The annual pilgrimage, which was suspended from Jammu last Sunday due to bad weather resumed on Monday. A flash flood triggered by heavy rains near the cave shrine on Friday last week led to the death of at least 15 people.

The 43-day-long pilgrimage to the 3,880-metre-high cave shrine in south Kashmir Himalayas commenced on June 30 from the twin tracks  $\,$ -- the traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam route in

### for Dharnas, protests: Birla STATE TIMES NEWS

NEW DELHI: Demonstrations, dharnas or religious ceremonies cannot be held in the precincts of Parliament House, a circular by the Rajya Sabha secretariat has said, drawing ire from the Opposition on Friday even as Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla insisted that such notices were being issued for vears

The Rajya Sabha secretariat has said that the circular has not been issued for the first time and such advice has been reiterated from time to time. They said such a circular is issued normally ahead of every session of Parliament.

The secretariat also provided copies of the similar circuissued during the

Congress-led UPA regime in 2013 and said such circulars are being issued for many vears now. The new bulletin, which has

been issued by Rajya Sabha Secretary General P C Mody ahead of the Monsoon session of Parliament beginning July 18, said the kind cooperation of members is solicit-

"Members cannot use the precincts of the Parliament House for any demonstration, dharna, strike, fast, or for the purpose of performing any religious ceremony,' the bulletin said.

Reacting strongly to the circular, the opposition parties attacked the government. Congress general secretary and chief whip
