Rubaiya Sayeed identifies...

Special Judge and during the course she identified Malik, who was recently sentenced to life imprisonment in a terror funding case, and three others as her abductors.

Ahead of Rubaiya's statement, Malik had appeared in the same case on July 13 during which he asked the court for ensuring his physical appearance so that he could cross question the witnesses in the case or else he would sit on indefinite hunger strike in prison.

Malik told the court that he was awaiting a response from the government till July 22 failing which he would start his indefinite hunger strike.

The JKLF chief is at present lodged in the high-security Tihar Jail after he was sentenced by a special NIA court in Delhi in May. He was arrested in early 2019 in connection with the 2017 terror-funding case registered by NIA.

Rubaiya was abducted near Lal Ded Hospital on December 8, 1989 and freed from captivity five days later on December 13 after the then V P Singh government, supported by the BJP at the Centre, released the five terrorists in exchange.

Other charged in the case are Ali Mohammed Mir, Mohammed Zaman Mir, Iqbal Ahmad Gandroo, Javed Ahmad Mir, Mohammed Rafiq Pahloo, Manzoor Ahmed Sofi, Wajahat Bashir, Mehraj-ud-Din Sheikh and Showkat Ahmad Bakshi.

During the investigation, accused Ali Mohammad Mir; Zaman Mir and Iqbal Gandroo voluntarily confessed before a magistrate about their role in the Rubaiya kidnapping. Besides, four others made confessional statements before CBI's Superintendent of Police.

"Since the accused persons besides admitting of their own guilt have also narrated about the participation of other accused persons namely Malik, Javed Ahmed Mir and Mehraj-U-Din Sheikh, which can also be used against them as one of the pieces of evidence," the court had said in January last year.

The 10 are among the two dozen accused named by the CBI in its chargesheet filed before the court. Among the others, top JKLF commanders Mohammad Rafiq Dar and Mushtaq Ahmad Lone are dead and 12 are absconding. These are Halima, Javed Iqbal Mir; Mohammad Yaqub Pandit, Riyaz Ahmad Bhat, Khurshaed Ahmad Dar; Basharat Rehman Noori, Tariq Ashraf; Shafat Ahmad Shangoole, Manzoor Ahmad, Gulam Mohammad Taploo, Abdul Majeed Bhat and Nissar Ahmad Bhat.

In March 2020, the special court framed charges against the JKLF chief and six others in another case related to the gunning down of four IAF personnel on the outskirts of Srinagar in January 1990.

Idol of Lord...

Every year, nearly 20,000 to 25,000 pilgrims from Doda, Udhampur; Kathua and Ramban districts visit the high-altitude meadow between July and September after the snow melts to offer prayers.

As per initial investigations, the idol might have been damaged due to frosting as it is made of concrete and is in the open, a senior officer who visited the spot and is part of the investigation said.

"The idol remains under snow at sub-zero temperatures. A picture clicked in April also shows some signs of wear and tear on the idol," he said.

The administration has appealed for calm and requested people not to fall prey to exaggerated social media reports.

Earlier, officials said the FIR had been registered in connection with a vandalised idol. On Monday, an idol of Lord Hanuman was found damaged at Dhamlar-Morha village in Mahanpur, triggering a protest by locals. Prior to that, a temple was vandalised in the Sidhra area of Jammu on April 8, followed by a similar incident at Vasuki Naag temple in the upper reaches of Doda district on June 5 and the alleged damaging of an idol in Kathua district on July 12. cases, Jammu 57, Udhampur 09, Kupwara 05, Ganderbal 04, Samba and Kathua districts three cases each, Baramulla and Anantnag two cases each, Poonch, Budgam and Pulwama reported one case each while no other district across the Union Territory reported any fresh case.

Meanwhile, Ladakh's COVID-19 tally has climbed to 28,602 with 14 fresh cases recorded in the past 24 hours, officials said.

All the fresh cases were reported from Leh, they said.

So far, 228 people have succumbed to COVID-19 in Ladakh. Of these, 168 deaths were reported from Leh and 60 from Kargil, according to the officials.

The officials said the number of active COVID-19 cases stands at 59 -- all in Leh.

As many as 419 samples were tested in Ladakh. Of these, 324 samples from Leh and 80 from Kargil tested negative, they said.

Four more people recovered from the viral disease in Leh. With this, the total number of recoveries in Ladakh increased to 28,315, the officials said.

They said 2,263 passengers were screened at the Leh airport; 879 people, including drivers and helpers of trucks and light motor vehicles, were screened in Leh's Khaltse; and 365 people were screened at the Upshi checkpoint on the Srinagar-Kargil-Leh highway.

Kishtwar to become...

Minster said, makes Kishtwar region as one of the biggest power hubs of North India. He also announced 100 percent reservation for locals in unskilled jobs for these projects and promised to give preference to local talent in skilled manpower requirement.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, before 2014, road travel to Kishtwar was cumbersome and on the slightest landslide, the Doda-Kishtwar road got blocked. But today, the road travel time from Jammu to Kishtwar has reduced from over 7 hours in 2014 to less than 5 hours now. Similarly, he said, during these 8 years, Kishtwar has come up on the Aviation Map of India and has been sanctioned an airport under Centre's UDAAAN Scheme, which nobody had ever imagined.

The Minister said, Kishtwar has got an AYUSH Hospital, while Padar was given a Kendriya Vidyalaya under Centre's RUSA scheme, because the then State Government had declined to do so.

Overall, in the erstwhile Doda district of which Kisthwar was a part, Dr Jitendra Singh said, India's first-ever National Institute of High-Altitude Medicine is coming up in Bhadervah and centrally funded Medical College has already started in Doda. Similarly, three new national highways including Khilani-Sudlmahadev Highway, a series of Degree Colleges, mobile towers enroute Machail Yatra and other remote areas have also come up during the Modi government, he said.

Dr Jitendra called upon the citizens to motivate the youth to avail maximum benefit of the StartUp avenues in Aroma Mission, Purple Revolution and Lavender cultivation, which has already picked up in the neighbouring Bhadervah and is seen as a hitherto unexplored source of livelihood.

Dr Singh said that areas like Jammu and Kashmir, North-Eastern States and other hilly States suffered on many counts during the last 60-65 years, due to myopic policies of the successive Central Governments, but soon after the Modi government took over in 2014, Prime Minister had stated that every effort would be made to bring the North Eastern region, J&K and other backward regions at par with the more developed regions of the country.

Dr Jitendra said here today that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will always be credited for having introduced a new work culture in India wherein each of the pro-poor and public welfare schemes were designed in such a manner so as to reach the most needy or the last man in the last queue, regardless of cast, creed, religion or vote consideration. Similarly, considering the emerging scenario of contemporary India, Modi has constantly boosted StartUps who should be capable of earning their own livelihood, he said.

Dr Singh said revolutionary schemes like Gareeb Kalyan Anna Yojana, Jan Dhan, Ujjawala, Sauchalaya, PM Aawas, Har Ghar Jal, Har Ghar Bijli and Ayushman have reached every nook and corner of the country including in hilly and difficult terrains like Kishtwar. He said, people are getting the benefits of welfare schemes without any discrimination, unlike in the past, when appeasement policy was rampant. The Minister emphasised that these welfare measures brought crores of people out of the clutches of abject poverty and gave them a life of dignity.

In his concluding remarks, Dr Jitendra Singh said, areas with unexplored potential like Kishtwar, North-East and other hilly regions will play a pivotal role in the next 25 years of India's journey and these regions, rather than the saturated states, will propel India as a frontline nation in the world, when it celebrates 100th year of independence in 2047.

BJP President Pradip Parihar, senior BJP leader Tariq Keen, veteran leader Capt Hukum Chand and former Minister Sunil Sharma were among others who addressed the rally. All of them profusely appreciated Dr Jitendra Singh's hard work and commitment in getting several development projects for Kishtwar and his constituency.

Parliament House can't...

of the party in Rajya Sabha Jairam Ramesh was among the first ones to take to Twitter to attack the government.

"Vishguru's latest salvo - D(h)arna Mana Hai!," he tweeted, sharing a copy of the circular issued on July 14.

Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) president Sharad Pawar slammed the decision of prohibiting demonstrations and dharmas in the precincts of Parliament House, calling it an attack on democratic rights of elected representatives.

CPI-M leader Sitaram Yechury also took to Twitter to criticise the government and alleged that these are attempts to muzzle the voice of democracy.

"What a farce. The attempts to muzzle the soul of India, its democracy and its very voice will fall flat," he said.

After the opposition uproar over the circular, Speaker Birla told reporters that political parties should refrain from making allegations without ascertaining the facts.

"It (such circulars to members) is a process. This practice has been carrying on for a long time," he said, adding that this has been going on since 2009 and even before.

"My appeal to all political parties is that in the Parliament or state assemblies they should abstain from making charges and counter-charges without ascertaining the facts. Our endeavour should be to strengthen democratic institutions, as all of them work with accountability," Birla said, adding that the effort is to ensure that all members freely but responsibly express their views.

"I urge all political parties should abstain from making allegations on any democratic institution without any basis," he also said.

Addressing a press conference in Nagpur, Pawar said "Any attack on democratic rights will not be tolerated" and added that opposition parties are meeting in New Delhi on Saturday to discuss the issue and frame a collective stand.

In a tweet in Hindi, Yechury also said, "the more useless the government, the more cowardly it is. Democracy is being mocked, by issuing such dictatorial orders. Protesting in the Parliament House Complex is a political right of the MPs which is being violated."

Another opposition leader Manoj Jha of RJD shared the circular and sought the immediate intervention of the Rajya Sabha Chairman and the Lok Sabha Speaker.

"Bringing a Parliamentary Bulletin to say that we cannot hold a dharna inside the Parliament. It is an attempt to take parliamentary democracy to the grave. We demand that the Lok Sabha Speaker and Rajya Sabha Chairman should intervene immediately," he said in a tweet in Hindi.

TMC's Mahua Moitra took a swipe at the Prime Minister for holding a religious ceremony "on top of the new Parliament building".

"Btw Honourable MP Varanasi performed a religious ceremony on top of new Parliament Building just four days ago," Moitra said in a tweet.

Shiv Sena's Priyanka Chaturvedi while sharing the circular on Twitter asked, "Will they come for Parliamentary Questions next? PS: Hope this isn't an unparliamentary question to ask."

Opposition members have in the past demonstrated inside the Parliament complex and have also staged protests near the statue of Mahatma Gandhi there.

The circular on dharmas comes amid opposition outrage over another bulletin listing out certain words as "unparliamentary" which was issued by the Lok Sabha secretariat.

The circular on the usage of some terms in Parliament has also drawn flak from the Opposition which claimed that every expression used by them to describe how the BJP was destroying India has now been declared unparliamentary.

However, the Lok Sabha Speaker on Thursday said no word has been banned for use in Parliament but will be expunged on a contextual basis. Members are free to express their views while maintaining the decorum of the House, he said.

He also said that every year words are added to the list of unparliamentary words and these are such words and expressions that have been declared unparliamentary in Parliament, state legislatures and in some commonwealth countries in the past. He, however, said that the Chair's decision on whether to expunge the words or expressions is final.

A new booklet by the Lok Sabha Secretariat said on Wednesday that the use of terms like 'junaljeevi', 'baal buddhi', 'Covid spreader', 'Snooagate' and even commonly used words like 'ashamed', 'abused', 'betrayed', 'corrupt', 'drama', 'hypocrisy' and 'incompetent' will henceforth be considered unparliamentary in both Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha.

Over 5,400 pilgrims...

for Pahalgam at 4.25 am.

With this, a total of 93,987 pilgrims have left the Bhagwati Nagar base camp for the Valley since June 29, the day the first batch of pilgrims was flagged off by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha.

So far, over 1.52 lakh pilgrims had offered their prayers at the cave shrine, the officials said.

The pilgrimage is scheduled to end on August 11 on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan. Five pilgrims died of heart attack and two porters died after they fell into a gorge on Nunwan-Chandanwari track in Kashmir on Thursday, they said.

Court directs CB...

allegedly being involved in a theft case.

As the person seemed to be under the influence of drugs at the time of reporting at the Nowgam police station for examination in the case, his family was called who also confirmed that the person uses drugs habitually, the police had said in a statement. Considering these facts, within a couple of hours on the afternoon of the same day, Muneer was handed over to his family members with all legal formalities, they said. Later, it came to fore that he died in the evening at around 5 pm, they added.

Police have also ordered a formal inquiry into the matter and an official of the Nowgam police station, who the family members and relatives suspected of foul play, was placed under suspension for a fair and transparent inquiry.

Absence of democracy...

Modi during the closing ceremony of the centenary celebrations of the Bihar Legislative Assembly in Patna, NC MPs Mohammad Akbar Lone and Hasnain Masoodi said in a joint statement here.

"There is disquieting evidence everywhere in Jammu and Kashmir on the backsliding of democracy in Kashmir;" the two MPs said.

They said J-K was "missing out" on evolving democratic discourse referred to by the PM who has rightly said that in a democracy, legislative bodies have the role of echoing the wishes and aspirations of people.

"It was the same legislature that spearheaded the flight of J-K from feudalism to democracy. It was the same legislature that passed the legislations like land to tiller and abolished the feudal system.

"It was the same institution that had protected the pluralistic visage of Jammu and Kashmir and protected the cultural, linguistic, electoral, employment and land rights of the people of J-K. Having such a historic citadel disposed of is unthinkable," they added.

The MPs said having people of J-K "illogically and illegitimately" deprived of popular Government is a violation of constitutional guarantees.

"Air-dropped and unrelated bureaucrats could not be the substitute for a legitimate elected government. It is the people's government, and powerful legislature that can take on the existing challenges in the state. A remote controlled system cannot empathise with people's suffering, their aspirations.

"Denying 1.20 crore people their democratic rights is violative of the country's democratic setup and federalism," they said, demanding a "course correction".

India-China military...

the remaining friction points in eastern Ladakh, insisting that peace and tranquillity along the border are prerequisites for progress in overall bilateral ties.

"In continuation with the talks on disengagement along the LAC in eastern Ladakh, the 16th round of talks will be held on the Indian side at Chushul-Moldo meeting point on July 17," said a source.

The last round of talks between the Indian Army and the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) was held on March 11.

At the fresh round of talks, the Indian side is expected to press for disengagement of troops as soon as possible in all the remaining friction points besides seeking resolution of issues in Depsang Bulge and Demchok.

The situation in eastern Ladakh figured prominently in last week's talks between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi in Bali.

At the one-hour meeting on the sidelines of a conclave of foreign ministers of the G20 nations, Jaishankar had conveyed to Wang the need for early resolution of all the outstanding issues in eastern Ladakh. 'Recalling the disengagement achieved in some friction areas, the external affairs minister reiterated the need to sustain the momentum to complete disengagement from all the remaining areas to restore peace and tranquillity in the border areas," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a statement after the meeting. The Ladakh border standoff between the armies of India and China erupted on May 5, 2020, following a violent clash in the Pangong lake areas.

Both sides gradually enhanced their deployment by rushing in tens of thousands of soldiers as well as heavy weaponry.

As a result of a series of military and diplomatic talks, the two sides completed the disengagement process last year in the north and south banks of the Pangong lake and in the Gogra area. Each side currently has around 50,000 to 60,000 troops along the LAC in the sensitive mountainous sector.
