in south Kashmir's Anantnag district and 14-km shorter Baltal in central Kashmir's Ganderbal district.

A total of 5,838 pilgrims left Bhagwati Nagar Yatri Niwas here in a convoy of 223 vehicles amid heavy CRPF security, the officials said.

They said that 2,547 pilgrims heading for Baltal were the first to leave the Bhagwati Nagar camp in 97 vehicles around 3.20 am followed by the second convoy of 126 vehicles carrying 3,291 pilgrims for Pahalgam at 4.20 am.

With this, a total of 99,825 pilgrims have left the Bhagwati Nagar base camp for the Valley since June 29, the day the first batch of pilgrims was flagged off by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha.

So far, over 1.65 lakh pilgrims have offered prayers at the cave shrine, the officials said.

The pilgrimage is scheduled to end on August 11 on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan. A total of 25 people mostly pilgrims have died during the Amarnath yatra till now excluding 15, who died in the flash floods at the cave shrine.

parliamentary board in a meeting, attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other senior leaders, picked the 71-year-old Dhankhar after deliberating over several names, Nadda said.

After the announcement, Modi tweeted, "Jagdeep Dhankhar Ji has excellent knowledge of our Constitution. He is also well-versed with legislative affairs. I am sure that he will be an outstanding Chair in the Rajya Sabha & guide the proceedings of the House with the aim of furthering national progress."

Soon after his name was announced, Dhankhar tweeted, "Thank you Narendra Modi ji for nominating me as the Vice President candidate for the vice presidential election."

Since taking over as the West Bengal Governor in July 2019, Dhankhar has had several run-ins with the Mamata Banerjee government.

While his proactive conduct has drawn criticism from the state's ruling Trinamool Congress, the BJP has backed him.

Being a Jat, a backward community in Rajasthan, his elevation as vice president is likely to send helpful political message for the BJP as not many Jats besides former prime minister Charan Singh and former deputy prime minister Devi Lal have occupied high positions at the national level.

The BJP has had uneasy relations with Jats, a powerful agrarian community in Haryana, Rajasthan and western Uttar Pradesh, though the party has received their support in good numbers in the recent two Lok Sabha polls compared to assembly elections in these states.

BJP leaders noted that Dhankhar has been in public life for more than three decades, and his life story reflects the spirit of new India: 'overcoming innumerable social and economic hurdles and achieving one's goals'.

Nadda said Dhankhar established himself as a respected lawyer in the Rajasthan High Court and later in the Supreme Court before making a mark in politics. He was elected to Lok Sabha from Jhunjhunu in Rajasthan in 1989 and had served briefly as a Union minister in the government led by Chandrashekhar. He joined the BJP later.

His election as vice president is almost a certainty as the BJP has a majority in the electoral college comprising members of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. Out of Parliament's current strength of 780, the BJP alone has 394 MPs, more than the majority mark of 390.

The last date for filing of nomination papers for the poll is July 19 and the election is scheduled for August 6. Dhankhar has been a keen cricketer enthusiast and is follower of spirituality and meditation, those familiar with him said. He was also involved with the grant of OBC status for Jats in Rajasthan.

First batch of J&K Haj pilgrims returns

SRINAGAR: The first batch of 145 pilgrims from Jammu and Kashmir returned from the Haj pilgrimage in Saudi Arabia on Saturday, officials said.

The batch was received at the Srinagar international airport by Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir, P K Pole and other senior officials from police and civil administration, they said.

The 145 pilgrims -- 80 males and 65 females - returned in a flight that landed at the airport here at 7.50 am.

Over 6,000 pilgrims from J-K have gone on the annual pilgrimage this year. The Haj was resumed this year after a gap of two years due to COVID-19.

The last return flight carrying pilgrims from J-K will arrive here on August 2.

Absconder in theft cases arrested, two warrants executed

REASI: Continuing drive against absconders launched by District Police Reasi on the directions of Amit Gupta, Senior Superintendent of Police, Reasi Police on Saturday arrested one absconder from Khawas area of Budhal Rajouri.

As per the details, a team of Police Station Pouni led by Insp. Vijay Sharma SHO Pouni under the supervision of DySP Headquarters Iftkhar Ahmed arrested an absconder namely Mohd Shakeel, son of Bagh Hussain, resident of Keri Tehsil Khawas who was involved in theft case FIR No 48/2018 under section 379/RPC and 49/2018 under sections 379 RPC of Police Station Pouni . Cases were proved during investigation and chargesheeted against the accused. To avoid conviction accused evaded trial proceedings and couldn't be apprehended. In both cases two General Warrants Of Arrest under section 512 CrPC were issued against him, by Court of JMJC Reasi. Today after developing specific information about presence of accused in Khawas Police team was sent to Khawas Budhal and absconder got arrested with the help of local Police. Two notorious criminals booked under PSA

JAMMU: Police on Saturday booked two

notorious criminals under Public Safety Act.

As per the details, two notorious criminals namely Abhineet Singh alias Nagi alias Abhi, son of Vikram Singh, resident of Sunderpur RS Pura and Davinder Kumar alias Rahul, son of Darshan Lal, resident of Chak Mohd Yar RS Pura were arrested under Public Safety Act by Police Station RS Pura.

Jammu Police was looking for the above mentioned accused persons, finally local intelligence was generated and on a tip off, dedicated police teams of Police Station RS Pura constituted under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh and led by SHO RS Pura Insp. Rajesh Sharma did strenuous efforts and raided the suspected location arrested both the accused.

It is pertinent to mention that both the accused were notorious criminals of desperate character and were involved in many heinous criminal cases like attempt to murder, snatching. Many FIRs were also lodged against them in this regard. Thus, warrants of arrest under Public Safety Act were issued against both accused. Covid: 13 new cases in Ladakh

According to report from Leh, Ladakh has reported 13 fresh Covid cases that pushed the infection tally to 28,615, officials said.

All the new cases were recorded in Leh, they said

So far, 228 people have succumbed to COVID-19 in Ladakh. Of these, 168 deaths were reported from Leh and 60 from Kargil, according to officials.

The number of active cases stands at 61 -- all in Leh, they said.

A total of 639 sample reports were tested in Ladakh of which 579 in Leh and 46 in Kargil were found to be negative, officials said.

Eleven people were discharged from hospital in Leh, taking the overall recoveries to 28,326, officials said.

As many as 2,326 passengers were screened at the Leh airport, 489 passengers, including drivers and helpers of trucks and light motor vehicles, were screened at Khaltse, and 278 were screened at Upshi check post on highway, they added.

ITBP Jawan shoots...

Singh shot at his colleagues, leading to bullet injuries to a head constable and two constables, a senior ITBP officer said.

The injured have been admitted to a hospital, and are out of danger; he said.

Singh later shot himself from his INSAS service rifle and he died on the spot, the officer said.

The jawan belonged to the 8th battalion of the force and was presently deputed to the 'F' company of the 2nd ad-hoc battalion of the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) deployed in Jammu and Kashmir for security duties.

Preliminary inputs suggest some altercation took place between the jawans, but the exact cause that led to the incident is still being probed, the official said.

A court of inquiry has been ordered by the border guarding force, he said.

The ITBP is primarily tasked to guard the 3,488 km-long Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China apart from rendering a variety of roles in the internal security domain of the country.

The incident comes a day after an Army jawan shot himself fatally after killing another colleague and injuring two others in Poonch district of the Union territory.

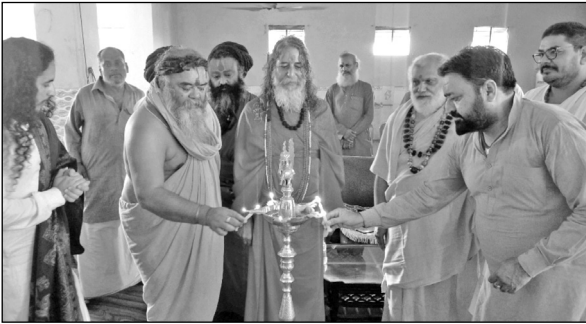
