### MPs, MLAs to...

vote, every elector can mark as many preferences as there are candidates contesting the election. These preferences for the candidates are to be marked by the elector, by placing the figures 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and so on, against the names of the candidates, in the order of preference, in the space provided in column 2 of the ballot paper. This is the reason why electronic voting machines are not used in this as well as vice presidential, Rajya Sabha and legislative council polls. The EVMs are based on a technology where they work as aggregator of votes in direct elections such as the Lok Sabha and state assemblies.

According to Election Commission's directions, while MPs will get a green-coloured ballot paper; the MLAs will get a pink ballot paper to cast vote. Separate colours help the returning officer ascertain the value of vote of each MLA and MP.

Seeking to maintain secrecy of voting, the EC has issued a specially designed pen with violet ink to enable voters mark their ballot papers in the presidential poll.

Providing district-wise breakup for positive cases during the past 24 hours, the Bulletin informed that Jammu reported 91 cases, Srinagar 64, Baramulla 12, Udhampur 10, Ganderbal 06, Kathua and Anantnag 04 cases each, Budgam, Poonch and Kupwara 03 cases each, Pulwama 02, Kupwara, Doda, Samba and Reasi reported one case each while as no other district across the Union Territory reported any fresh case.

Meanwhile, Ladakh has reported 14 new COVID-19 cases, raising its tally to 28,629, officials said.

All the positive cases were recorded from Leh district, they added.

So far, 228 people have succumbed to COVID-19 in Ladakh. Of these, 168 deaths were reported from Leh and 60 from Kargil, the officials said.

They said the number of active cases has risen to 68 in the union territory -- all in Leh. Seven more people were cured of the disease, the officials said, adding the total number of recoveries stands at 28,333.

As many as 2,371 passengers were screened at the Leh airport, 579 people, including the drivers and helpers of trucks, and light motor vehicles, at Khaltse, 179 at Upshi check-point for the virus, the officials said.

of the talks. The 15th round of the military dialogue took place on March 11 but it failed to yield any significant outcome, with both sides, in a joint statement, reaffirming that resolution of the issues would help restore peace and tranquillity in the region and facilitate progress in bilateral relations.

The Indian side pressed for disengagement of troops as soon as possible in all the remaining friction points, the people cited above said.

It is learnt that the Indian delegation also sought resolution of pending issues in Depsang Bulge and Demchok.

India has been consistently maintaining that peace and tranquillity along the LAC were key for the overall development of bilateral ties.

The situation in eastern Ladakh figured prominently in talks between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi in Bali on July 7.

At the one-hour meeting on the sidelines of a conclave of foreign ministers of the G20 nations, Jaishankar conveyed to Wang the need for early resolution of all the outstanding issues in eastern Ladakh.

"Recalling the disengagement achieved in some friction areas, the external affairs

minister reiterated the need to sustain the momentum to complete disengagement from all the remaining areas to restore peace and tranquillity in the border areas," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a statement after the meeting.

The MEA further said Jaishankar "reaffirmed the importance of fully abiding by bilateral agreements and protocols, and the understandings reached between the two ministers during their previous conversations."

constituencies following fresh delimitation.

The officials said the district election officers have been holding meetings with the representatives of political parties in every district.

Discussions have taken place with these representatives of political parties on the post-delimitation exercises, including rationalisation of polling stations, list of draft polling stations after formation of new constituencies, addition and deletion of voters in the list, they said.

After this process is completed, the officials said, the booth-level officers (BLOs) would be trained and sensitised regarding the post-delimitation exercise.

Meanwhile, a workshop on first-level checking (FLC) of EVMs and VVPATs will be held at SKICC here on July 27, in which the district election officers and deputy district election officers of all the 10 districts of the valley will be participating.

A team of officers from the Election Commission of India, including Director EVMs, S Sunder Rajan, Secretary Madhusudan Gupta and Under Secretary 0 P Sahani, besides, representatives from Electronics Corporation of India Ltd, including Deputy General Manager P C Mandal, Technical Officer C V Dinesh Datta and Officer C Venkanna, are also participating in the workshop, the officials said.

The preparations for the polls also come amid statements by the Centre as well as the UT administration on the conduct of the polls.

Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on June 17 had said there is a possibility of holding the polls by this year-end .

Earlier this month, J-K LG Manoj Sinha said the elections will surely take place after the completion of the electoral roll revision.

The prime minister and the country's home minister have said it many times in Parliament that elections (in Jammu and Kashmir) will take place. The process of delimitation in the union territory has been completed and the electoral roll revision started. After this, there will surely be elections, Sinha had said at a function here.

Political parties in the union territory have also been demanding early assembly elections. While some of them have started preparations for the polls, the regional forces -- the National Conference (NC) and the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) - - have been saying the preparations will start once the elections are announced.

However, both the parties have shown interest in contesting the polls together as part of the People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD) formed in October 2020.

The PAGD, comprising five J-K parties -- NC, PDP, CPI(M), CPI and ANC -- was formed with a stated aim of restoring Article 370 which was scrapped on by the Centre on August 5, 2019. The Centre had also bifurcated the erstwhile state into UTs -- Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh.

Article 370 of the Constitution gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir, The PAGD is headed by NC president Farooq Abdullah. We will contest the elections together, Abdullah had told reporters here recently. Similar sentiments were expressed by PDP president Mehbooba Mufti. "We intend to contest the elections together as it is the will of the people that we should strive together for the restoration of our lost dignity," she has said.

### 5,284 pilgrims leave...

convoy of 225 vehicles amid heavy security of CRPF, the officials said.

They said that 1,743 pilgrims heading for Baltal were the first to leave in 87 vehicles around 3.20 am, followed by the second convoy of 138 vehicles carrying 3,541 pilgrims for Pahalgam at 4.20 am.

The annual 43-day yatra commenced on June 30 from the twin base camps -- traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag and 14-km shorter route from Baltal in central Kashmir's Ganderbal.

So far, over 1.65 lakh pilgrims had offered their prayers at the cave shrine, housing the naturally formed ice-shivlingam, the officials said.

With this, a total of 1,05,109 pilgrims have left from the Bhagvati Nagar base camp for the Valley since June 29, the day the first batch of pilgrims was flagged off by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha. The yatra is scheduled to end on August 11 on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan. A total of 30 people mostly pilgrims have died during the on-going yatra till now excluding 15 pilgrims, who died in the flashfloods at Amarnath cave shrine on July 1.

have to seek approvals from the higher ups to serve the cause of citizens. The minister emphasised that young officers in charge of districts or tehsils or any department must ensure "that no citizen who needs your intervention or support is turned away from your office empty handed", according to the statement.

The minister was addressing the IAS officers of 2020 batch here, who are undergoing three-month stint as assistant secretaries in central government departments before moving to their respective state cadres.

Singh reminded the young officers of their destined role in 2047 when India celebrates 100 years of independence.

"With age on their side, only they have will have that opportunity and privilege," he said.

Singh said, in order to make the government citizen-centric, it is important that we use technology to bring in meaningful exchanges and definite improvements in national governance.

He said as the expectations and aspirations of citizens from the administration and governance are on the rise, information technology, internet, mobile technology, artificial intelligence, machine learning etc. can bring dramatic changes in the lives of the people and they can help the administration to establish a direct contact with the people.

Singh said he was informed that this batch of 175 officers has 108 officers with engineering background and many officers with background in medicine, management, law and arts have also joined.

He emphasised that it would be very much admirable if they utilise their educational background to showcase how the ministries/departments can innovate, use new ideas and deliver high quality outputs directly to citizen with complete elimination of middlemen and leakages.

The minister also hoped that the technocrats will be able to do justice to the flagship programmes of the government in sectors like health, agriculture, sanitation, education, skills and mobility to name a few, which are technology-based and technology-driven.

He said the required improvement in citizen services and speedy resolution of grievances related to them can be brought about by utilising technology in an effective manner.

Singh said today's citizen aspires to have a voice in the processes of policy formulation and policy implementation.

He noted that the initiative of mandatory stint of assistant secretaries with the central ministries/departments was a huge experiment introduced at the behest of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2015 and said that it has paid off extremely well to the benefit of the government of India.

The minister said the assistant secretaries are expected to give their inputs for improvement in various flagship programmes in different ministries/ departments of government of India.

This not only gives them an opportunity to demonstrate their skill and talent but also an opportunity to make a presentation before the Prime Minister of India, which is an opportunity that might have eluded their senior batches, the statement said.

Singh summed that like other years, the officers posted as assistant secretaries for the 2020 batch are being given the opportunity to contribute to the major programmes of the government of India as they are getting posted to different ministries and are being allocated work relating to the flagship programme.

He said the officers will be required to give suggestions and ideas to improve the delivery of these programmes both qualitatively and quantitatively.

During this period, "your special focus should be on the states and districts where implementation of these programmes is slow to take off", the minister added.

Singh urged the officers to examine the status of the programmes, ideas and suggestions that were initiated by the 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 batches of assistant secretaries and ensure that their ideas and suggestions are also taken to the logical conclusion.

He said through this programme, officers are getting an awesome opportunity to gain insight into policy making with the senior most and most experienced officers at the beginning of the career, which is going to be very useful, relevant and enlightening for all of the officers.

the house in Rajya Sabha Piyush Goyal and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi.

"Today, in the all-party meeting, many political parties, including those supporting NDA, pointed out the contradiction in the Modi government claiming credit for its presidential candidate on the one hand and killing off the Forest Rights Act, 2006 on the other hand,' Congress' Jairam Ramesh tweeted after the meeting.

He earlier raised strong objections over the absence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi from the all-party meeting to discuss issues that will come up in Parliament.

Indian Union Muslim League leader E T Mohammed Basheer said every opposition party raised the issue of Agnipath, price rise and the row over the words listed in a new booklet by the Lok Sabha Secretariat that will be considered 'unparliamentary'.

BJD leader Pinaki Misra came out in support of Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla over the issue, saying he was 'unfairly targeted' as listing out such words has been a routine practice in Parliament.

The BJD leader also pressed for the passage of the women's reservation bill besides demanding a legislative council for Odisha, where the party is in power for many years now.

"It is high time we insisted that government should bring the women's reservation bill," said All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam leader M Thambidurai.

DMK's T R Baalu and AIADMK's Thambidurai also raised the Sri Lankan crisis and said India should intervene to settle the issue.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi, however, hit out at the opposition and accused them of belittling Parliament by making issues out of non-issues.

He said the opposition is doing so as it had nothing against the government and the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi was being recognised within the country as well as abroad.

Condemning the Opposition for creating a row over unparliamentary words and circulars issued in routine for the past several years, he said such a practice is being carried on since 1954, when the first such list was brought out, and the opposition was doing so as it was devoid of any issues against the government.

Joshi claimed the government was 'doing good work' and the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi was recognised not just by people within India but also those abroad.

"The Opposition is trying to make issues out of non-issues as they do not have anything against the Government... It is trying to belittle the image of Parliament," he said on the row over unparliamentary words.

"Actually there is no major issue against the government as it is functioning well under PM Modi's leadership and it is being hailed in may elections," he said.

Joshi said presiding officers in previous years also released such a list of unparliamentary words, but the Opposition did not raise it then. He said the words are expunged on the demands made in Parliament and the Chair takes the final call.

"No word has been barred from use in Parliament and the Lok Sabha Secretariat has been bringing out such a list of unparliamentary words since 1954," Joshi also said, adding that it is the Lok Sabha Secretariat and not the government that brings out such a list.

Similarly, he said a normal circular was issued by Rajya Sabha Secretariat on not holding any dharnas and protests in Parliament, but the Opposition raised it as if it is something new.

Such circulars are issued ahead of every session, he said.

On criticism over the absence of the prime minister from the meeting, he said Congress leader Jairam Ramesh raised the issue.

"The prime minister never attended all-party meetings before 2014 when the Congress was in power.

"It was his good gesture to do this from 2014. They are trying to make an issue that is a non-issue. Our senior colleague Rajnath Singh and deputy leader of the house chaired the meeting," he said.

"We are open to discussion on all issues under the rules and procedures of parliament," Joshi said when asked about the opposition demand on the Agnipath scheme.

He also stated that the government would hold an all-party meeting on the Sri Lanka situation on Tuesday which will be chaired by Union ministers Nirmala Sitharaman and S Jaishankar.

### 32 bills indicated...

"We have listed 32 bills so that they (opposition) are also prepared and therefore we are giving notice in advance.

"All we are saying is that 14 bills are ready and we can consider even more. More importantly, we believe in democratically discussing all the bills. We believe in democracy and we are open for discussions on all matters," he added.

According to official documents, the bills listed by the government for the upcoming Parliament session include the Multi-State Cooperative Societies (Amendment) Bill, which seeks to rationalise the government's role in cooperatives and increase participation in the working of multi-state cooperative societies, to increase public faith in them and create a conducive environment for their growth and development.

The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Amendment) Bill seeks to strengthen the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code by introducing provisions on cross-border insolvency and certain other amendments for a time-bound resolution of stressed assets while maximising their value.

Two separate bills for Constitution amendment to revise the list of Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs) for Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu are also listed for introduction.

The 'Press and Registration of Periodicals Bill' seeks to replace the 155-year-old 'Press and Registration of Books Act' with a simplified version that decriminalises various provisions and brings digital media under its ambit.

The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains (Amendment) Bill seeks to provide more teeth to the Archeological Survey of India (ASI) and amend a law dealing with ancient monuments. It is also aimed at rationalising prohibited areas and other amendments.

The most significant aspect of the bill is that it will replace the provision which allows a 100-metre prohibited area for construction activity around centrally-protected monuments with site-specific limits to be decided by an expert committee.

Another bill listed during the session is the Kalakshetra Foundation (Amendment) Bill, 2022, which seeks to amend the Kalakshetra Foundation Act, 1993 to empower the Kalakshetra Foundation to award certificates; diplomas; post-graduate diplomas; degrees to graduate and post-graduate; doctoral and post-doctoral courses; and conduct research in the areas of dance, traditional theatre, drama, Carnatic and traditional music, visual arts, craft education and art education.

The Family Courts (Amendment) and Indian Antarctic bills are listed to be taken up in Lok Sabha on Monday, while the Weapons of Mass Destruction and their Delivery Systems (Prohibition of Unlawful Activities) Amendment Bill is listed for consideration and passing on the same day in Rajya Sabha.

Also, the Trafficking of Persons (Protection, Care and Rehabilitation) Bill, 2022 seeks to prevent and combat trafficking, especially of women and children. It also seeks to provide for care, protection, assistance and rehabilitation to the victims, while respecting their rights, and creating a supportive legal, economic and social environment for them, and ensuring the prosecution of offenders.

According to the draft bill, a person found guilty of trafficking can be imprisoned for a term not less than seven years that may extend to 10 years.

The convict shall also be liable to a fine not less than Rs 1 lakh that may extend up to Rs 5 lakh. Severe punishment has been proposed for offences classified as aggravated forms of trafficking.

Several anti-human trafficking activists and NGOs have been pushing for the early passage of the bill in Parliament.

The Cantonment Bill 2022 is expected to bring in measures to ensure that the civilian population living within the cantonments does not face any difficulties. It seeks to enhance efficiency in running cantonments across the country.

At present, 62 cantonments are operating across the country and most of them have a civil-military mix in their demography. The administration of the cantonments comes under the authority of the Ministry of Defence.

### India crosses 200...

achievement," Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya said in a tweet.

"Powered by the spirit of Jan-Bhagidari, India's vaccination journey under PM @NarendraModi Ji's inspiring leadership has emerged as a mighty epitome of Sabka Prayas," he said, adding that this extraordinary achievement will be etched in history .

According to provisional reports, a total of 2,00,00,15,631 doses had been administered across the country.

The top five states where highest number of doses have been administered are Uttar Pradesh (34,42,69,865), Maharashtra (17,05,70,069), West Bengal (14,40,95,285), Bihar (13,98,78,169) and Madhya Pradesh (12,13,21,534).

The health ministry said 98 per cent of India's adult population has received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine while 90 per cent have been fully vaccinated.

"India creates history again! Congrats to all Indians on crossing the special figure of 200 crore vaccine doses. Proud of those who contributed to making India's vaccination drive unparalleled in scale and speed. This has strengthened the global fight against COVID-19," Prime Minister Modi said.

According to government data, 82 per cent of adolescents aged 15 to 18 years have also been vaccinated with the first dose since the vaccination for this age group began on January 3 while 68 pc have got both the first and second dose.

Eighty one per cent of those aged 12-14 years have taken the first dose while 56 pc are fully vaccinated.
