Lifting concession for senior citizens in Indian Railways unfortunate: Congress Decision should be rolled back: Bhalla

JAMMU: Reacting over the recent address of the Indian railways minister Ashwani Vaishnav's in the Lok Sabha, that there will be no railway concession for senior citizens in 2022, PCC Working President Raman Bhalla termed it unfortunate and reflects the mindset of Modi Govt. towards Senior Citizens. As per Minister's statement this exemption from concession was lifted amid the pandemic for some time, but is now back in effect, and will remain so until told otherwise.

Bhalla said that UPA Govt. had granted many concessions for senior citizens including railway fare etc. He said the loss to the railways is due to the wrong policies of the Modi Govt. and the senior citizens should not be made scapegoat for the wrongs of the Govt. This decision should be rolled back in the larger interest of the old age people who undertake journey for pilgrimage purpose in their last days of life, especially those who are poor and cannot afford expenses.


against BJP and its policies towards the union territory.

More steps required to check unabated illegal mining in Valley

SRINAGAR: Over the years, unabated mining has become a major environmental issue in the valley, which has a direct bearing on losses in Union Territory. Many experts are of the opinion that illegal mining results in massive revenue loss to public exchequer. Acting tough against elements involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, Police in Budgam has arrested 4 persons and seized 4 vehicles involved in commission of crime.

As per details, on July 22, 2022 officers from Police Station Khan Saheb arrested 4 persons and seized 4 vehicles (a JCB and 3 tipplers) for their involvement in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals from Govt land at Khatresh Wadur, Khan Saheb. Earlier on June 9, police arrested four persons in Rudburgh Budgam for illegal mining. Locals from Shopian district are quite worried over the menace. They said, "Many irrigation canals and water channels crisscrossing apple-rich belt of Shopian and

Kulgam are drying-up due to illegal and unabated mining of rivers". Hundreds of truckloads of minor minerals are sold by miners and most of them do not have even a license or had paid any fee. Unregulated mining of sand has also caused environmental problems in many areas. The government must come up with a proper policy on extraction of minor minerals and ensure that licenses are granted only on basis of merit.

All vehicles ferrying mineral illegally extracted or obtained must be seized by the law enforcement wings. Govt and concerned authorities need to expedite efforts to curb illegal mining activities in UT especially Valley. Pertinent to mention here that according to Section 4.3 of Jammu and Kashmir Minor Mineral Concession, Storage, Transportation of Minerals and Prevention of Illegal Mining Rules 2016, mining is forbidden in riverbeds 'below the depth of 3 mts or water level, whichever lesser.'
