### My election proof...

who was born in a Santhal family, said she grew up in a small tribal village where even getting primary education was a dream and went on to become the first person in the village to enroll for college education.

"It is a matter of great satisfaction for me that those who have been deprived for centuries and those who have been denied the benefits of development, those poor, downtrodden, backwards and tribals are seeing their reflection in me," she said.

Murmu said her election as president has the blessings of the poor of the country and reflected the dreams and potential of crores of women and daughters of the country.

She paid tribute to India's freedom fighters, and said the country will have to move quickly on the twin tracks of sabka prayas' (everyone's effort) and sabka kartavya' (everyone's duty) to fulfil their expectations.

Noting that she was the first president to be born after Independence, Murmu said it was her good fortune that she has assumed the position at a time when the country is celebrating 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' to mark the 75th anniversary of its freedom.

"In our country full of diversities, we are engaged in the making of 'Ek Bharat - Shreshtha Bharat' by adopting many languages, religions, sects, food habits, lifestyles and customs.

She highlighted the role of India's ancient traditions in dovetailing growth and environment preservation.

"I was born in that tribal tradition which has lived in harmony with nature for thousands of years. I have realized the importance of forests and water bodies in my life," Murmu, who also worked as a teacher decades ago, said.

"We take necessary resources from nature and serve nature with equal reverence. This sensitivity has become a global imperative today."

Murmu, who started public life as a councillor and was former Jharkhand governor, said she wanted to reassure all Indians, particularly the youth and women, that their interests will be supreme for her as president.

The Prime Minister described Murmu assuming the office of President as a watershed moment .

"In her address after taking oath, President Droupadi Murmu Ji gave a message of hope and compassion. She emphasised on India's accomplishments and presented a futuristic vision of the path ahead at a time when India is marking Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav," Modi said.

"The entire nation watched with pride as Smt. Droupadi Murmu Ji took oath as the President of India. Her assuming the Presidency is a watershed moment for India especially for the poor, marginalised and downtrodden. I wish her the very best for a fruitful Presidential tenure," he added.

Congress leader and Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot was also fulsome in his praise.

"We participated in her oath-taking ceremony. Her views were nice. Every word in her speech had a meaning. I am very impressed," the opposition leader told reporters.

The day, which started with outgoing president Kovind and Murmu arriving in a procession from the Rashtrapati Bhavan to the Parliament Building, was edged with ceremony and celebration.

After the short ceremony, Murmu and Kovind were escorted out of the Central Hall amid the roll of drums and blowing of trumpets.

There was a national salute by the President's Bodyguard at Gate No 5 of Parliament. The new president and her predecessor left in a ceremonial procession back to the Rashtrapati Bhavan.

In keeping with the occasion, caparisoned horses, and men in white lined the route from Parliament up Raisina Hill to the British era presidential palace as the presidential convoy made its way.

As monsoon clouds framed the dome of the Rashtrapati Bhavan, the new commander in chief of the armed forces inspected a tri-services guard of honour in the forecourt.

Former president Kovind and his family, who move to a bungalow in Lutyens Delhi, were given a formal send-off by the Prime Minister and other dignitaries as well as the Rashtrapati Bhavan staff.

Catapulted into the presidential spotlight, the unassuming Murmu is believed to be deeply spiritual and a keen practitioner of the meditation techniques of the Brahma Kumaris, a movement she embraced after she lost her husband, two sons, mother and brother in the just six years between 2009-2015.

Her daughter Itishree works in a bank in Odisha.

Her first steps in politics were taken in Rairangpur where she was elected as BJP councillor in the Rairangpur Notified Area Council in 1997. She rose to being a minister in Odisha's BJD-BJP coalition government from 2000 to 2004. In 2015, she was appointed governor of Jharkhand and stayed in the post till 2021.

In tribute to her remarkable journey through personal tragedies and triumphs, there was music and dance in several places, including Ranchi, Chikmagalur and Bhubaneswar.

The oath-taking ceremony was marked by pomp and grandeur, and began with the arrival of outgoing President Ram Nath Kovind and Murmu in a procession from the Rashtrapati Bhavan to the Parliament Building.

After the short ceremony, Murmu and Kovind were escorted out of the Central Hall amid the roll of drums and blowing of trumpets.

There are 3,379 active cases of the disease in the Union territory at present, while the number of recoveries has reached 4,52,416, they said.

Meanwhile, Ladakh has reported 19 fresh cases of COVID-19, raising its tally to 28,769, officials said.

All the cases were reported from Leh district, they said.

So far, 228 people have succumbed to COVID-19 in Ladakh. Of these, 168 deaths were reported from Leh and 60 from Kargil, the officials said.

They said the number of active COVID-19 cases has gone up to 134 in Ladakh - 128 in Leh and six in Kargil.

While 292 samples were tested in Ladakh, 217 sample reports in Leh and 54 in Kargil were found to be negative, they said.

Six people were discharged from hospital in Leh, they said, adding the total number of recoveries stands at 28,407.

Police, along with an SDRF team, rescued 12 persons, including women, from sudden flood in Ujh river; Kathua Senior Superintendent of Police Ramesh Kotwal said.

In another such incident, nine policemen were trapped when flash floods entered a police post in Chakan-da-bagh area on the Line of Control in Poonch district, the officials said.

The floods were caused due the cloudburst and policemen took shelter on rooftop of police post, they said.

Police teams rushed to the area and rescued the cops from flooded police post, they said. At least three trucks got damaged due to shooting stones near Bufliyaz area on the Mughal Road, they said, adding that there was no casualty in the incident.

It is really surprising that how these anti-social elements, without any fear of law, are carrying out such illegal and anti-nature activities, quite under the nose of the administration without any fear in nexus with the mining department.

There is of course some political patronage or support behind this menace, as without that it is not possible to ruin the natural resources continuously without any check. STATE TIMES is in possession of a letter written by one Sahil Choudhary, a Lease Holder, addressed to the Director, Geology & Mining Department Jammu, wherein specifically mentioning names of 16 stone-crushers located in Bajalta area of district Jammu, he has alleged that the units are indulged in illegal mining. He has categorically mentioned that without having any permission or lease, the units are extracting minor minerals since long from nearby water-bodies, especially during night hours and has sought necessary action against them as per law.

**As per letter, the stone-crushers which are carrying out illegal mining included Harman Stone Crusher, Public Stone Crusher, Khatana Stone Crusher, Northern Stone Crusher, TRB Stone Crusher, Surya Stone Crusher, Motel Stone Crusher, Tawi Stone Crusher, Friends Stone Crusher, Radhey Krishna Stone Crusher, Sharma Stone Crusher, Jupiter Stone Crusher, Taj Stone Crusher, Chaman Stone Crusher, TBA Stone Crusher and Chadak Stone Crusher, operational in various areas of Bajalta.**

Now, the million-dollar question is will the department take any cognizance over the complaint and initiate steps to investigate the matter for booking these units, if allegations are found true or will continue its deep slumber, with the letter resting in one of its files?

The order further reads that Mission Director, National Health Mission J&K is also nominated as Mission Director Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission J&K, while as Dr Shafqat Khan, Officer on Special Duty (OSD) in Health & Medical Education Department has been nominated as "Additional Mission Director, Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission J&K" in addition to his duties as Sectoral Expert and Overall Incharge for strategizing and on boarding of Public Services through online platforms. The order also reads that Additional Mission Director shall provide necessary support for seamless implementation of Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission in UT of J&K in a time bound manner and assist Mission Director, Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) J&K in implementation of the Mission.

"The Mission Directorate, ABDM shall establish a State/UT team to enable effective implementation of the day-to-day operations of Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission as per the guidelines of the Mission", the order also reads.

"The efficacy of the instant set up shall be reviewed on quarterly basis by the Administrative Department to further streamline the logistics to carry out operations of the ABDM to meet the laid down objectives in a time bound manner", it adds.

The agency came to know through its source that Boora discussed with Bandgar how the latter's purported connection with high-ranking officials who play "pivotal roles" in appointments be exploited to get the work done.

It surfaced that the accused were attempting to cheat people in the name of assuring them of candidature for Rajya Sabha against huge consideration to the tune of Rs 100 crores, the FIR alleged.

### Amarnath Yatra: 3,800 pilgrims leave Jammu for cave shrine

JAMMU: The 25th batch of over 3,800 Amarnath pilgrims left the base camp in Jammu for the twin base camps of the 3,880-metre-high Amarnath cave shrine in south Kashmir Himalayas on Monday, officials said.

A total of 3,862 pilgrims left Bhagwati Nagar Yatri Niwas here in a convoy of 125 vehicles amid heavy security of the Central Reserve Police Force this morning, the officials said.

They said 1,835 pilgrims heading for Baltal were the first to leave the Bhagwati Nagar camp in 46 vehicles, followed by the second convoy of 79 vehicles carrying 2,027 pilgrims for Pahalgam.

The annual 43-day yatra commenced from the twin base camps -- traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag and 14-km shorter Baltal in central K a s h m i r ' s Ganderbal -- on June 30.

Over 2.25 lakh

pilgrims have offered prayers at the cave shrine, housing the naturally formed ice-shivlingam, the officials said.

With this, 135,585 pilgrims have left from the Bhagwati Nagar base camp for the Valley since June 29, the day the first batch of pilgrims was flagged off by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha.

The yatra is scheduled to end on August 11 on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan.

Thirty six pilgrims have died during the yatra so far and another 15 pilgrims died in the flashfloods near the Amarnath cave shrine on July 1.
