India commemorates Kargil...

forever remain etched as a defining moment in India's history.

"On Kargil Vijay Divas, India salutes the bravery, courage and sacrifice of our armed forces. They fought valiantly in extremely harsh conditions to defend our motherland. Their act of valour & indomitable spirit will remain etched forever as a defining moment in India's history," he tweeted.

Pakistan tried to redraw the boundary with India in 1999 through the Kargil misadventure but the Indian security forces foiled the evil design.

To mark the day, Singh, Chief of the Army Staff General Manoj Pande, Chief of the Naval Staff Admiral R Hari Kumar and Chief of the Air Staff Air Chief Marshal V R Chaudhari laid a wreath at the National War Memorial in the memory of the fallen heroes.

"During the Kargil conflict, the gallant soldiers of the Indian Army, with the help of the Indian Air Force, overcame insurmountable odds, hostile terrain and inclement weather to win against the enemy that had occupied dominating heights," the defence ministry said.

The Army said Kargil Vijay Divas is a reminiscence of the "undaunted bravery and courage" of the "bravehearts" who inscribed a golden chapter in history with their blood and sacrifice.

"They gave a befitting reply to enemy's misadventure and a resounding victory to India," it said.

Over 500 soldiers laid down their lives in the conflict.

Events to mark the success of Operation Vijay' were held at Northern Command in Udhampur; Tiger division in Jammu, and other formations in Rajouri, Poonch, and Doda.

A wreath laying ceremony was held at War Memorial, Northern Command Headquarter. The day saw top Army officers, joined by the JCOs and soldiers, paying rich tributes to those martyred in the war; a defence spokesperson said.

Major General K Vinod Kumar laid a wreath in the morning at Dhruv War Memorial at Northern Command headquarter; the official said. In remembrance of supreme sacrifices of soldiers during Kargil war, the Tiger division organised the Kargil Vijay Divas celebrations at Tiger War Memorial' and Balidan Stambh in Jammu, today, the spokesper-son said. Major General Neeraj Gosain, GOC, Tiger division, and all ranks of the Tiger division paid their tributes.

Lt Col Rishma Sarin, wife of Major Mohit Sharma, also paid tributes to the war mar-tyrs. Brigadier Manpervesh Herr; Commander Shivalik Brigade, placed a wreath at Balidan stambh in Jammu. A large number of veterans and Jammu residents were also present on the occasion to remember the Kargil war heroes. A 10km-marathon was organised by prominent citizens of Jammu to express their gratitude to the gallant sol-diers, the spokesperson said.

The run culminated at Balidan stambh, with runners carrying the national flag and raising slogans for soldiers, he said.

Col Virender Kumar Sahi, VrC, Col Sham Lal, Captain Shamsher Singh, Havaldar Harbans Lal, and Havaldar Bachan Singh, who took part in the Kargil War gave chilling accounts of their experiences during the event.

Meanwhile, soliders were remembered for their courage during the war waged along the Line of Control in Kargil area of Ladakh Union Territory.

To commemorate the 23rd Kargil Vijay Divas', a host of events were organised under the aegis of Northern Command, culminating into the final event on 26th July 2022," he said.

Feroz Ahmed Khan, Chief Executive Councillor Kargil, was the chief guest and Lt Gen Upendra Dwivedi, GOC-in-C, Northern Command was the chief host for Tuesday's event, the spokesperson said.

The events included two cycle rallies, one of which was carried out from Siachen to Kargil War Memorial, and another from Delhi to Drass - both held under a joint initia-tive by Indian Air Force and Indian Army, the spokesperson said.

Two motorcycle expeditions -- one flagged off by the Vice Chief of Army Staff from Delhi to Drass, and the other from Turtuk to Drass, an ultra-marathon run by Suffya from Siachen to Drass, and a mountain expedition by Bachendri Pal and team, which traversed 37 passes from Arunachal Pradesh to reach Drass, were also part of events this year.

Kargil Victory Flame was moved through the entire area of Northern Command final-ly reaching Dras. These events culminated at Kargil War Memorial paving way to a grand ceremony, with multiple cultural and ceremonial programmes, he said.

The events were followed by laying of wreaths by Air Marshal Shreekumar Prabhakaran, AOC-in-C, Western Air Command, Lt Gen Upendra Dwivedi, Lt Gen Anindya Sen Gupta, GOC 14 Corps, and other military dignitaries.

The Kargil Victory Flame was received at Kargil War Memorial by Air Marshal Prabhakaran, Lt Gen Dwivedi, Col Sonam Wangechuk, Brig Mohit Saxena, and Col Praveen Tomar, all being the awardees of Kargil War, the spokesperson said.

A team of Sikh soldiers performed Gatka', a martial arts form with roots in Punjab. The team was part of a battalion that had taken active part in the 1999 War.

It had come all the way from Andaman and Nicobar Islands to be a part of the event. Commemoration of the Kargil War is not merely a revisit to the war account but show-casing of the indomitable spirit, unflinching dedication and selfless service displayed by soldiers. Each story of the war is a saga of honour; courage and sacrifice which is an exam-ple to the youth of the entire nation to emulate and strive to make this nation stronger. It is also about sharing with the nation and world at large as to what being a soldier means," the Army statement said.

Police encounters: 9-fold...

and the number has gone up to 151 in 2021-22.

According to the data tabled in Lok Sabha, there were just five police encounters in Jammu and Kashmir in 2020-21 and such cases have been increased to 45 in 2021-22.

Uttar Pradesh and Madihya Pradesh had 16 and six encounters in 2020-21 respective-ly, and numbers have come down in 2021-22 with the former registering 11 cases and the latter recording just two such cases, according to data.

There were just four police encounters in Assam in 2020-21 and the number has gone up to 18 in 2021-22, the data says.

Among other states, there were 24 police encounters in Chhattisgarh in 2020-21 and the number has risen to 30 in 2021-22.

Similarly, in Jharkhand, there were five encounters in 2020-21 and number has increased to nine in 2021-22, the data showed.

SIA files charge-sheet...

The case pertains to the seizure of Rs 43 lakhs by the Jammu police at Sidhra bridge from three persons travelling in a passenger taxi towards Kashmir on November 16, 2021.

The original chargesheet was filed on May 14 against two accused persons -- Mouzzam Parvez and Umar Farooq, both residents of Dalipora village of Pulwama who had collect-ed the cash from Amritsar in Punjab.

"Investigations have revealed that the accused Parvez and Farooq had conspired with Muzannil Malik and accused Nengroo and knowingly facilitated the movement of terror funds which were to be further distributed to JeM terrorists operating in valley for launch-ing terrorist attacks in India," the official said.

He said the terror funding was facilitated by Malik, who had managed the travel of accused Parvez and Farooq in his truck, and Punjab based gangsters and narcotics smug-glers who delivered the terror funding amount.

"Parvez and Farooq had received the illegal terror funding amount of Rs 15 lakhs as per the directions received from Pakistan-based designated terrorist (Nengroo) from Amarbir Singh at Amritsar at a pre-defined location on Amritsar highway. He was assisted by his close associates Ravi Kumar and Jaideep Dhawan. Arms and ammunition were also recovered from the residence of Kumar at Amritsar," the official said.

He said Amarbir Singh is a gangster in Punjab associated with narcotics and weapons smuggler Bajjinder Singh alias Billa Mandiala, and involved in more than 23 FIRs of murder and extortion.

Rescue operations went on for six days.

Earlier, A fresh batch of over 2,100 pilgrims on Tuesday left the Bhagwati Nagar base camp here to offer prayers at the 3,880-metre-high cave shrine of Amarnath in south Kashmir Himalayas, officials said.

A total of 2,189 pilgrims, the lowest till date this year; formed the 26th batch that left in a convoy of 73 vehicles amid heavy security of the Central Reserve Police Force this morning, they said.

The officials said 815 pilgrims heading for Baltal were the first to leave the Jammu camp in 23 vehicles, followed by the second convoy of 49 vehicles carrying 1,374 pilgrims for Pahalgam.

The number of pilgrims visiting the cave shrine has drastically fallen in past two days. The reason, however, is yet to be ascertained, officials said.

The annual 43-day yatra commenced from the twin base camps -- traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag and 14-km shorter Baltal in central Kashmir's Ganderbal -- on June 30. Over 2.30 lakh pilgrims had offered their prayers at the cave shrine, housing the naturally formed ice-shivlingam, officials said.

Court cannot enter...

"It is of common knowledge that receiving and giving of interest (Riba in Quranic parlance) besides being prohibited for Muslims is widely disliked by other faiths as well," the Forum said. "In Hinduism it is said that Brahmana and a Kshatriya shall not lend anything at interest." The Forum submits that even the United Nations has acknowledged the role of Zakat in supporting the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). "The United Nations Organization set up an Millennium Development Goals in 2000 and laid down the new Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) blueprint and the successor to the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) expiring at the end of the year 2015- are composed of 17 goals and 169 targets. The said programme was renewed for another 15 years in 2015. Among other goals to achieve the sustainable development, United Nations Development programme has identified that Zakat as main factor for achieving the goal", reads the PIL. In case petitioner or any per-son is aggrieved by the above policy decision it may take appropriate steps to challenge it before the proper forum, if advised and disposed of the PIL.

Record 19 MPs...

government, which insisted that the discussion will be held once Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman recovers from COVID-19.

An unrelenting Opposition created a ruckus in Rajya Sabha, with the penalised MPs refusing to leave the House, and alleged that "democracy has been suspended" in the coun-try.

Of the 19 MPs suspended from Rajya Sabha, seven belong to the Trinamool Congress, six are from the DMK, three from the Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS), two from the Communist Party of India (Marxist), and one from the Communist Party of India (CPI).

The first seven days of the Monsoon session were virtually washed out as the two Houses were rocked by Opposition protests to press for an immediate discussion on rising prices of fuel and essential commodities as well as levy of GST on wheat, rice, flour; curd and other daily use items.

On Tuesday too, Rajya Sabha proceedings were adjourned for an hour after it assem-bled but Deputy Chairman Harivarnsh managed to conduct Question Hour despite oppo-sition MPs trooping into the well and shouting slogans.

But in the post-lunch session, when the government legislative business was to be taken up, Harivarnsh repeatedly asked the protesting members to return to their seats and warned them of action.

Senior opposition leaders like Ramgopal Yadav of the Samajwadi Party, TMC's Derek O'Brien and others demanded the suspension of business to discuss price rise but the chair wanted The Weapons of Mass Destruction and their Delivery Systems (Prohibition of Unlawful Activities) Amendment Bill, 2022 to be discussed.

When his pleas went unheeded, Harivarnsh asked the treasury benches to move a reso-lution for suspension.

Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs V Muraleedharan moved a motion to sus-pend 10 MPs - seven from the TMC, Mohamed Abdulla and Kanimozhi NVN Somu of the DMK and AA Rahim of the CPM - from the sitting of the House for the remainder of the week for their "misconduct" by showing "utter disregard to the House and author-ity of the chair".

The TMC MPs were Sushmita Dev, Mausam Noor; Shanta Chhetri, Dola Sen, Santanu Sen, Abir Ranjan Biswas and Md. Nadimul Haque.

Nine more names - B Lingaiah Yadav, Ravichandra Vaddiraju and Damodar Rao Divakonda of the TRS; S Kalyanasundaram, R Girirajan, NR Elango and M Shanmugam of the DMK, CPM's V Sivadasan and Santhosh Kumar P of CPI were added - when Harivarnsh put the motion to vote.

MPs from Congress, which has been part of the protests over the price rise issue, were agitating outside the House over ED action against party president Sonia Gandhi in the National Herald case.

The motion to suspend was passed by a voice vote. When some opposition MPs demand-ed a division of votes, the chair said he would do so if the members returned to their seats and the House was brought to order.

With the MPs refusing to budge, he said it seems they are not interested in the division and declared that the motion has been adopted.

This is the highest number of suspensions at a go in Rajya Sabha as the previous record was on the first day of the Winter session in November last year when 12 MPs were sus-pended for the ruckus they had created in the previous Monsoon session in August.

A 13th MP, Derek O'Brien, was suspended on the last day of that session, while seven MPs were suspended for "unruly" behaviour during the passage of farm laws in the Monsoon session of 2020.

ED questions Sonia...

under scanner in the case, officials said.

She was questioned for nearly 2.5 hours at the ED office in central Delhi from 11 AM which continued after a 90-minute lunch break before ending at around 7 PM.

The Congress chief had reached the ED office in the morning with her Z+ armed secu-rity cover; and was accompanied by Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadera.

While Priyanka stayed back at the ED office, Rahul left soon after to join the Congress protests.

Priyanka was in another room at the ED office so she could meet her mother to provide her medicines or medical assistance if necessary, officials said.

Sonia Gandhi was questioned for over two hours on July 21 during which she replied to 28 questions put forth by the agency. She had reiterated the Congress party stand that the Young Indian was a "not for profit" company and no personal benefits were gained by them.

The Lok Sabha MP from Rae Bareli was quizzed on Tuesday on the functioning and running of the newspaper; the role of its various office bearers, and her and Rahul Gandhi's participation in the affairs of the National Herald and Young Indian.

The agency will also corroborate her statement with that of Rahul Gandhi as both put together are majority stakeholders in Young Indian, officials said.

The questioning of the Gandhis pertains to the charge of alleged financial irregularities in the Congress-promoted Young Indian, which owns the National Herald newspaper.

The ED questioned Rahul Gandhi last month in sessions that clocked over 50 hours over five days.

The Congress has slammed the agency's action against its top leadership and termed it

"political vendetta".

Delhi Police deployed a huge force, including CRPF and RAF personnel, and barricad-ed the entire over one kilometre stretch between her residence and the ED office. Traffic restrictions were also imposed in the area.

Rahul Gandhi and Congress MPs had gathered at the Vijay Chowk to march towards the Rashtrapati Bhavan to draw the President's attention to the alleged misuse of central agencies by the government, but were stopped by the police.

"I am not going anywhere. We wanted to go towards the President's house. But the police are not allowing us," Gandhi said.

"All Congress MPs stopped at Vijay Chowk and prevented from marching to Rashtrapati Bhavan. Forceibly arrested. Now we are in police buses being taken to a place only PM and HM know where.," Congress Rajya Sabha MP Jairam Ramesh tweeted.

"The Delhi Police harassed us. They have taken almost all the 75 MPs under detention and are taking them to unknown places," claimed Manickam Tagore.

The Delhi Police, meanwhile, said they are in the process of identifying the personnel who allegedly manhandled Indian Youth Congress president Srinivas BV during the protest by the Congress. A video of Srinivas being pulled by his hair went viral on social media with several users condemning the police action. Deputy Commissioner of Police (New Delhi) Amrutha Guguloth said disciplinary action will be taken against the erring officials. Srinivas alleged he was beaten up by three to four policemen before being detained. The move to question the Gandhis was initiated after the ED late last year reg-istered a fresh case under criminal provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act(PMLA). This was after a trial court here took cognisance of an Income Tax depart-ment probe against Young Indian based on a private criminal complaint by BJP MP Subramanian Swamy in 2013. Sonia and Rahul Gandhi are among the promoters and majority shareholders in Young Indian. Like her son, the Congress president too has 38 per cent shareholding. Swamy had accused the Gandhis and others of conspiring to cheat and misappropriate funds, with Young Indian paying only Rs 50 lakh to obtain the right to recover Rs 90.25 crore that Associate Journals Limited owed to the Congress.

JKCA scam case...

This comes days after the principal district and sessions judge, Srinagar summoned Abdullah on August 27 on a complaint filed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) against him and others in the JKCA money laundering case.

Abdullah was questioned by the ED for over three hours here on May 31.

"Dr Farooq Abdullah shall always stick to the truth, no matter how stories are fabricat-ed, truth manipulated and dissent suppressed however he will cooperate with the agencies and vindicate himself," the National Conference said in a tweet.

Abdullah was JKCA president from 2001 to 2012. The scam being probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the ED is about alleged financial misappro-priation between 2004 and 2009.

The ED has already attached properties worth over Rs 21 crore in the case. These include Rs 11.86 crore of immovable assets of Abdullah.

The ED claimed its probe so far has "revealed that Ahsan Ahmad Mirza, in connivance with other office-bearers of the JKCA, had misappropriated JKCA funds to the tune of Rs 51.90 crore and utilised proceeds of crime for settling his personal and business liabil-ities".

It initiated the money laundering probe against JKCA office-bearers on the basis of a case registered at the Rammunshi Bagh police station here. The case was later trans-ferred to the CBI on the high court's directions. The CBI has filed a charge sheet in the case against former JKCA office-bearers for misappropriation of funds to the tune of Rs 43.69 crore.

No KP resigned...

have been provided government jobs in different departments of Jammu and Kashmir administration in the Kashmir Valley under the PMDP.As per the information provided by the government of Jammu and Kashmir; no Kashmiri Pandit working under the Prime Minister's Development Package has resigned in protest against the killing of a Kashmiri Pandit in Kashmir Valley, Rai said replying to a written question.

The minister of state for home said the government has approved construction of 6,000 transit accommodations for the Kashmiri migrant employees engaged or to be engaged in different departments of the Jammu and Kashmir government in the Valley. Rai last week had said that as many as 118 civilians, including five Kashmiri Pandits and 16 other Hindus and Sikhs, were killed in Jammu and Kashmir since the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019. He had also said no Kashmiri Pandit migrated from the Valley since August 2019.

Yasin Malik being given intravenous fluids in Tihar Jail: Officials

NEW DELHI: Separatist Yasin Malik is being given intravenous fluids as he is on a hunger strike for the last five days in Tihar Jail here after the Centre did not respond to his plea that he be allowed to physically appear in a Jammu court hear-ing the Rubaiya Sayeed abduction case, in which he is an accused, officials said on Tuesday.

Malik (56), the head of the banned Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF), began his indefinite hunger strike on Friday morning.

"On Friday morning, Malik, who has been kept in a separate cell in jail number seven under heavy security, refused to eat anything. He is still on a hunger strike and his health is being regularly monitored by the doctors. He is being given IV (intravenous) fluids since Sunday," an official said.

Appearing before a special CBI judge through a video-conference, Malik had said he wanted to physically appear in the case related to the abduction of Rubaiya Sayeed, the daughter of then Union home minister Mufti Mohammed Sayeed, in 1989.

Malik informed the court that he had written a letter to the government seeking his transfer to a Jammu jail so that he could physically appear in the case and con-temst the allegations against him.

He had said he would like to personally cross-examine the prosecution witnesses and would wait for a government nod till July 22. He had also said he would sit on an indefinite hunger strike inside the jail if his plea was not allowed.

Rubaiya Sayeed was allegedly abducted by the JKLF on December 8, 1989. She was freed from captivity five days later after the then V P Singh government at the Centre, supported by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), released five JKLF ter-rorists in exchange.

Malik began his protest when he received no information from the government on his plea to shift him to any prison in Jammu.

The JKLF chief was arrested in early 2019 in connection with a 2017 terror-funding case registered by the National Investigation Agency. Malik had pleaded guilty in the case and was sentenced by a special NIA court in Delhi in May.

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday reported 697 fresh COVID-19 cases that pushed its tally to 4,61,255, while the death toll remained unchanged at 4,763, officials here said.

Of the fresh cases, 281 were reported from the Jammu division and 416 from the Kashmir valley, they said.

There are 3,816 active cases of COVID-19 in the union territory, the officials said. So far, 4,52,676 people have recovered from the viral disease, they said.
