Amit visits Kalakote mines, addresses workers' issues

KALAKOTE: Amit Sharma, Secretary to Government, Mining Department and Director J&K Minerals Limited on Saturday conducted an extensive tour of old & traditional Coal Mines located at Moghla and Metka in Kalakote area of district Rajouri in the Union Territory of J&K.

He was accompanied with Additional Deputy Commissioner Kalakote Krishan Lal, Managing Director J&K Minerals Ltd Vikram K Gupta, Manager Projects & Agent Coal Mines Sr Kirtan Singh, Manager Coal Mines Moghla Jaymohan, Manager Metka Coal Mines Rajesh Gupta, Police Chowki Officer Teryath Raza Ali and others.

During the historical visit, Amit Sharma took a detailed review of the functioning of these historical coal mines of J&K which have been giving a consistent output of about 35-40 tonnes per day.

Amit also conducted a personal visit inside the actual coal mining areas with concerned mining staff for getting firsthand account of the working conditions inside the mines.

Afterwards, Amit held interactive session with the coal mine workers to

understand their grievances in the presence of BDC Chairperson Moghla Surekha Thakur, ADC Kalakote, MD, J&K Minerals and others wherein spot directions were given to resolve their genuine grievances.

Secretary Mining further advised all local officers to conduct monthly Public Darbar in this area led by ADC Kalakote to redress genuine grievances of coal mine workers who have been working relentlessly for uninterrupted operation of Kalakote Mines which is a real pride of the nation.

Moreover, he directed MD of the Corporation to place all genuine issues of the workers in upcoming Board of Directors Meeting of the Corporation for consideration by the Board.

During the visit, Amit also appreciated the efforts of coal mine workers in Kalakote where Anthracite Coal is being extracted which is comparable with top quality coal being produced globally in Australia globally and locally in Assam at national level.

Akhnoor Road Project: 'Flyover from Canal Head to Ganesh Vihar likely to complete by July end'

JAMMU: Divisional Commissioner Jammu, Ramesh Kumar on Saturday inspected the progress of work on Jammu-Akhnoor Road widening Project.

The Div Com took a round of the entire stretch and inspected the work progress on all the packages at several sites including Canal Head, Patel Nagar, Paloura, Muthi and other locations.

He was accompanied by Deputy Commissioner Jammu Avny Lavasa; General Manager (P), NHIDCL, Col. S P S Samgwan; Chief Engineer Irrigation, concerned SDM, besides senior officers of JPDCL, Jal Shakti, site Engineers of NHIDCL and other concerned officers.

The NHIDCL officials apprised the Div Com about the current status of work on the prestigious road project, besides progress achieved so far and the future work plan.

While giving details, the GM NHIDCL informed that

Detailed Project Report (DPR) for package 1 from 4th Tawi Bridge to Canal Head rotary has been prepared and submitted for approval and the project is likely to be awarded by July 30, 2022.

The Div Com stressed on early start of work on package 1 and instructed the DC Jammu to expedite the land acquisition process and disbursement of compensation besides relocation of Government buildings coming in its alignment. The Div Com also directed NHIDCL and concerned officers to

ensure safe utility shifting. It was informed that 94 percent work on 4.6 KM package 2 from Canal Head to Ganesh Vihar has been completed, while the flyover was at final stage and it would be thrown open for traffic by July end.

The Div Com instructed GM NHIDCL to expedite the pace of work on approach and ramp of elevated road from both the ends. He also emphasized on installation of signages, besides beautification and landscaping of the area under the elevated road por-

tion with proper drainage network.

The Div Com directed GM NHIDCL to expedite the final works of package 2 and ensure its completion by August 15.

It was further given out that 56 percent work on 20.61 KM package 3 from Ganesh vihar to Khatti Chowk has been completed and the rest of the work was in progress. The concerned officers further informed that the land acquisition process has been completed and the same has been provided to executing agencies for smooth execution of work.

The Div Com directed NHIDCL to be in regular touch with concerned officers of district administration for every logistic support and share the requirement of construction material.

He further asked the Corporation to set weekly, monthly targets and expedite the progress of work to complete the project within the stipulated time frame.

International Plastic Bag Free Day: More to be done for eliminating plastic pollution from Valley

SRINAGAR: From its manufacturing to ban, history of plastic bag has impacted world to a great extent. In 1933, polyethylene, the most commonly used plastic was created accidentally at a chemical plant in Northwich, England. It wasn't in minds of people until 1997, when a researcher Charles Moore found that accumulated plastic wastes are threatening marine life. Plastic bags are also notorious for killing sea turtles, which mistakenly eat them presuming them as jellyfish. Single-use plastic and polythene pollution is becoming dangerous and creating health hazard issues across the world, including Kashmir valley.

Divisional Administration has urged authorities to do more for eradicating plastic pollution from Valley. Although, a bit improvement is there in overall scenario in comparison to past, but a lot more needs to be done for curbing plastic pollution to save water-bodies and other sites.

International Plastic Bag Free Day inspire for adopting safer alternatives to demonstrate that a world, without plastic, is quite possible.

It is really an encouraging step that India has banned all type of single-use plastics from July 1, while juice & dairy products manufacturing companies have also been directed to use paper-straw instead of single-use plastic straws.

Recently, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha asked all Municipal Corporations of J&K to develop Smart Cities as Climate Smart Cities and launch yearlong campaign 'City with Nature' with public participation to prevent water, air and plastic pollution. He advised all Government departments to achieve the goals of bringing an end to use of single-use plastics besides strengthening Waste Management System.

As per the official data, there are no polythene producing units in Kashmir and addressing issue of plastic pollution in J&K.
