SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir Cricket Association (JKCA) after holding Talent Hunt 2022 in various age groups (men and women) has identified crick-eting talent even from far off areas of the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh as well. He further said JKCA has already produced International and IPL stuff in Umran Malik, Abdul Samad, Parvez Rasool, Ian Dev Singh

and Shubham Khajuria etc, adding that with the initiatives like this, the time is ripe to see more and more Umrans blossoming at the National scene.

"The Government of Jammu and Kashmir is committed to promote sports in every nook and corner of the UT and the initiatives like this are going to serve as catalyst in enhancing sports culture in the Union Territory. Apart from raising sports infra at all levels, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir has constituted its own Sports Policy for the promotion and welfare of out-standing sports persons," the chief guest added.

On the occasion Brig Anil Gupta said that the Talent Hunt was conducted at four zones in Jammu province and four in Kashmir province including Ladakh.

"After making a pool of 90 men and women cricketers in junior category and 75 men and women players in senior category in both the divisions of the Union Territory, JKCA organised Tournaments in each category at the twin divisions.

As part of this cricketing extravaganza, spreading over for three long months, five

tournaments viz- Under-19 Women One-Day, U-19 Men One-Day, Senior Women One-Day and U-23 Men One-Day and the Senior Men's One-Day Tournament today, have already been completed," Brig said

He further said that this initiative has broken the myth that players from the head-quarters only can make it to the UT teams.

Meanwhile, in the summit clash, Parvez Rasool's magic overpowered brilliance of Henan Malik and Ramdayal to help JKCA Orange thrash JKCA Blue by 5 wickets.

Earlier, put into bat, JKCA Blue scored a modest total of 165 runs in 40.3 overs. Henan Malik was the top scorer with 53 runs, while Ramdayal contributed valuable 46 runs to the total. The duo made a good partnership of 90 runs to take the score to 144 runs, after JKCA Blue were struggling at 54/6, before Nasir Lone struck thrice in the same over to get rid of both these batsmen. Abid Mushtaq chipped in with 19 runs, while Jatin Wadhawan and Suryansh Raina contributed 11 and 10 runs respectively.

For JKCA Blue, Parvez Rasool was the pick of the

bowlers, who took 4 wickets by conceding 28 runs in his 19.3 overs, while Nasir Lone captured 3 wickets. Umar Nazir bagged 2 and Shahrukh Dar claimed 1 wicket.

In reply, JKCA Orange, after their early hiccups, rode on a brilliant partnership between Parvez Rasool and Sheikh Usaid to chase the required target in 33.3 overs by losing 5 wickets to win the match by 5 wickets. Rasool was in sublime touch and showed stellar grit and tenacity, besides fluid grace and elegance to score splendid 77 runs, while Usaid contributed valuable 53 runs.

For JKCA Blue, Ramdayal, Sahil Lotra and Ritik Singh claimed 1 wicket each.

Ritik Singh was declared as the best bowler, Henan Malik was adjudged as the best batter. Abid Mushtaq was named as the best all-rounder, Asif Ramzan was declared as the best wicketkeeper and Ritik Singh was adjudged as the most promising player of the tournament.

The Chief Guest distributed prizes among the winners and runners-up teams on the occasion. He also honoured the umpires and other officials on the occasion.

Workshop on 'Establishment of New Fruit Plant Nurseries' held at Maralian

JAMMU: The Department of Horticulture Jammu on Saturday organized one day workshop on 'Establishment, Registration and Management of New Fruit Plant Nurseries' at Govt. Fruit Plant Nursery Maralian, here, wherein more than 100 nursery owners and entrepreneurs from different districts of Jammu division participated.

Director Floriculture Jammu Jatinder Singh, was the Chief Guest and Director Horticulture Jammu Ram Savak, presided over the function.

C.L Sharma, Joint Director Horticulture Jammu, Tejinder Singh, Member J&K Kissan Advisory Board besides other officers were also present.

The Jammu and Kashmir Fruit Nurseries (Licensing) Act 1987 for establishment, licensing and regulation of fruit nurseries in the state of Jammu & Kashmir came into effect on 4th January 1988.

This was elaborated in detail by a team of experts of Department of Horticulture Jammu. It is informed that for establishment of new nursery, a minimum of 4 kanals of land is required and a maximum of 80 kanals.

While addressing nursery owners and entrepreneurs, Director Horticulture explained the different subsidy components available for the establishment of new nurseries and up gradation of existing ones.

The Department is providing an incentive of Rs 7.5 lakh for establishment of new nursery in an area

of 20 kanals.

He said that during the current financial year, the department intends to plant more than 25 lakh fruit plants in the Jammu province through farmer participation under different schemes and to meet this, the department requires excellent nursery support, both from private as well as government.

In govt. sector, one mega fruit plant nursery is being established at chakroi, where it is expected that more than three lakh fruit plants shall be produced.

He appealed farmers to come forward, associate with the department and avail the incentives for establishment and up gradation of nurseries.

Director Floriculture Jammu during his address urged the nursery owners and entrepreneurs that most of them are also doing flower business and care must be taken to ensure that quality flowers and seeds are made available to the farmers.

Later, nursery owners / entrepreneurs also put forth their issues during the programme and Director Horticulture ensured them full cooperation and early redressal of their issues.

Further, he informed that the Jammu Horticulture App is available on android phones and they can also apply online through the app.
