Common man suffering due to wrong policies of Govt: Rattan Asks party cadre to gear-up for Assembly elections

JAMMU: The tall claims made by government with regard to unprecedented development in Jammu and Kashmir after abrogation of Articles 370 and 35A has proved to be hoax but the reality is that the situation has gone from bad to worst. A common man in Jammu and Kashmir is suffering on account of wrong policies of the government.

This was stated by Rattan Lal Gupta, Provincial President of J&K National Conference while addressing a public meeting at Vijaypur of district Samba today. Under the chairmanship Sudagar Chand Gupta District President Samba.

The Provincial President raised serious concern over the extremely volatile situation in J&K describing it as fallout of wrong policies adopted by both the J&K Government and the Centre. The situation has turned

from bad to worse. He asserted that due to the anti-people policies adopted by the government that today unemployment is at its peak, inflation has gone out of control amid the sky rocketing prices of essential commodities while the claims of unprecedented development stand exposed with the snail's pace of almost all the works. He said that the government has miserably failed in providing basic amenities like water, power and ration to the common person of the state. He said that due to lack of vision and wrong policies of the government, people of J&K are facing a crisis like situation with each segment of society feeling abject neglect.

which there is hue and cry of water scarcity. Thousands of families of these daily wagers have been left helpless by the present government with no hope for their regularization and their pending salaries.

SANJY: Traffic Police issue advisory for tourists, yatries, truck movement in J&K

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Traffic Police on Sunday issued advisory for tourists, yatries and truck movement to inform about travel timings and travel restrictions for NH-44 during Shri Amarnathji Yatra-2022.

According to advisory issued by the IGP Traffic Police, J&K, empty tankers and trucks upto 10 tyres including those loaded with fresh perishable items shall preferentially use Mughal Road towards Jammu.

While as the loaded trucks upto 10 tyres including those loaded with fresh perishable items shall preferentially use Mughal Road towards Jammu.

The timings of Mughal Road have also been increased from 7am to 4pm, for the present, subject to the daily assessment by Traffic authorities. The advisory further said the movement via NH-44 the trucks with more than 10 tyres shall ply via National Highway-44. Trucks with more than 10 tyres loaded with fresh perishable items should reach Jakhni Naka/Qazigund Naka before 2pm. These trucks shall be parked separately and shall be given preference when traffic is released, it said. It said the movement of Yatries/Tourists in Kashmir Valley other than via Yatra Convoys are advised to travel in the Kashmir Valley only between 7am to 6pm and must plan their travel so as to reach their destination within this time period.

In case the Yatries/Tourists fail to reach their destination within the stipulated time, i.e. by 6pm the security forces shall make such Yatries/Tourists halt for the night at the nearest lodgement Centre the Advisory reads, the traffic advisory added.
