## ‘Insult’ of Tricolour at hands of Farooq Abdullah unacceptable: Kavinder

JAMMU: Giving a hard hitting rejoinder to irresponsible statement of National Conference President Dr Farooq Abdullah insulting Tricolour, Senior BJP leader and former Deputy Chief Minister, Kavinder Gupta said that NC leader's remark against the Tiranga is unacceptable and shows his anti-national tendencies to the hilt.

Speaking at the sidelines of a three-day orientation programme at Patnitop, Kavinder said that the government should take cognizance of the anti-national stance taken by the head of a political party because such gross misconduct cannot be allowed to go scot-free.

The senior BJP leader said that such kind of politically immature behaviour by a senior leader of one of the mainstream political parties shows how restless he has become after looking at the positive change in the political scenario in Kashmir under the prudent dispensation led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

pelting, strikes and shutdowns have become the things of the past and people are now looking for business opportunities, jobs and peace thus making the politicians like Farooq and his ilk confused and battered and such irresponsible statements are the testimony to the fact that the pleasant change in Valley is not going down well in the eyes of such dynastic rulers who were running their shops under the shadow of death, destruction and miseries of the people. He said that the scale of development in the UT of J&K is unprecedented and this is also irking the political class in Valley including Dr Farooq thus leading to unacceptable behaviour.

The former Deputy Chief Minister said that more and more people in J&K especially the Valley are reposing faith in nationalistic policies of the Modi government thus putting the very existence of NC and other Kashmir-based parties into deep crisis forcing their leaders to again go for anti-national stance like the case of Dr farooq Abdullah, who openly insulted Tiranga.

Kavinder said that NC has lost relevance and that is the reason it has opted to contest Assembly polls under the ambit of PAGD. "The decision of Farooq over PAGD shows the restlessness of the party with regard to the upcoming elections in J&K", he added.

## HC upholds PSA of one, quashes detention of 5 under PSA

Jammu & Kashmir High Court quashed detention orders of five detainees held under Public Safety Act (PSA) and directed the authorities to release them from the custody where as uphold the detention under PSA of one. The Court while hearing the two separate petitions filed by Subaib Azim Khan, Pethlugh Dialgam , District Anantnag, Basit Ahmad Shah, Magraypora Bapora Wanpora Tehsil Chadoora District Budgam, Jahangir Ahmad Bhat resident Wahiugh Tehsil & District Pulwama, Kamaljeet Singh resident of Jammu, Ali Hassan of Jammu challenging their detention orders passed against them by District Magistrates Anantnag, Budgam, Pulwama and Jammu, quashed all detention orders and directed the jail authorities to release both the detainees forthwith from the custody, if they are not required in any other case

whereas High Court upheld the detention of Mohammad Shaban Bhat seeking quashment of Order no.K7160/2021 dated 10.09.2021 (for brevity 'order impugned') passed by Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir (for short 'detaining authority'), in terms of Section 3 of Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1988. Justice Rajneesh Oswal, while quashing the detention order of Kamaljeet Singh and Ali Hussain order of detention, is not sustainable in the eyes of law as the respondent was under obligation to bring to the notice of respondent all the material facts so that the respondent No. 2 would have been in a position to derive his subjective satisfaction with regard to the existence of grounds necessitating the detention of the petitioners. Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul while quashing the detention orders of Subaib Azim Khan, Basit Ahmad Shah and Jahangir Ahmad Bhat observed that it is evident that

the whole of the material was not placed before the detaining authority so as to enable it to record its subjective satisfaction that the passing of detention order is necessary so as to prevent the detenu from indulging in activities which are prejudicial to the security of the State. This too vitiates the order of detention.

While upholding the detention under PSA of Mohammad Shaban Bhat passed by Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir (for short 'detaining authority'), in terms of Section 3 of Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1988, Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul observed that the present case relates to illicit trafficking of narcotic drugs. The drug problem is a serious threat to public health, safety and well-being of humanity. Our global society is facing serious consequences of drug abuse and it undermines the socio-economic and political stability and sustainable development. Besides, it also distorts health and fab-

ric of society and it is considered to be originator for petty offences as well as heinous crimes, like smuggling of arms and ammunition and money laundering. Involvement of various terrorist groups and syndicates in drug trafficking leads to threat to the national security and sovereignty of States by way of Narvo-terrorism. Drug trafficking and abuse has continued its significant toll on valuable human lives and productive years of many persons around the globe. With the growth and development of world economy, drug traffickers are also seamlessly trafficking various type of drugs from one corner to other ensuring availability of contrabands for vulnerable segment of society who fall into trap of drug peddlers and traffickers. Due to India's close proximity with major opium growing areas of the region, India is facing serious menace of drug trafficking and as a spill-over effect, drug abuse especially among the youth is a matter of concern for us and Our Constitution framers had visualized danger of misuse of such type of substances and, thus, made it part of directives issued to the State. The

Directive Principles, which are part of our Constitution, lay down that the State shall make endeavours to bring about the prohibition of substances injurious for health except for medicinal and scientific purposes. In recent years, India has been facing a problem of transit traffic in illicit drugs. The spillover from such traffic has caused tribulations of abuse and addiction. This trend has created an illicit demand for drugs within the country. The illicit traffic in narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances poses a serious threat to the health and welfare of the people and activities of persons engaged in such illicit traffic have a deleterious effect on the national economy as well. Having regard to the persons by whom and the manner in which such activities are organised and carried on, and having regard to the fact that in certain areas which are highly vulnerable to the illicit traffic in narcotic drugs, such activities of a considerable magnitude are clandestinely organised and carried on, it is necessary for the effective prevention of such activities to provide for detention of persons concerned in any manner therewith.

## ‘Ahead of Eid-ul-Adha, traffic violations & road side parking can’t be tolerated’

SRINAGAR: Ahead of Eid-ul-Adha, Traffic Police in Srinagar have asked the people not to park their vehicles on roads, and urged all to park their vehicles at designated parking slots, as traffic jams during peak hours are becoming a headache for the commuters across Srinagar district. Roadside parking and encroachment on footpaths and lack of permanent bus stops are some of the main causes of the traffic mess.

"Those coming for shopping in the city should use the designated parking slots, we appeal all to cooperate with us and avoid parking their vehicles on roads, failing which action will follow as per the law," the traffic control unit officer said.

The officer said that the city traffic police is continuously

making announcements using a public address system for not parking the vehicles on roads and will intensify the drive for the rest of the days.

"Parking vehicles at parking slots will let the smooth movement of traffic, as the festivities are ahead, let us at the same time abide by the laws and avoid parking vehicles on roads which causes inconvenience to all. Don't invite the action by violating the rules", he added.

As Eid-ul-Adha falls on Sunday July 10 , the traffic flow in Srinagar city is expected to increase in the coming days as people throng the city center for shopping as most of the shopping malls and centers are in Srinagar city.

Administration also asked to field staff to relocate street vendors from heavy traffic

junction points which hinder smooth traffic ply.

Administration also stressed that civic sense and driving sense is imperative in better traffic management and appealed to all stakeholders to put in collective efforts to overcome traffic jams and decongest Srinagar City for smooth traffic regulation.

Meanwhile, higher authorities visited Lal chovk and other adjacent areas , he asked roadside street vendors to restrict their business to only designated spaces and not indulge in any violation/encroachment which causes inconvenience to the general public and movement of traffic. While as traffic violators were fined on the spot, drivers were advised to follow traffic rules in letter and spirit to ensure smooth ply of traffic.

provisions of Employees' Pension Scheme 1995 and Employees Deposit Linked Insurance scheme, 1976 especially responsibility of departments and organisations in the registration process of their employees. He said that contractors executing works under

different Hydro Electric Power Projects and various governmental departments should be registered under the EPF & MP Act, 1952 so that their social security is ensured and they are benefited financially in case of need. If any member dies while in service, the nomi-

nee/widow/widower would get pension lifelong along with 2 children up to the age of 25 irrespective of their marital status and the nominee would get maximum benefit of Rs 7.5 lakhs under EDLI scheme. There are other pensions provided under the scheme as per

eligibility of membership like superannuation, early pension, disability pension, orphan pension, widow pension and nominee pension. The Commissioner provided WhatsApp helpline numbers (for Jammu 6006567049) and (for Kashmir 7780813099) and said that the helpline is available for all advice and clarifications. Later, the PF Commissioner held an interactive meeting with Deputy Commissioner Kishtwar Ashok Sharam and NHIDCL authorities, its subcontractors and ExEn PMGSY and discussed various issues pertaining to the implementation of the EPF & MP Act, 1952 in the district.

## Congress stages Dharma over LPG price hike Modi Govt looting people in installments: Bhalla

JAMMU: The Congress party on Thursday staged Dharma at Shaheed Chowk in Jammu against the BJP Government for the recent hike in LPG cylinder prices. The sit-in protest was led by Working President PCC Raman Bhalla, Former Minister Yogesh Sawhney General Secretary PCC Incharge District President Jammu (U), Mannohan Singh General Secretary PCC and Hari Singh Chib, District President Jammu Rural. It was marked by heavy sloganeering against the Modi government, meant to register the Congress workers' protest against the hike in gas cylinder prices. This was the fourth hike in LPG prices this year when LPG now costs Rs 1,100 per 14.2-kg cylinder in the national capital.

Former Minister J&K and Working President PCC Raman Bhalla, while speaking at the protest, attacked the BJP-led government at the Centre stating that this is another huge blow to the common man who is struggling under heavy inflation in these times and is unable to keep up with the ever-

increasing prices of essential commodities.

The prices for the LPG gas cylinder needed and used in each and every household in India every month has been continuously hiked by the BJP Government and the possibilities of subsidies is nil.

Sawhney said that the people are infuriated at the BJP for looting their pockets and making a joke of their lives.

Sawhney further said that BJP must see this last straw, and a last warning from the Congress and the people, to cut down prices in the best interests of the public, otherwise, we will not step down, he said.

Hari Singh Chib said the

Modi government's rich friends might not be affected by these issues, but the majority of the country pays the consequences of these hikes. From fuel to oil to pulses to everything needed in the kitchen, everything is costlier.

Youth President Uday Bhanu Chib said, "The Modi Government wants the people to cry and struggle to even cook proper meals for their families as thousands and lakhs will struggle to pay the bills. We sincerely urge the government to see the genuine troubles of the common man and reduce prices of LPG cylinders and other essential commodities."
