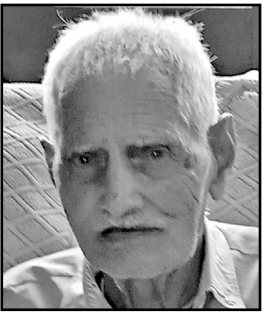

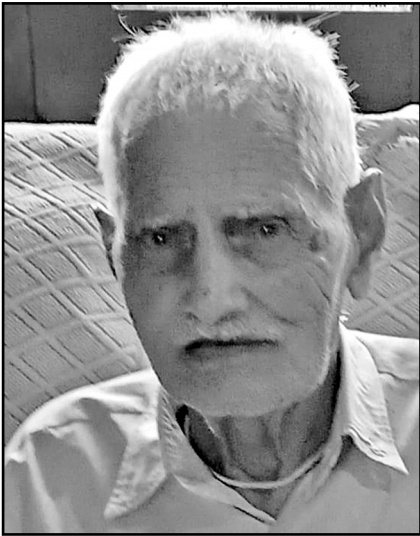
You gave me something as a token of your love and blessing... That I will keep with me always. Your encouragement has always motivated me.

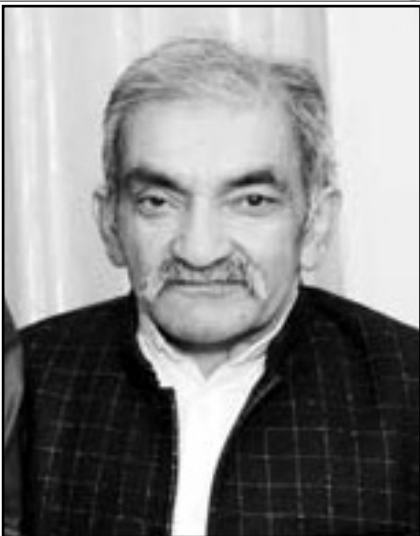

CRIMEREPORT

65 bovines rescued; 8 smugglers arrested

JAMMU: Police on Thursday foiled various bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 65 bovines and arrested 8 smugglers. As per details, Jammu Police rescued 30 bovine animals at three different Nakas i.e., 18 bovines from Khugga Naka under jurisdiction of Police Station Akhnoor; 1 bovine at Naka Ban Toll Plaza Nagrota and 11 bovines from Naka point Nadal Manwal, Dansal under the jurisdiction of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli. In this regard FIR No. 196/2022 under sections 279/188/34 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act, 50,52,54,56 of Transportation of Animal Act 1978 was registered at Police Station Akhnoor; FIR no 278/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Nagrota and FIR under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act, 11/12/13 of Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Transportation of Animals on Foot) Rules 2001 was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli. Five accused, identified as Mohd Hanief, son of Shukar Din, resident of Tharar Balli Nallah District Udhampur and Mohd Farooq, son of Chirag Din, resident of Balli Nallah District Udhampur, both arrested by Akhnoor Police; Alam Din, son of Shafi Mohd, resident of Laswara Jammu, were arrested by Nagrota police while Manhor Lal Sharma, son of Ramkishan Sharma, resident of Madira Teh Samba Disst Samba & Tarlok Chand, son of Pars Ram, resident of Parnot Teh & District Ramban were arrested by Jhajjar Kotli Police. The overall arrest and recoveries were made by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar and SHO Nagrota Vishav Partap Singh and Incharge Police Post Manwal PSI Ayub Khan under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial and SDPO Nagrota Sunil Singh respectively. Meanwhile, a team of Akhnoor police led by SHO Hilal Azhar foiled a bovine smuggling bid and arrested two bovine smugglers. During checking, a rashly driven vehicle approached Khugga Naka, which was stopped by alert police party after hectic efforts and was found transporting bovines illegally. Two smugglers, identified as Mohd Hanief, son of Shukar Din, resident of Tharar Balli Nallah District Udhampur and Mohd Farooq, son of Chirag Din, resident of Balli Nallah District Udhampur were arrested on the spot while the third, whose name was revealed as Maroof, son of Abdul Gani, residence of Beli Charana Jammu, fled away taking advantage of darkness. The smugglers were found illegally transporting 18 bovines towards Rajouri in truck (JK02AT-0665). FIR No. 196/2022 under sections 279/188/34 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act, 50,52,54,56 of Transportation of Animal Act 1978 and relevant provisions of MV act was registered. The arrest and seizure was made under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial and guidance of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma. In another action, rescuing 17 animals from a heavy truck, Rajouri police foiled a bovine smuggling bid and seized vehicle used in crime besides arresting the accused. A patrolling party of Police station Rajouri under the close supervision of SHO Rajouri Fareed Ahmed during routine checking at Salani bridge Rajouri intercepted a Truck and signaled it to stop but truck driver fled away from spot leaving the truck. The vehicle with registration number JK12A 2805 was found loaded with 17 bovines, which were rescued. In this connection, FIR No 365/2022 under sections 279/336/188 of IPC, 11 of PC Act 3 of PPD Act was registered at Police station Rajouri.

2 bootleggers arrested, 69 bottles of illicit liquor recovered

MIRAN SAHIB: Police on Thursday nabbed two bootleggers and recovered 69 bottles of illicit liquor from their possession. As per details, a police team under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Miran Sahib Inspr Zaheer Mushtaq laid Naka at Kotli Main Fateh and rounded up a suspect, identified as Ranjit Kumar, son of Harbans Lal, resident of Jindlar Tehsil R S Pura District Jammu. During search, 50 bottles of illicit liquor were recovered from his possession. The accused was arrested and FIR No. 70/2022 under sections 48(A) Excise Act was registered against him at Police Station Miran Sahib. Meanwhile, acting on a information received from reliable source regarding sale of illicit liquor at Panjtilla Samba, a party from Police Post Rakh Amb Talb apprehended one Ravinder Kumar; son of Krishan Chand, resident of Panjtilla, running a Chicken Shop. The accused was found selling illicit liquor to people at exorbitant rates to gain illegitimate profit. During search of shop, 19 bottles were recovered. FIR No. 170/2022 under section 48(A) of Excise Act was registered against accused at Police Station Samba.

3 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern the menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strat-

egy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams of Police Posts Gadigarh, Phallian Mandal and Border Police Post Sandwan acted stringently on the specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 3 different vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles included a tractor trolley without registration number seized by Gadigarh Police; a tipper (JK02CR-9844) seized by Phallian Mandal Police and a tractor trolley without registration number seized by Sandwan Police. The recoveries were made by Incharge Police Post Gadigarh SI Ravinder Singh, Gadigarh, Phallian Mandal-PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal and Sandwan- ASI Jang Bahadur in their respective jurisdictions.

Three lost bags containing cash recovered, returned to owner

As per details, a team of Police Post Canal Road while on patrolling duty in the area found three bags with some cash and artificial jewellery. On this, a team of Police Post Canal Road under supervision of DySP Hqrs Swati Sharma led by In-Charge Police Post Canal Road PSI Amreek Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, contacted the owner of lost bags, who was identified as Parnila Pardeep Suryawanshi, wife of Pardeep Suryawanshi, resident of Maharashtra Nagri, Gajanan Nagar. Lost bags containing Artificial jewellery and cash Rs 27,160 were handed over to owner.

Two theft cases solved; 3 arrested, 11 two-wheelers recovered

JAMMU/BARI BRAHMANA: Police on Thursday solved two theft cases by arresting three lifters and recovered 11 two-wheelers on their disclosure.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Pacea Danga regarding theft of a scooter from Mubarak Mandi area. After this, a team from Police Station Pacea Danga under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kahu led by SHO Pacea Danga Insp Raghunbir Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Panjtirthi PSI Rahul Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts and by connecting various leads, rounded up a suspect namely Dheeraj Singh alias Kaka, son of Deepak Singh, resident of Kanji House, Gummat at present Indira Nagar, Gadigarh. On thorough questioning, accused confessed his involvement in crime. On his disclosure, stolen scooter bearing registration number JK02BF2897 was recovered from his possession. Moreover, 5 more stolen scooters (JK02BK8429, JK02CA9640, JK02CA8356, JK21C7687 and JK02BF9807) were also recovered.

Samba Police also worked out case of bike-theft under the overall supervision of SSP Dr Abhishek Mahajan with arrest of 2 bike-lifters and recovery of 5 stolen bikes. During investigation of FIR No. 98/2022 under sections 379 of IPC registered at Police Station Vijaypur regarding theft of a motorcycle (Splendor Pro) bearing registration number JK21B/5173, a police team headed by SHO Vijaypur, Inspr Rajeev Kumar assisted by PSI Sajid Jaral, PSI Vikrant Kotwal and PSI Sudheer Singh Charak under supervision of SDPO Vijaypur, Priyanka Kumari arrested two suspects namely Karanjit Singh, son of Manjeet Singh, resident of Khour Deonian, R S Pura and Sandeep Kumar, son of Ashok Kumar, resident of Khour R S Pura. During sustained questioning, the accused confessed their involvement in theft case. Further on their disclosure, 4 more two-wheelers were recovered. The 5 motorbikes recovered by Police include Splendor (black & blue colour) without registration number; Chassis No MBLHA106FE04552; Super Splendor (black colour) registration number JK02BV/6277, Chassis No MBLJAR033H9G37703; Apache (red colour) registration number JK02AL/3075, Chassis No MD634KE482K24019; Discover (red colour) registration number JK02AP/1853, Chassis No. MD2USDSZZPCB79770 and Splendor Pro (black colour) registration number JK21B/5173, Chassis No MBLHA10BFE9L0099.

Woman among two narco-smugglers nabbed with 5 Kg Ganja

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Thursday nabbed two narco smugglers including a woman and recovered 5 Kg Ganja from their possession. As per details, a team of Police Station Bahu Fort led by SHO Bahu Fort Inspector Nayat Ali assisted by Incharge Police Post Bathindi Pasi Mohd Younis Khanday and Incharge Police Post Narwal SI Achal Rana, while on Naka duty, rounded up two suspects from Rajiv Nagar. On search 5 Kg Ganja was recovered from them.

The accused were identified as Btooti, son of Nek Ram and Meenu, wife of Ranchu, both residents of Rajeev Nagar. They were arrested and FIR No 183/22 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Bahu Fort. The overall arrests



and recoveries were made under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari.

Two drug peddlers arrested; wild cannabis destroyed

PULWAMA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Thursday arrested two drug peddlers and recovered contraband substance from their possession. Besides, wild cannabis was also destroyed in Sopore and Bandipora. As per details, a party from Police Station Litter at a checkpoint established at Naina intercepted a vehicle (Santro) bearing registration number CHO4K-0125 with two persons onboard, who were identified as Umar Bashir, son of Bashir Ahmad Dass, resident of Waghama, Bijbehara & Haroon Amin Sheikh, son of Mohd Amin Sheikh, resident of Naina Pulwama. During search, 30 Kg Bhukki was recovered from vehicle. The accused were arrested & shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Vehicle used in the commission of crime was also seized. In this regard, a case vide FIR No. 73/2022 under relevant section of law has been registered in Police Station Litter and investigation has been initiated. Besides in Sopore and Bandipora, Police along with excise department destroyed wild cannabis (Bhung) spread over vast areas of land at Rohama Rafiabab and Muqdamyari village of Hajin.

LMD Ramban books 5 traders, realises Rs 6,300 fine

RAMBAN: A team of Legal Metrology Department headed by Assistant Controller, Ramban Anil Kumar conducted market inspection in Ramban market on Thursday. During the drive, various trade establishments were inspected, particularly those dealing with grocery items, eatables, vegetables, fruits and medical equipment. The inspection team booked five traders for violation of Legal Metrology Act and collected a sum of Rs 6300 as fine from offenders. All the traders were directed to use only verified weighing and measuring instruments and not to indulge in overcharging and other unfair trade practices. The department further appealed requested all to remain cautious and exercise their right as vigilant consumers.

Accident victim cop succumbs
