JAMMU: Finally, the top 56 Indian visually impaired cricketers of the country, selected recently by Cricket Association for Blind in India (CABI), ahead of the 3rd T20 World Cup.

To begin with, the NTT DATA and Samarthanam Trust jointly sponsored the 12-day coaching camp for the top Indian blind cricketers, including two from J&K, prior to the mega event.

The coaching camp begins on July 11 and will take place on two grounds in Bengaluru. It will serve as the qualification pathway as the selection committee identifies the top 29 players for further coaching. 17 of the top 29 players will be selected to represent India at the upcoming Blind World Cup. "The stage is set for the beginning of qualification for the inaugural edition of our 3rd T20 World Cup. Thanks to NTT DATA for setting the tone for an exciting build-up to support the game of cricket for the visual-

ly impaired. Through this coaching and tournament series, the blind cricketers will be able to showcase their talents in front of the world and help them prepare for a transition by developing soft skills, strong work ethic, and leadership skills essential for their successful performance," said president CABI, Mahantesh G.K. Once chosen, the players will undergo sports and life skills training, including virtual digital and financial literacy classes leading to their participation in the T-20 World Cup for the Blind. The players will also receive a monthly stipend for five months to maintain their sports training and fitness schedules to prepare them for this prestigious international tournament.

It was informed in the orientation meeting that AMB strategy aims to strengthen the existing mechanisms and foster newer strategies for tackling anemia, focused on target beneficiary groups, through six interventions and six institutional mechanisms; to achieve the envisaged target under the POSHAN Abhiyan for addressing the issue of Anemia in Children, adolescents, pregnant & lactating women.
