JAMMU: Amid tight security, a fresh batch of over 3,000 pilgrims left here early Sunday for the Amarnath shrine in south Kashmir Himalayas, officials said.

Over 3.20 lakh pilgrims have so far paid obeisance at the cave shrine since the commencement of the pilgrimage from the twin tracks of Pahalgam in Anantnag and Baltal in Ganderbal districts on July 1.

"The 21st batch of 3,691 pilgrims left Bhagwati Nagar base camp Jammu for the valley in a convoy of 141 vehicles this morning," an official said.

He said while 2,203 pilgrims are heading for Pahalgam for their onward journey to the cave, 1,488 pilgrims are heading for Baltal

JAMMU: An alleged interstate heroin smuggler, wanted in connection with a firing incident, was arrested in Punjab and handed over to the Jammu and Kashmir Police for interrogation, police said on Sunday.

Neeraj Jaswal alias "Romi", a resident of Amritsar in Punjab, was the fourth accused arrested in connection with a firing incident at Rangoor near the International Border in Samba district during the intervening night of June 11 and 12, a police spokesman

He said Jaswal was work-

ates at the time of the midnight firing and had fled the scene on a motorcycle, taking advantage of darkness.

However, he was arrested by the Punjab Police on the request of the Jammu and Kashmir Police, the spokesman said, adding a police team from Samba was deputed to Punjab and has taken custody of Jaswal for interrogation.

BANIHAL: Two people were seriously injured on Sunday when they came under a landslide while working at a gypsum mine in Ramban district, police officials said. The landslide struck the

mine at Haroog area of Dharamkund, 26 km from Ramban district headquarters, trapping a JCB machine operator and a dumper driver, the officials said. They said police along State Disaster Response Force and local volunteers immediately launched a rescue operation and pulled out driver of earthmover Ajaz Ahmed of Bhathan-Ghandri Ramban and driver Anil Singh of Dhar Road Udhampur.

The two had suffered multiple injuries and were hospitalised, the officials said.

## 40 times more talk of good things happening in India: Bhagwat

MUMBAI: RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat on Sunday said the discussion on good things happening in the country now is at least 40 times more than the talk on the bad things happening.

He was speaking after inaugurating Dhankuvrben Babubhai Dhakan Hospital (Suvarna Hospital) in Kandivali suburb of north Mumbai in the presence of Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis.

"Many times negative discussions are heard. But when we go around the country and see, then we come to know that there is 40 times more discussion about the good things that are happen-

ing, than there is talk of the bad things happening in India," Bhagwat said.

"The reason for the utkarsh (rise) of the country today is due to government's policies and the work of responsible in government. people Things are also running

smoothly because some people don't do anything. If they work, then there will be problems," he said.

Bhagwat said that the desire among people to see India gain glory is more powerful today than it was 40 years ago. "This should

There are people who don't want to see our rise, the RSS chief said. "It is not just roti, kapda
