HC dismisses appeal in absence of any fault in impugned order maintable because the plaintiff who has execut-

Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal, Judge High Court of Jammu and Kashmir & Ladakh has dismissed the appeal in the appeal $\rm MA\,$ No 10/2023 (O&M) of Raj Kumar Gupta filed against the impugned order dated 9-5-2023 passed by Ist Additional District Judge, Jammu (Court below for short) in No 1A/01/2-23 titled Raj Kumar Gupta vs Bank of India and anr. Counsel for the appellant Adv Parveen Kapahi claimed that plaintiff filed a suit in the Court below for declaration that the deed of further charge of Mortgage of land cum additional mortgage dated 17-2-2014 and mortgage dated 06-2-2014 respectively executed by the plaintiff in favour of the defendant Bank as null and void and not operative and not legally enforceable and cannot be acted upon by the defendants for alienation in any manner being honest in the eyes of law. The learned counsel for the defendant Jugal Kishore Gupta opposed the arguments and vehemently argued the suit filed by the plantiff as said that it was not

ed the mortgage deeds in favour of defendants is stopped from challenging and the plaintiff had not approached the court with clean hands and suppressed the material facts. Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal said that I have gone through the order passed by the court below which is impugned in the present appeal and I do not find any illegality. The reasons which have been spelt out in the order impugned are well founded and cannot be interfered with.

Justice Nargal further said that the reasons stated herein above and in the light of the aforesaid settled legal position coupled with facts and circumstances of the case, no fault can be found with the observation of learned court

The appellant has failed to point out any illegality much less impropriety in the well reasoned order impugned in the present appeal. Consequently, the present appeal being bereft of any merit, is dismissed and the impugned
