Modi announces 'Meri Maati Mera Desh' campaign to honour martyrs


NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday announced that a 'Meri Maati Mera Desh' campaign will be launched in the run up to Independence Day to honour the martyred bravehearts of the country.

In his monthly Mann Ki Baat radio broadcast, Modi said that with 'Amrit Mohatsav' resonating everywhere and August 15 near, a big campaign is being launched in the country 'Meri Maati Mera Desh'.

He said the campaign will be launched to honour the martyred bravehearts and programmes will be organised across India in memory of those who laid down their lives for the country.

"Special inscriptions will be installed in lakhs of village panchayats of the country in memory of these personalities," Modi said.

An 'Amrit Kalash Yatra' will also be taken out during



this campaign, he said. "This 'Amrit Kalash Yatra' carrying the soil in 7,500 'kalash' from villages and various corners of the country, will reach Delhi. This yatra will also carry plants from various parts of the country. From 7,500 kalash. soil and plants that will

come, an 'Amrit Vatika' will

be built close to the National War Memorial," the Prime Minister said.

In his radio address, Modi also hailed the changes made by the government in the Haj policy in the past few years and said now more and more people are getting an opportunity to go for the annual

Over 4,000 women were able to perform Haj without 'Mehram' or a male companion which he said was a "big change", the prime minister

He said Muslim women who recently came back from Haj wrote to him.

"Their Haj was very special as they performed the pilgrimage without 'Mehram'. Their number is not 50 or 100 but over 4,000. This is a big change," Modi said while pointing out that earlier Muslim women were not allowed to perform Haj without 'Mehram'.

"Through Mann ki Baat, I would also like to thank the Saudi Government," he said.

"The changes made in the Haj policy in the last few years are being appreciated. Our Muslim mothers and sisters have written a lot to me. Now more and more people are getting an opportunity to go for Haj," the prime

JAMMU: A fresh batch of 1,974 pilgrims, including 363 women, left Jammu city in a convoy of 85 vehicles early Sunday for the twin base camps in Kashmir to perform $_{

Over 3.85 lakh pilgrims have so far paid their obeisance at the shrine since the beginning of the 62-day-long yatra on July 1.

The yatra is scheduled to end on Shravan Purnima' coinciding with Raksha Bandhan festival on August 31 with the holy mace of lord Shiva reaching the shrine.

The 28th batch of pilgrims comprising 1,974 pilgrims, who also included 45 Sadhus and 16 Sadhvis, left Bhagwati Nagar base camp in Jammu for Kashmir in a convoy of 85 vehicles escorted by security personnel between 3.30 am and 3.45

SRINAGAR: An army soldier on leave has gone missing from his native Kulgam district of Jammu and Kashmir leading to security forces launching a massive search and rescue operation, officials said on Sunday. The father of the soldier, posted in the Ladakh region, said he was supposed to join work on Sunday.

Javaid Ahmad Wani, a resident of Achathal area of Kulgam district, went missing on Saturday evening. His car was found at Paranhall, they said. His father has appealed to those who might have

MES worker found hanging inside army camp in Samba

SAMBA: A 22-year-old civilian worker allegedly committed suicide by hanging himself with a rope inside an army camp in Samba district on Sunday, officials said. Sunil Kumar, a resident of Batala area in Punjab's Gurdaspur, was found hanging with a ceiling fan inside his room in the camp at Bari Brahmana, the officials said. They said Kumar, who was posted at Military Engineer Services (MES) power station, had apparently committed suicide during the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday. However, the motive behind Kumar taking such an extreme step was not known immediately, the officials said, adding that police have shifted the body to a hospital for post-mortem and also started inquest proceedings.

SAMBA: The Jammu and Kashmir Police on Sunday said it has nabbed from Samba district a key accused in an attack on a police party in April, making it the eighth arrest in the case.


Farman Ali alias "DC", a resident of Rakh Barotian, was allegedly involved in the April 6 attack on the police party near his village when they had gone to arrest suspected drug peddlers, a police spokesperson said.

Ali, a notorious heroin smuggler, used to frequently change his identity and locations to evade arrest, the spokesman said, adding he was arrested by a police party from Vijaypur. Senior Samba

Superintendent of Police (SSP) Benam Tosh said all criminals and smugglers involved in the attack would be brought to justice.
