

KUPWARA: In order to have an on-the-spot assessment of developmental issues of the residents and traders community of Kupwara town, the Deputy Commissioner Kupwara Ayushi Sudan on Wednesday evening undertook a surprise visit to Kupwara town.

The DC paid a visit of Bus stand Kupwara, Jamia Market, Iqbal market, lane Kupwara, Byepass Kupwara, Rigipora bus stand and other markets of the town and had an on-spot assessment of development, sanitation and other facilities being provided to the people.

The DC was accompanied by Tehsildar Kupwara, CEO Municipality, Kupwara ARTO Kupwara, Chairman traders federation Kupwara, chairman bus association Kupwara, and other concerned officers from district administration and Police.

Apart from becoming main tourism attractions these parks have become sources of generation of livelihood for several families living in the close vicinity of these

With slight increase in temperatures in Kupwara and other parts of North Kashmir these days, the rush of visitors has grown manifold as visitors in large numbers are seen enjoying varied flora,



fauna and cool temperature of these parks located in the foothills of lush green and thick forests.

The officials of the department estimate that per month on an average around 50,000 local visitors pay a visit to these Ecoparks

of these parks. This Park has a natural forest setting, open class room facility for students, and informative edu-

cational signage installed for engaging students and educating them about the importance of forests

Nagriwari-Eco-Park is an ideal location for visitors to enjoy cool breeze, ideal ambiance, captivating views and serenity of nature. Park offers a peaceful retreat for nature lovers and adventure enthusiasts with infrastructure adventurous activities. Besides, it provides immense opportunities for Nature Walks, Bird Watching, Photography, etc.

Nagriwari -Eco Park has been established under Scheme "Green India Mission" with the project cost of Rs.7.178 lacs during the year 2021-22. This Eco-Park has got an average tourist foot-fall of 15,000 per month, besides providing livelihood directly to 65 fami-

Satbaran Eco-Park remains the tourist hub as a large number of tourists' daily throng there to see the famous Satbaran Caves and simultaneously enjoy the scintillating environs of Satnarn Eco-

Satbaran Eco- Park has got a foot-fall of 12000 visitors per month on an average, besides the park is providing livelihood to 25 families. Being an ideal location for adventure, sightseeing, camping and trekking, Satbaran Eco-

SRINAGAR: In response to news item carried out by a local daily regarding widening of the 2-km left out stretch of the National Highway in south Kashmir's Anantnag town, the news report is factually incorrect and NHIDCL was not consulted before

According to NHIDCL communique, the works on km 235 (Vailoo) to km 263(Donipawa) has been completed recently by NHIDCL while as the works on stretch from km 193 (Sinthanpass) to km 235 (Vailoo) is under maintenance as part of NH-244. The stretch from existing $_{
m km}$ (Donipwa) to km 265 i.e. Janglatmandi (2 km stretch under consideration) is not part of project, it adds.

The communique adds that a new bypass from km NH-244 263on

(Donipawa) to Alstop on NH-44 (8.47 km length) is under construction and is expected to be completed by October 2023 and the Donipwa- Janglatmandi stretch will be completely bypassed as traffic coming from Jammu and destined to NH- 244 will take this

new bypass.

Moreover, airing is also proposed to be formed (under DPR stage) by construction of bypass Bypass) (Khanabal between Sursunoo (NH-44) and Bumzoo (NH-501) and link road between Mattan (NH-501) and Achabal (NH-244), it savs.

The communique adds that with the construction of this airing, the stretch of Donipwa- Janglatmandi will bypassed from both sides and traffic from NH-44 to NH-501 and NH-244 will take these roads thus decongesting the stretch.
