SRINAGAR: Director General of Police J&K Dilbag Singh on Wednesday visited Baltal and took a review of the security arrangements and other facilities put in place at the Base Camp. He also inspected the deployments enroute from Srinagar to Baltal.

The DGP was accompanied by Div Com Kashmir Vijay Kumar Bidhuri and SSP Ganderbal Nikhil Borker and other officers from Ganderbal District.

During his visit, the DGP reviewed arrangements at Baltal, and enroute and also inspected parking facilities for yatri vehicles, besides the communication arrangements. He also took stock of the CCTV Cameras, drones, and additional security measures aimed to monitor the security of the Yatris. He also visit-
