# 84 Bn CRPF Mobile Medical Assistance Team evacuates critically ill Amarnathji pilgrim

JAMMU: During Shri Amarnathji Pilgrimage, Hq 84 Bn CRPF Coys are deployed in Ramban and Udhampur Districts and performing operationally very sensitive ROP duty on NH 44.

The Bn is ensuring smooth passage of Yatri, Security Force Convoys and other vehicles, over a stretch of more than 40 km, in Udhampur & Ramban Districts of J&K.

In addition to providing security on NH 44, along the Yatra route, 84 Bn CRPF has placed a Mobile Medical Assistance Team, led by Dr Anu Gorke, SMO, at the Yatri convoy halting point, to respond to any medical emergencies,

other on the spot health-care requirements, etc, of the Yatri, during their halt, since the beginning of the Yatra.

On Thursday, an information was received that a

female yatri namely Vimla (57 y), resident of Surat Gujarat is in critical condition, inside a Yatri Bus, bearing Reg No JK 02Y/0774, at Chanderkote halting point. The 84 Bn

CRPF Medical Assistance team, led by Dr Anu Gorke, immediately rushed inside the bus and immediately evacuated the patient in CRPF Ambulance to District Hospital Ramban, where ECG was taken, whose report indicated suspected Myocardial Infarction (Heart Attack). After initial management, District Hospital Ramban further referred the patient to the Tertiary Care Centre, GMC Jammu.

The patient was accompanied by her husband and a co-yatri. Her husband and the co-yatri thanked the 84 Bn CRPF Team, for timely intervention and extending necessary assistance to the patient and

other needy Yatris, enroute.

N Ranbir Singh Commandant 84 Bn, who was also present on the spot, supervised the episode and visited the patient at District Hospital Ramban, to check her condition.

He coordinated with the District Administration to facilitate immediate medical attention and for providing an Ambulance to transship the patient further to GMC Jammu.

He further assured that the Mobile Medical Assistance Team of 84 Bn will remain on duty, at the same point, for medical assistance to the needy Yatris, till the SANJY 23 concludes.
