## Include uncovered areas under JJM, RSY Schemes: Khatana

Parliament, Er. Gulam Ali Khatana hasurged Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha to extend the coverage of two crucial welfare schemes to the remaining remote areas of Jammu and Kashmir.

The MP emphasized the need to bring the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and the Rooftop Solar Yojana (RSY) schemes to all citizens of the Union Territory, regardless of geographical barriers.

"The scheme aims to provide 300 units of free electricity every month to light up one crore households. The objective of this scheme is to reduce the electricity costs of the house by installing rooftop solar panels and using solar energy", the MP said.

However, Khatana pointed out that several remote areas remain uncovered by these schemes.

He specifically mentioned Gulabgarh in Reasi district, Marwah Sub Division of Kishtwar district, and various areas in Ramban, Doda, Rajouri,

and Poonch districts. Khatana commended Lt. Governor Sinha's public outreach program, which has provided a platform for citizens to voice their concerns directly to the administration.

He stressed that immediate attention is required in areas still lacking basic amenities like potable

water and electricity. The MP expressed hope that the administration would achieve 100% coverage by providing drinking water and electricity to the remaining population.
