JKMEF delegation meets Director Health Jammu, discusses issues

JAMMU: A delegation from the JKMEF, led by Sushil Sudan, President, met with Dr. Rakesh Mangotra, Director Health Services Jammu, to discuss several pressing issues affecting health employees in

The delegation emphasized the urgent need for regular Departmental Promotion Committees (DPC) for all categories of employees. They referred to Government Administrative Department (GAD) Order SRO-166 of 2005, which mandates biannual DPCs in January and July. They noted that the last DPC was conducted in July 2023. This issue underscores the importance of career progression and filling vacant positions within the health sector.

Despite the announcement by the Lieutenant Governor regarding COVID incentives healthcare (Doctors Rs. 10,000/-, Para Medical Rs. 7,000/-, and Drivers/Class IV Rs. 5,000/-), the delegation expressed concern that these incentives have not been disbursed to health employees

They highlighted that GMC and associated hospitals have received these incentives earlier, contrasting with delays in other health facilities.

The delegation advocated for

Government Pharmacists to align with practices in other states. This proposal aims to standardize job titles and possibly reflect expanded roles or responsibilities

They proposed the creation of critical positions such as Head Ophthalmic Technicians in District hospitals and Junior Ophthalmic Technicians in Primary Health Centers (PHCs). Additionally, they sought the upgradation or creation of Senior Pharmacists' posts in upgraded sub-centers, aiming to enhance healthcare delivery at various levels.

Rationalization of staff refreezing of technical posts, and the implementation of the Comprehensive Health Insurance (CGH) scheme were highlighted as crucial for the welfare and efficiency of health employees. These measures are intended to streamline operations and ensure equitable dis-

To improve operational efficiency, the delegation proposed the creation of more Junior Pharmacist posts at PHC and Community Health Center (CHC) levels. They also advocated for the establishment of Block Pharmacy Officers and District Pharmacy Officers to oversee pharmaceutical servic-

es at local and district levels. They stressed the need for creating Head OT Technicians in all District hospitals and Technical Officer posts in newly established District hospitals. Additionally, the estab-

lishment of District Training Centers (DTCs) in newly created districts was proposed to enhance technical expertise and support across the region.

The delegation urged expedited reorganization for the post of Electricians, aiming to improve infrastructure maintenance and support services within healthcare

JAMMU: In a unique gesture, Government Medical College (GMC) Jammu on Monday unveiled the statue of renowned ancient Maharishi Physician, Sushruta, the listed author of the Sushruta Samhita (Sushruta's Compendium), a treatise considered to be one of the most important surviving ancient treatises on medicine and is considered a foundational text of Ayurveda.

Hailed as "Father of Plastic Surge", Maharishi Sushruta was a towering figure and is often described as the Indian counterpart of Hippocrates. The stone statue weighing 3.5 ton and measuring three feet, crafted in black marble was unveiled by the Principal &

Speaking on the occasion, Dr Ashutosh Gupta, said that Maharishi Sushruta, was an ancient Indian surgeon and is known as the Father of Surgery and it is unfortunate that in spite of his glorious contribution to the medicine and surgery, only a handful of such tributes are found in India and Worldwide...

Continuing , Dr. Gupta said that "Sushruta Samhita' is an ancient Sanskrit text on Medicine and Surgery written by the Maharshi and one of the most important such treatises on this subject to survive

His works complied as 'Sushruta

describes 60 types of Upkarma for treatment of wounds, 120 surgical instruments, 300 surgical procedures and classifies human surgeries in 8 categories.

For Sushruta, the concept of Shalya Tantra (surgical science) was all-encompassing. Examples of some of his ground breaking operations include rhinoplasty (the repairing or remaking of a nose), removal of a dead fetus and lithotomy (surgical incision into hollow organs such as urinary bladder to remove stones, or calculi). He also developed many unique and practical techniques to dissect the human body and study its structure, Dr Gupta said.
