of FASTag on the windscreen leads to unnecessary delays at the toll plazas causing inconvenience to fellow National Highway users

"Detailed Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) has been ssued to all User Fee Collection Agencies and Concessionaires to charge double user fee in case of non-affixation of FASTag on the front windshield," it said.

According to the statement, the information will also be prominently displayed at all User Fee plazas, informing highway users about the penalties for non-compliance of entering a toll lane without a fixed FASTag on front windshield.

In addition, the statement said CCTV footage with Vehicle Registration Number (VRN) at the fee plaza shall be recorded of the non-affixed FASTag cases. This will help in maintaining proper record regarding the fee charged and presence of the vehicle in the toll lane.

In accordance with already established rules, the statement said NHAI aims to enforce the standard procedural guidelines for affixation of FASTag on the front windshield of the assigned vehicle from inside

The statement said any FASTag that is not affixed on the assigned vehicle as per standard process is not entitled to carry out Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) transaction at a User Fee Plaza and will have to pay double toll fee as well as can be duly blacklisted.

Issuer banks have also been directed to ensure fixation of the FASTag to the assigned vehicle on the front windshield at the time of issuance from various Point-of-Sale (POS), it

NHAI collects user fee on National Highways as per the National Highway Fee (Determination of Rates and Collection) Rules, 2008. At present, user fee is collected for approximately 45,000 km of National Highways and Expressways at around 1,000 Toll Plazas on National Highways across the country.

With a penetration rate of around 98 per cent and over 8 erore users, FASTag has revolutionized the Electronic Toll Collection system in the country.

This initiative of charging a double user fee for non-affixation of FASTag will help to make toll operations more efficient and ensure seamless & comfortable journeys for the National

In a separate incident, security forces guarding a forward post opened fire after observing suspicious movement near the Line of Control (LoC) in the Sunderbani sector of Rajouri district late Wednesday night.

The area was searched on Thursday morning but nothing linked to the suspicious movement was found on the ground, the officials said.

On the search operation in Doda, launched following the martyrdom of the four soldiers, including a captain, the officials said despite inclement weather and challenging terrain, security forces are conducting the operation to track down the terrorists. They are determined to eliminate them and restore peace in the area, they added. "Security forces on the ground are engaged in a well-coordi-

nated operation against terrorists with whom we had contact vesterday and today as well. The operation is under progress and we will get success soon," Deputy Inspector General of Police, Doda-Kishtwar and Ramban Range, Shridhar Patil told reporters in Kastigarh, around 30 km from the spot of the Monday attack

He, however, refused to share more details citing the continuation of the operation.

On Thursday attack, the officials said the terrorists after opening fire on the temporary camp inside the school building fled into a dense forest area.

Three terrorists were killed in a day-long operation in the Gandoh area of the district on June 26, while another encounter occurred in the Ghadi Bhagwah forest on July 9.

Since the beginning of this year, 27 people, including 11 security personnel, a Village Defence Guard and five terrorsts, have lost their lives in nearly a dozen terror attacks in six districts of the Jammu province.

The officials said Additional Director General of Police (ADGP), Law and Order, Vijay Kumar will oversee operations against the terrorists who infiltrated from across the border and are hiding in the higher reaches of otherwise peaceful Jammu region.

Trivedi referred to the killing of former Japanese prime minister Shinzo Abe and the recent assassination attempt on Donald Trump to make the point. In this context, Trivedi referred to the Ishrat Jahan case, saying the CBI, which reports to the central government, changed its first affidavit that called her a terrorist for political reasons as she was targeting Modi. She along with her accomplishes were killed in an encounter in 2004 by the Gujarat police. The Congress-led UPA was in power at the Centre at that time.

Court rejects plea of Budgam police for installing GPS anklet device on alleged OGW of JeM

JAMMU: Special Judge NIA Court Srinagar Sandeep Gandotra on Thursday rejected the plea of Nowgam police for installing the GPS anklet Device on Fayaz Ahmed Gani who is alleged OGW of JeM. While rejecting the plea, Special Judge CourtSrinagar Sandeep Gandotra observed that conditions have already been imposed upon the accused at the time of granting bail to him, this court is of the humble opinion that the present application for installing the global positioning system (GPS) anklet device should not be allowed because the object of bail conditions cannot be to keep a constant vigil on the movement of accused enlarged on bail. The investigation agency cannot be permitted

to continuously peep into the private life of accused enlarged on bail, by imposing arbitrary conditions since that will violate the right of privacy of accused as guaranteed under Article 21 of the Constitution. If a constant vigil is kept on every of movement accused released on bail by the use of technology or otherwise, it would infringe the rights of accused guaranteed under Article 21 including the right to privacy. The reason is that the effect of keeping such constant vigil on the accused by imposing drastic bail conditions would amount to keeping the accused in some condition of confinement even after he is released on bail and in the humble opinion of this court such a condition should not be a condition

Four absconders apprehended

RAMBAN: Jammu and Kashmir Police in District Ramban in a significant breakthrough, has successful-

arrested absconders, three were evading arrest since last 24 years and one was evading arrest since last 11 years. The arrest of the absconders was made possible by a special team constituted by SSP Ramban Sh. Anuj Kumar IPS. General warrant of arrest against the absconders were issued by the Hon'ble Court.The dedicated team of Police Station Ramban with meticulous efforts and advanced technical assistance arrested the absconders which include Firoz Ahmed, son of Gulam Rasool, from Kulgam, involved in FIR No. 177/2000 U/S 188RPC, 3 PCA Act, Faiz Ulla, son of Abdulla Wani from Kulgam. Gh Nabi, son of Ghulam Qadir Wani from Kulgam, both were involved in FIR No. 77/2000 U/S 279/427 RPC; Sonu, son of Karan Singh from Palampura. Kulgam, involved in FIR No. 73/2013 U/S 279/337/338 RPC. It is to mention that Parveen Kumar, son of Daleep Singh from Teli Bagwara, Hamirpur, HP, involved in FIR No. 92/2011 U/S 8/15 NDPS Act, was found to have passed away; hence, the search for him was closed upon verification of his death certificate, and a report was submitted to the court of law

This operation underscores the relentless efforts of the Ramban Police to bring absconders to justice and maintain the rule of law. The arrested individuals were produced before the court of law for further legal proceedings.

Bail denied in fraud case

JAMMU: Principal Sessions Judge Jammu Sanjay Parihar has rejected the bail application of Saleem Yousaf Bhatti, son of Mohd Yousaf Bhatti of Mendhar, who was arrested in loan fraud case.

After hearing APP Anil Magotra for the Crime Branch, Principal Sessions Jammu Sanjay Judge Parihar observed, accused has submitted that he is innocent and asserted that he is the sole breadwinner of his family. However, it is the duty of the court to safeguard the interests of justice and protect the integrity of the criminal justice system"

The petitioner, Saleem Yousaf Bhatti, had previously applied for bail in the trial court where he faces charges under sections 419, 420, 465, 467, 468, 471, and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, based on FIR No: 86/2023 titled "U.T of J&K vs Saleem Yousaf and Ors."

His earlier bail application was denied, with the main allegation being that he obtained loans from J&K Bank Ltd using fake documents and did not repay

The petitioner claims innocence and asserts that he is entitled to post-arrest bail, especially since three coaccused have already been granted bail under similar circumstances. He undertakes to cooperate with the trial and comply with all court-imposed conditions The prosecution opposes

bail, asserting that the petitioner orchestrated a significant fraud, defrauding the bank of crores using forged documents and fictitious accounts. They argue that due to the gravity of the offenses and the potential for tampering with evidence, bail should not be granted.

According to the police Saleem Yousaf Bhatti, in collaboration with co-accused Mohd Safeer, conspired to fraudulently obtain loans from J&K Bank using forged salary certificates and other documents. causing substantial financial losses to the public excheq-

The petitioner, an employee of IWMP Poonch, allegedly misused his position to activate inactive accounts and facilitate the fraudulent transactions. It's alleged that the fraud involved around Rs. 6 crores, and investigations are ongoing regarding the involvement of bank officials

The petitioner's counsel Advocate K. Kotwal with Advocate Fahim A Mir, argues for bail based on the grounds of parity with coaccused who have been granted bail and cites the case law emphasizing that bail is a rule and not to be withheld as punishment unless justified by exceptional circumstances.

However, the prosecution contends that the petitioner's role as the mastermind of the fraud and the seriousness of the charges militate against granting bail.

After careful consideration of the arguments and the facts presented, including the seriousness of the charges, the court finds that the petitioner's alleged offenses are grave and involve significant financial frand

The court notes the petitioner's attempted escape and apprehension, which underscores the risk of flight. Given the absence of changed circumstances since the previous bail application and the ongoing nature of investigations, the court concludes that the petitioner does not merit bail at this stage.

"The bail application of Saleem Yousaf Bhatti is hereby denied based on the seriousness of the allegations, the risk of flight, and the ongoing investigations,
