Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India. The petition sought directions to protect the fundamental rights of the parents of the late Harsh Nagotra, ensuring their ability to perform the last rites of their son.

However, DB dismissed the petition stating that the parents of deceased-Harsh Nagotra have projected their grievance before the Court and requested for early retrieval of their son's body from Pakistan, therefore this PIL is not maintainable on the instance of Indu Bhushan Bali.

"As such, we are not inclined to entertain this PIL and the same is accordingly, dismissed", the Court observed.
