Court acquits Patwari in trap case

JAMMU: Special Judge Anti-Corruption Rajouri-Poonch Districts, Melmood Chowdhary, has acquitted Altaf Ahmed, a Patwari Halaqa Kandi, of charges related to demanding and accepting a bribe.
The case involved a complaint lodged by Mohammad Arif from Kandi, Tehsil Kotranka Rajouri, who alleged that Ahmed demanded Rs. 12,000 for processing a revenue document to partition land between him and his brother.
According to the chargesheet, on July 17, 2010, Arif reported to I.L.K. Nazir, DySP of the PR wing of the Vigilance Organization Jammu, that Ahmed had initially accepted Rs. 10,000 as a bribe and subsequently demanded an additional Rs. 1,500 for completing the required mutation entry. Arif, facing a compulsion, sought legal intervention before paying the additional bribe.
During the trial, Judge Chowdhary found that the prosecution failed to substantiate both the initial demand and the demand made at the time of the trap. Moreover; there was no proof of the bribe being accepted or recovered from Ahmed. As a result, the prosecution did not meet the burden of proving the charges under Section 5(2) of the J&K Prevention of Corruption Act, Svt. 2006, and Section 161 RPC. Consequently, Ahmed was acquitted of all charges, and his personal and surety bonds were discharged.

JKSAC expresses concerns over Govt's decision affecting registration of state lands allotted to 1947 POJK DPs

JAMMU: Jammu Kashmir Sharmarthi Action Committee (JKSAC) expressed grave concerns over the government's recent decision affecting the registration of state lands allotted to Displaced Persons (DPs) from 1947 POJK. The JKSAC has criticized this move, labeling it as unjust and damaging, and called for the government to clarify its stance on Government Order No. 254-C of 1965, which granted proprietary rights to these DPs. They have also demanded that the government publicly disclose the order that halted land registrations. JKSAC leaders, including President Gurdev Singh, in a meeting on Tuesday, emphasized that DPs have held these rights for over 50 years, following significant struggles and achievements under various orders and acts. They argued that the current restrictions violate these established rights and are not legally justified. Despite repeated appeals to senior officials, including the Lt. Governor, no effective resolution has been reached. The JKSAC has warned that if the government does not revoke this ban by the end of September 2024, they may resort to widespread agitation across Jammu.
