Khoon village deputation calls on DC Udhampur; demands streamlining of healthcare services

JAMMU: A deputation of prominent locals from Khoon village of Majalta Tehsil on Tuesday called on Deputy Commissioner (DC), Udhampur, Saloni Rai, to apprise her of their issues and concerns seeking an early redressal of the same.

The deputation, led by known social activist and Chairperson DAHWA Surat Sing Sumbria, was comprised of Sudesh Kumar, Charan Das, Surjit

Singh, Attar Singh, Pravin Kumar, Sanjiv Kumar and Jagannath.

The grievances, projected during the meeting, primarily pertained to streamlining of healthcare services in the area. These issues inter alia included staff shortage in PHC Khoon, filling up of two vacant posts of MBBS, recalling of Allopathic Medical Assistant attached with another dispensary, dysfunctional ambulance, recalling of Basic Health

Worker, deployment of X-ray technician, round the clock availability of doctors and paramedical staff and others.

The deputation also demanded deployment of a lady MBBS doctor in Khoon PHC for three days of every week till the permanent posts are not filled up.

They apprised the DC that there is only a single ambulance, at present, catering to the requirement of five PHCs of the

area and despite the availability of X-ray machine in the PHC it cannot be made operational due to non availability of the technician. They added that the pharmacist posted in Sundla Sub Centre has also been attached to another Sub Centre further hampering the functioning of the PHC.

Explaining about the plight of accident victims of the area, the deputation informed the DC that the locals and outsiders as well

have to face grave trouble whenever some accident occurs in the area due to lack of requisite staff in Khoon PHC.

The Deputy Commissioner assured the deputation that all their issues would be resolved at the earliest.

Later, the deputation met the Executive Engineer, PDD, and apprised him of their issues concerning poor power supply in the area. They demanded feasible reduction in sched-

uled power curtailments besides stoppage of frequent unscheduled cuts. They also apprised him that there are some addresses who are receiving heavy electricity bills despite the fact that they don't even have the poles and wires connected to their houses.

The Executive Engineer took serious notice of these issues of grave concern while assuring the deputation of early redressal of their issues.
