Install new borewell in ward 54 to improve water availability: TNWS

JAMMU: The Trikuta Nagar Welfare Society (TNWS), under the leadership of R.P Kakkar, President of TNWS Jammu, convened to address several pressing issues affecting the residents of Trikuta Nagar colony in Jammu. One of the foremost concerns discussed was the inadequate drinking water supply. Residents expressed dissatisfaction and called for the installation of a new borewell in ward 54 to improve water availability. Additionally, the society proposed a significant infrastructure project-which aims to permanently solve the drinking

water problem not only for Trikuta Nagar but also for Jammu City as a whole. The meeting also scrutinized the inefficiencies in garbage collection services provided by the Jammu Municipal Corporation. Residents complained of irregularities in door-to-door garbage collection and pointed out that sanitation workers lacked essential tools and machinery necessary for effective waste management. Despite acknowledging the dedication of the existing staff, there was a strong plea for better resources to ensure satisfactory sanitation services in the colony. Regarding infrastructure maintenance, the society highlighted issues with

street lights. It was noted that the repair and replacement of street lights often faced delays due to inadequate stock and resources. A solution proposed was the establishment of a command control room to oversee street light operations, aiming to automate the on/off cycles based on daylight conditions to conserve energy. This initiative also aims to address the problem of street lights being unnecessarily left on during daylight hours, thereby reducing energy wastage. Concerns were also raised about the effectiveness of recently constructed speed breakers on main roads within the colony.

Residents reported that these speed breakers were not sufficiently reducing vehicle speeds or preventing accidents. A recommendation was made to reconstruct the speed breakers using more durable concrete materials and to ensure they cover drainage systems effectively, thereby enhancing road safety measures. Lastly, the meeting addressed recent power supply issues experienced by residents. There were reports of prolonged power cuts attributed to damaged 11 Kv network cables at various locations in the colony. Residents urged the concerned authorities to replace these damaged cables with overhead lines to improve the

reliability of the power supply. The meeting was attended by prominent community members including Ashok Kumar Arora, Sandeep Sharma, Madam Rubal Mahajan, Krishan Lal Gupta, V. K. Suri, Harshvardhan Gupta, S. N. Kaul, and Dr. T. R. Gupta, along with a significant number of Trikuta Nagar residents. The outcome of the meeting emphasized the urgent need to communicate these issues to Chief Secretary Sh. Atal Dulhu for swift action and the allocation of sufficient funds to address these critical infrastructure and service delivery concerns in Trikuta Nagar, Jammu.

District Development Council Kathua approves Annual plan for 2024-25

KATHUA: To finalise the developmental plan under District Capex Budget 2024-2025, District Development Council Kathua met under the Chairmanship of Col (Retd) Mahan Singh here today in the conference Hall of DC Office Complex. DC Kathua Rakesh Minhas; Vice Chairman, DDC, Raghunandan Singh; DDC members, ADDC Kathua, Surinder Mohan, Chief Planning Officer Ranjeet Thakur; ACD, ACP, CMO, CEO, XEN PHE, XEN Irrigation, XEN PMGSY, BDOs besides other District officers attended the meeting. At the outset, DC apprised the council that in view of the end of the tenure of BDCs and Sarpanchs, the government has assigned the task of Plan formulation to the respective BDOs of the Block as Administrators. "The BDOs have drafted the plan in consultation with concerned PRIs with the focus on creating substantial development assets especially in Health and Education Sectors, besides taking up maximum number of convergence works under MGNREGA," he added.

The DDC council members, after detailed deliberations, unanimously approved the Capex Plan pegged at ₹ 90, 30,14,000/- to meet development needs of the district. The Council also unanimously passed the resolution that the allocated funds shall be used for the capital projects of allocated sectors. Besides, it decided to give priority to projects that align with the district's strategic developmental goals as outlined in the plan. The meeting also resolved that the District Administration shall provide quarterly reports to the DDC on the progress of capital projects and expenditures wherein District Treasurer is authorized to disburse funds in accordance with the approved budget and subject to applicable financial regulations. Earlier, DDC Chairman Col (Retd) Mahan Singh exhorted the council members to focus on the projects of public importance under current allocation of district Capex so as to meet the popular development aspirations of the people. Underscoring the need to complete the projects of critical importance, DDC Chairman said

JJM projects under implementation across the district will give relief to the inhabitants especially residing in kandi and hilly pockets of the region. The Chairman DDC Kathua also highlighted the issue of some pending Flood protection assets to which XEN Flood Control apprised that major flood protection works are under execution, further informed that some works are to be completed through NABARD funding. While reviewing the JPDCL sector, the council highlighted the issue of erratic power supply, lack of electric poles and delay in execution of tendered works, the DC directed AEE JPDCL to look into the matter besides fixing responsibilities of the concerned contractors to execute the works within stipulated timelines. The DDC Chairperson urged all the DDC members and District officers to coordinate with each other in execution of rational plans maintaining the sanctity of the 3-tier system of Panchayati Raj. Vice Chairman Raghunandan Singh exhorted upon the need to make quality asset creation within timelines alongwith playing joint supervisory role by Officers and Elected PRIs. Earlier, CPO Kathua gave a powerpoint presentation on the sector wise funds earmarked for the works.

PMAY-G - A reason for Joy & Relief for Wazir Ahmed & lakhs of others
