Suryaputri Tawi Aarti to commence from today: Com JMC

JAMMU: Commissioner, Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC), Dr. Devansh Yadav, on Monday announced that the much-awaited Suryaputri Tawi Aarti will commence from July 1, 2025 and will be held daily at 7:00 pm on the banks of River Tawi. The announcement was made during a press conference jointly addressed with Director Information and Public Relations, Nitish



pilgrimage, covering sanitation, water supply, public conveniences and street lighting. Additionally, a dedicated helpline is being launched in partnership with the Directorate of Information and Public Relations to assist pilgrims and the general public. As part of the Clean Jammu, Green Jammu campaign, pilgrims halting in Jammu will be encouraged to take part in plantation drives, contributing to environmental sustainability. "We want every pilgrim to take back not just blessings, but also a green memory of Jammu," Dr. Yadav remarked.

During the meeting, the Director emphasized the need for organizing training sessions on PAI across all districts and blocks, ensuring full participation of relevant personnel.

He directed that the data under PAI must be fact-based and aligned with ground realities and should be personally monitored by Assistant Commissioners Panchavat (ACPs) and Block Development Officers (BDOs).

The Director highlighted that discrepancies in scoring often deprive well-performing panchayats of national-level recognition and awards, hence scoring must accurately reflect the actual performance in respective thematic areas.

He stated that district-level implementation of PAI is of critical importance and real-time and authentic data is essential to formulate strategies aligned with the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030.

Regarding the construction of Panchayat Ghars, the Director instructed that the process must be taken up on a mission-mode priority.

He said for panchayats where land has not yet been identified, immediate steps should be taken to finalize locations and in cases of land disputes,

he directed that joint site inspections be conducted in collaboration with the Revenue Department to resolve issues promptly.

The Director stressed that no compromise on construction quality will be tolerated and that Panchayat Ghars should be located at central, accessible locations to serve the entire community effectively.

He further directed that a detailed list of panchayats without Panchayat Ghars be submitted for new approvals.

The Director also underscored the urgent need to activate Panchayat Learning Centres, recommending that these centres be developed as institutionalized training hubs for panchayat representatives and the local population.

He instructed officials to accelerate the geo-tagging of Panchayat Ghars using the "Meri Panchayat" mobile application. All Panchayat Ghars must be geo-tagged and the entire process should be completed within the next two days to facilitate transparency and monitoring.

The spiritual event being organized collabora-

tively by Jammu Municipal Corporation, Jammu Smart City Limited, Department of Tourism, Shri Raghunathji Corridor Development Council and the Department of Information and Public Relations aims to revive and showcase the cultural and spiritual heritage of Jammu.

Dr. Yadav informed that the inaugural Aarti on July 1 will be graced by the Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir, Manoj Sinha as the Chief Guest.

The Commissioner said that special arrangements have been put in place to facilitate the par-

SRINAGAR: The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) on Monday convened a meeting to discuss audit paras pertaining to Finance Department at the Assembly Complex in Srinagar. The meeting was chaired by Committee Chairman Sham Lal Sharma and attended by members Nazir Ahmad Khan. Qaysar Jamshaid Lone, Javid Hassan Baig, Devinder Kumar Manyal, Sajad Shaheen and Muzaffar Iobal Khan.

The Committee undertook a detailed review of audit paras pertaining to the Finance Department, including Paras 3.6 (2001-02), 2.2 and 2.5 (2018-19).

The Chairman emphasized the importance of ensuring efficiency and transparency in public expenditure. He reiterated that the mandate of the Committee is to scrutinize the

lapses, fix accountability and recommend corrective actions. The Committee deliberated on key issues such as computerisation of Toll Post Lakhanpur. management of bank accounts and disbursement of flood relief funds. The meeting reviewed the details submitted by the concerned department and asserted that action taken reports be submitted over various matters in a time bound manner:
